Preliminary negotiations had taken part involving Stan Perkins and Winston Thomas of World Masters and members of the BMAF executive, Bridget Cushen covers this in greater detail on page six of this issue.

Jo Pavey has given the Master's cause a wonderful boost following her European 10,000 metres Gold in Zurich, making her the oldest European Champion in the history of the event. Added to her terrific Bronze in the Glasgow Commonwealth Games, it's just about the best message that we can send out confirming that Athletics is simply not just a young persons sport. Alastair Aitken provides us with one of his tremendous interviews on page ten of this issue.

We have some free track time on the 20th of September during the Track programme of the BMAF Multi-Events Championships, do have a look at the events listed. The events will be seeded on given best times, Male and Female Athletes running against each other.

Events include a Mile and the rarely run 4x800 metres relay, so if we can get together 4 people within the age group specified. British and perhaps even World records could be set. Please email Maurice direct so teams can be arranged.

I understand that Eric Shirley who I report set two British M85 records on page eight, has had the efforts disallowed on a technical issue.

Perhaps we should make some allowances for older competitors rather than apply the same rigid rules following European and World dictates to British Records.

Hi Brian,

I wrote to you last September to ask if you may have known anyone that has won a masters Pentathlon or Decathlon post total hip replacement surgery!

You kindly published that letter I sent and I would just like to thank you for doing so once again as I had several ex athletes and still active athletes. Who have had a hip replacements email me with some really useful tips on post hip surgery rehab.

Sadly none of them were Decathletes and most had to give up the real high impact sports but I believe that thanks to you publishing the letter I have rehabbed perfectly from the advice I have received.

It has only been just over seven months since my operation but I am so confident in my rehabilitation that I have got my first comeback British Masters Pentathlon on Sunday 8th June (Won the M45 Group),

I will of course take things very carefully and perhaps only have one long jump (as that's the event that could cause most concern) but can't wait to get back out there! And it may not happen on my first Pentathlon back (as I'm currently nursing a stress fracture of my right big toe!

Not that that would ever stop me, but I am determined to be the first person to ever win a Pentathlon or Decathlon after THR surgery, and hopefully encourage other athletes facing major surgery that it's doesn't have to be over for their sporting lives.

I'm not sure if you ever go to any of the British Masters comps but if you ever do and I'm there competing please come over and say hello it would be lovely to say high.

Thank you for showing an interest in wishing to be considered for selection for the England Cross Country team to compete in the British and Irish Masters Cross Country International to be held at Wollaton Park, Nottingham on Saturday 22nd November 2014. Teams will be selected by a committee of selectors representing the various regions of England. Selectors will take into consideration performances from the events listed below.

- * BMAF Cross Country Championships
- * BMAF 5k and 10k Road Championships
- BMAF Track 5,000m and 10,000m Championships
- Relevant European and World Masters Championship events
- * Relevant local/regional events (e.g. Cross Country/5k and 10k Road)

When completing the form please include all the relevant races for this year (including local / regional events), and in particular, include your most recent ones and those with your best current times for this year. This will help the selection committee to assess your current form. What you did in the previous years may not be relevant. If selected, you must be prepared to pay your own travel and accommodation expenses, as there is no financial assistance available from EAMA. Your England running vest will be supplied, but you will need all your other running kit (including red shorts if possible) unless otherwise informed. You will be notified about the outcome of your application within a few days of the selection meeting which will be held on 4th October.

It is important that all athletes wishing to be considered for selection are paid up members of their respective Area Masters / Veterans Club or Association. Please ensure you fully complete the official form and return it to your Masters/Veterans Club/Association representative, named below, by the closing date (27/9/14). Late arrivals will not be considered. Please ensure you enclose a reply paid envelope (9 x 6.25 inches) and the CORRECT POSTAGE.

In the meantime, best of luck with your training and racing.

were delighted when the City approached us to host the above Championships. A 5-person Inspection Team looked at the International Stadium where the separate Throws Field has Planning Permission and funding for major expansion, when completed it will be idea for the throwers. Barry also wants to be involved; their 6-lane track with all facilities, including Refreshments, is being upgraded.

5000 rooms in University Halls of Residence will be made available, there are a further 2.000 similar rooms available in the Bay area as well as the numerous hotels, B&B etc.

Accommodation will not be a problem. The bonus however came when the University grabbed the opportunity to apply for a grant to upgrade their track to 6-lanes. They got it, subject to Cardiff winning the Bid!

This opens up the availability of the Indoor arena for training etc. in inclement weather. Two tracks in Cardiff, Barry plus the £50m redevelopment currently taking place in Aberdare; the Station is close to the new track, should entries exceed expectations.

Transport should not be an issue as the Not-for-Profit Community buses based in Swansea, will be drafted in. A 2-carriage shuttle train runs every ten minutes between the City centre and Barry, as a backup. Other Bidding cities in Lyon next August are Barcelona, Gothenburg and Toronto. Start lobbying for the Principality and the Green Valleys.

Annual General Meeting

The 40th AGM was held on Saturday 9 August on the first day of the Track & Field Championships.

The Chairman said he was very pleased to see how well British Athletes did this year, not only in Porto Alegre and Budapest, but domestically. Winston Thomas was re-elected Secretary of WMA and Maurice Doogan is seeking election as Technical Officer for EVAA in Izmir. Vice-Chair, Kevin Dillon a Lawyer, reported on a number of approaches for advice from fellow Officers and direct from our members, adding that he is always happy to help.

The Hon. Secretary eluded to the good working relations with other interested Bodies and the encouraging increase in the young age categories. The retirement of Chris Jager who had built and maintained our original web site, the new web site has been taken on by another equally professional IT man, VAC member Peter Kennedy. We welcome Peter and thank Chris for his dedicated work. It was a vintage year for media exposure as the BMAF is included in the BBC's "Get Inspired" series; there was also an interview on Breakfast TV and a brief Documentary. During the Commonwealth Games an exhibition of Alex Rotas' photos featuring some of our members was displayed at strategic points in Glasgow. Treasurer, Danny Herman, gave a comprehensive breakdown of the figures with Affiliation fees up but Sales Commission suffered a large drop. Net Championships losses were down from £5,340 last year to record a small

profit of £198. Having to write-off the On-Line Entry System however resulted in a loss for the year of over £6k.

Cross-Country Secretary, Mel James, reported on an increase in entries in both the Championships and the Cross-Country Relays, the outstanding performances in all age categories and the continued success of the International Cross-County.

There was applause also for the absent Road Running Secretary, Walter Hill, as details were outlined the various road races, increased entries, the 2015 calendar and the introduction of Masters Trail Running.

Track & Field man Maurice Doogan reported that apart from the Indoor, overall entries were down. He attributed this to the economic recession; athletes peaking and an increase in entry fees etc. At International level, we were ahead of the USA in Budapest. There was a Vote of Confidence from the floor for Maurice's work.

However the most passionate address was from lan Richards on the current state and future prospect of Race Walking. Paying tribute to the ongoing help offered by two former Secretaries, Eric Horwill and John Hall, it left him free to concentrate on Research, Policy and other issues. He noted that there are only two entries here in the Under 50 categories and warned that unless some action is taken, this once popular discipline of the sport will not exist within a decade. It is the unintended results of an IAAF "Bent Knee" Rule followed rigidly by the Masters. Winston Thomas reported that WMA are currently discussing this problem.

Masters Athletics costs have returned to black, but three issues per year will remain for the moment. Questions were asked if too much space was devoted to non-stadia competition.

Peter Kennedy was on hand to answer any questions on the new web site, putting the magazine on-line is possible but the majority of our members still prefer a hard copy as they keep them. This is to be reviewed.

Peter Duhig reported on dealing with the overseas entries. Winston Thomas reported that the Early Entry Discount Fee for Lyon has already attracted 1,000 entries.

All outgoing Officers were re-elected for another year. Long serving Hon. Treasurer Danny Herman was unanimously elected a Life Vice President. He admitted that he harboured a secret! As a 7-year old in Cheshire he won his first sprint race and received a sixpenny Savings Stamp as a reward. He should of course have been banned from all Amateur athletics for life!

World Masters Athletics gold medallist murdered.

April Jace, the lead-off runner in the USA's W35 gold medal winning 4 x 100m squad at the World Masters in Sacramento in 2011, was shot dead in her home in Los Angles in front of her two young children in May. Her husband, the actor Michael Jace who had apparently filed for bankruptcy, is currently on remand.

IN DEFENCE OF MASTERS ROBIN SYKES



ecent statistics would indicate that participation in Masters' Sport is on the increase.

This is encouraging news not only for the Federation itself and its participants but also, indirectly, for many GPs across the country who will be largely quite unaware of such figures.

Not everyone, however, is enamoured with this situation. There are quite a number of officials and coaches who are openly against any form of Masters' participation. They simply state their opposition and leave it like that. That's fine, none of us needs nor seeks an explanation.

There is nevertheless, a small hard core who seem to have reached a level of almost paranoia in their opposition.

The only acceptable opposition against Masters Competition would be if it detracted officials, in whatever capacity, away from mainstream Athletics, particularly regarding young competitors.

Between Regional / National Championships, the odd League or Graded meeting the average Master will be lucky to compete 3-4 times a YEAR! Hardly detracting officials away from requisite priorities.

Maybe I'm not alone or getting slightly paranoiac myself but I feel I've been particularly unlucky with these characters. On sighting at any competition they seem to hone in like Radar. Never enquiring about one's current health, present abode or, perhaps, any encounter of contemporaries from the dim and distant past. It's more of a wide eyed. Redfaced, blood pressure off the clock aggressive approach.

- Q "What the hell are you doing here? At YOUR age!"
- A "Competing"
- Q "Will you NEVER learn?"
- A "Learn what?"
- Q "Just what are you trying to prove?"
- A "Nothing"
- Q "Can you never leave your past in the past?"
- A "Yes, but this is the present"
- Q Do you realise the risk of serious injury at your age.
- A "Half the British team are currently crocked"
- Q "Admit it, you are just after an easy medal"
- A "No medal is easy"

It does not take a genius to work out that, of course, one has greater opportunity of success in Masters' Athletics.

A mainstream Athlete will have a career of say seven years. A Master could have 50. Don't they deserve a medal after that time! The sad fact has also to be accepted that when one reaches the 'upper-age group echelons' it is often a case of no longer outperforming the opposition but simply OUTLIVING them!

No matter what age STANDARDS still have to be met, often at quite stringent levels. Many a Master has been denied a Medal by 5 centimetres in the Long Jump and 2 seconds in the 5000 metres.

A lot of these 'agitated againsters' seem to overlook this. The absurd level to which some will drop was, brought home to me with a real 'classic' when I was unbelievably confronted with lack of dignity or self-respect for running against 'a bunch of old men' in a 60 metres Indoor Championships some years ago (I just couldn't be bothered Pointing out that I was actually the OLDEST competitor in the race! Still. I suppose I should have been flattered that he thought they LOOKED so much older!) Don't know what it is about these guys must be their AGE.

To-day I get the impression (admittedly a personal one) that a lot of the FUN has gone out of the sport particularly at younger level (and this is not the rose-tinted glasses of the halcyon days of yore) On the very, very rare occasions I see a Club or a group of youngsters with their Coaches they all seem to be walking about with toothache. Sport is a serious business, of course, but I don't remember any rules Preventing laughing. Masters' events, for me, always seem to have a pleasant ATMOSPHERE where Athletes AND Officials generally inter-relate congenially on and off the track.

Finally--to the last stride. Irrespective of anyone's views Master athletes train and participate for one reason ...they ENJOY it!

Isn't that the basic essential ingredient for ANY sport?

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT ARTHUR KIMBER MASTERS ATHLETICS AUGUST 2014

he record breaking spree in the winter that I mentioned in my last report continued in the last key fixture. To end the indoor season a large British team of over 300 athletes travelled to the World Indoor Championships in Budapest and were very successful, placing second in the medals table. They set four world records, two European and sixteen British. The world records breakers were Caroline Powell, W55, with a 64.76 400m, Ian Richards, 3000m. Walk in 14:23.84, Stephen Whyte, M50, weight, 22.10, and Irie Hill, W45, pole vault, 3.55. The European records fell to M60 Alasdair Ross, 25.24 for 200m. and M55 John Mayor, Pentathlon, 4066. British records went to James Thie, Carole Filer, Ian Richards, Richard Beardsall, Sue Yeomans, Teresa Eades, Stuart Thurgood, Andrea Jenkins, Claire Cameron, Carole Derrien, Gavin Fordham, Eric Horwill and eighty five year old James Farrar.

The main early summer track and field fixture was the EAMA Inter Area Challenge at Solihull in July. Fierce competition between Midland Masters and Southern Counties resulted in a narrow victory for Southern Counties in the women's match and a somewhat larger margin for a Midland Masters win in the men's match to give Midland Masters the overall title. Two British records were set, by Moira West with a 400m. run of 73.48 and M50 Neil Tunstall in the 100m. hurdles, 14.39, while the SCVAC team of Moira West, Helen Godsell, Linda Ahmet and Viv Bonner broke the British W60 4x100m. record. I am very grateful to England Athletics for their continued financial support for both the indoor and outdoor Inter Area match.

A group from Manchester Metropolitan University is aiming to carry out a research project on athletes over 60. They came to the Inter Area match and the BMAF track and field championships and recruited well, but are still looking for more athletes to take part. RECORDS galore! Editor writes.

hat a great start to the outdoor season, and we have yet to have our main Domestic and the European Championships in Turkey.

I cannot mention everyone who has achieved individual records, but I will mention those who have exceeded European and World bests.

However, prior to that I must mention Eric Shirley, twice an Olympian in Melbourne and Rome, phoned to say he had set British Records for the M85 400 and 800 metres.

It was very nice to chat to one of the two International Athletes still competing so many years from their early days.

Incidentally this is the 67th anniversary year of his first A.A.A Steeplechase title.

The other being Rosemary Chrimes, and it was truly wonderful to see her present the Commonwealth Discus medal to Australian Dani Samuels. She was also featured as one of the previous winners in the Glasgow Programme.

Caroline Powell popped up in a Cheltenham Open Meeting to produce an early July World 400 metre record of 64.64. She told me she always gets faster as she moves up the age group so watch out all W60 sprinters.

Tony Whiteman now 42 years of age, had a glittering International Record winning European Indoor Silver in 1996, a Kuala Lumpur Bronze in the 1998 Commonwealth Games and a fourth finish in Manchester in 2002. Tony ran his fastest 800 metres since 2003, in the BMC Grand Prix at the Trafford track in July, producing the amazing time of 1:48.05 for a World masters Record.

Clare Elms has to be one of the busiest Athletes in the Britain having run in over 60 races this year. She has set two World Records 4:36.79 for 1500 metres at Eton and a 4:58.7 Mile at Dulwich. She also set a European 800 metres Record of 2:18.95 at Birmingham all in a crowded six week period in June / July.

Jo Pavey how she battled to win Commonwealth Bronze in Glasgow! Set a World 5000 metre Record in the Rome Grand Prix with a time of 15:04.87. We then saw her win the European Senior 10,000 metres in Zurich.

Irie Hill the 2002 Commonwealth Games Bronze Medallist has broken the W45 Pole Vault Record twice this year. The first time being at Thum in Switzerland where she cleared 3.60, then at Linz in Austria when 3.61 was achieved. (I love the high tech Swiss display board).



JO PAVEY Talks to Alastair Aitken

he event for the second year was organised by 'Classy' middle distance Master Runner, Ben Pochee of Highgate Harriers.

The event held on May the 10th at Parliament Hill Fields track, despite the rain and the wind was a successful and lively meeting. The event was taken on this year by British Athletics and the lead from Endurance, Martin Rush, was there to see the event which included the European Trials.

I think the most impressive result of the night was when mother of two Jo Pavey ran away from an international field of athletes in the closing stages of the race.

JOANNE PAVEY is 40 and her time of 32:11.04 was an Over 40 British Record. Previous best was by JOYCE SMITH who ran 34:26.4 on the 27th of February 1980.

The First Six at parliament Hill on the evening of the 10th of May were:-1 Jo Pavey (Exeter Harriers) 32:11.04; 2 Sophie Duarte (CA BALMA, France) 32:36.32; 3 Beth Potter (Shaftesbury Barnet) 32:36.3; 4 Fionnuala Britton (Eire) 32:45.69; 5 Iwona Lewandowska (Marshall Milton Keynes AC and Poland) 33:08.95; 6 Rhona Auckland (Banchory-Stonehaven AC) 33:09.58 (18 ran)

JOANNE PAVEY (2nd on the All Time British Ranking list with 30:53.50) It has been very special coming back to athletics for her.

Q: Having baby Emily must have meant a lot to her? A:" Definitely!

I am really pleased and my husband Gavin is so supportive, as we run together and he looks after the children (Jacob and Emily) when I am training. We spend more family time together, rather than other pressures like working in an office all day.

My little one is only 8 months now. I was still actually breast feeding till five weeks ago.'



Q: What did the race at Parliament Hill mean for her?
A: "I feel absolutely fortunate to be able to have two little children and be 40 and still out there running on the track. I am really thrilled about it. I am quite surprised really that I have been able to get on the track so soon after."

Q: At Parliament Hill Fields you had to make a definite burst to get away from the girl who won the last European cross country Championship Sophie Duarte and the previous European cross country winner for two years Fionnuala Britton was also in the race. Durate is young but you had the experience, particularly as Jo had been an Olympian four times?

A: "I did not know really how to play the race because, I did not know what toll the wind would take on it.

I had in my mind what the qualifying time was (33.00) and I did not want to take any risks not getting the time. So, I had lap times memorised and I very much wanted to stick as closely to those lap times as I could. I was not really sure till I started running it would be possible with the conditions. The crowd support was just so awesome and it helped me. That's motivation!"

Q: Of all the races she had done in her life, Four Olympics. The first back in 2000. What meant most to her of all those races?

A:"I suppose Olympic-wise my highest Olympic position was 5th in Athens (Over 5000m in 14:57.87).' I suppose, in a

way, the good race was when I finished 4th in Osaka (10,000 metres in the World Championships in 32:03.31 just behind Kara Goucher of USA- 32:2.05). It was frustrating as well as I failed by one second or less to get a medal. Then I think getting the European Silver" (now Gold)

Q: She was second in the Commonwealth in 2006 but the European Silver must have been special?

A: (European 10,000 in Helsinki 2012 1 Dulce Felix (Portugal) 31:44.75; 2 Jo Pavey (GBR) 31:49.03; 3rd Olga Skrypak (UKR) 31:51.32)- 'I think, actually funnily enough, one of my favourite races was my 5k PB in Brussels, just because I think that is my best PB of all the distances I have done and that meant a lot to me to get under 14:40 (Ivo van Damme Memorial IAAF Golden League 14:39.96 25th of August 2006). That felt really special because I think of all the races I have done that was the best time I have ever run"

Q: That ranked you second 'All Time' UK Rankings. She was an English Schools under 15 Champion, and has suffered quite a lot of injuries since then but gone on to overcome them all. She has even run 2:28.24 for a Marathon in London 2011. So I realised she did love running so what were her comments about starting in the sport?

A: "I suppose I started running more seriously when I was 14 and I was fortunate enough to win the English Schools. When I was 14 and ran 4:27 for 1500, and I supposed that showed that maybe I could be a runner. I did not have the confidence in a way because I knew what the seniors were doing and I was way off those times. "So you are young and you will get stronger' people said, but I just could not imagine being able to run close to 4 minutes. "How on earth can I do that and I went away and got injured and things like that" My husband and I went backpacking around the World. I had worked for a physiotherapist before that, while we were away we trained in the most inspiring locations and got really fit and when I came back, I made the World Championships in Athens (1997) and that was really the start of my senior career".

Q: Despite the pleasure you get from Athletics. Having a break recently has probably helped?

A: "I think so. It gives you that motivation. It makes you realise how much you love it". "I find it quite motivating to start from Scratch, quite interesting to go down the track and sprint as hard as you can do, which is the pace for a lap in order to be able to do 25 laps like that". "Then each week you work away at it, (lap by lap) getting quicker and quicker. "It is exciting to see the escalation of progress. You have good sessions and bad sessions. To start from scratch towards being an athlete again was very motivating."

Q: You are a heroine to some athletes, who were your idols?

A: "Obviously people like Coe, Cram and I remember watching those athletes when I was young also people like Liz McColgan, so gutsy to win the World Championships also Kelly Holmes, as she was so supportive to me when I was in the team.

She helped me through those years of my career and I appreciate that a lot."

Since this interview: Jo has run a World Over 40 Record of 15:04.87 5000m at the Rome Grand Prix in June, and of course a marvellous European Gold in Zurich to add to Commonwealth Bronze in Glasgow.

OBITUARIES

GERRY NORTH

May the 2nd 1936 /1st of April-2014 By Alastair Aitken

Gerry North was a "Great' cross-country runner who ran for England many times.

I met him and interviewed him twice at his home and I always found that he really was a modest and likable person, who was not always given the credit for being a very good coach in his later years, with an outstanding knowledge of the sport.

One must remember also that he was not only the junior 'National' winner in 1957 and the senior 'National' Champion of 1962 but also the 'National and Southern over 50 Veterans cross country Champion, when he was actually 50 and, trained harder than he did in his 40's.

In 1965 he won the Surrey 6 mile Championships in record time of 28:48.2 and went on that year to win the Southern 6 miles at the white City in 28:40.04. He was also was very useful on the road particularly in the road relays.

Back In 1967 he won the Southern (I remember that as I ran that race for Highgate Harriers at Parliament Hill Fields). His brother Geoff was a fine track runner (13:44 for 5000m) but although Gerry did not feel he excelled on the track but more on the country. It should be remembered Gerry won the World Games 10,000 in Helsinki in 29:51.1 back in 1963.

His real ability came when running on cross-country courses and he very nearly won the International Cross Country one year. He had fallen over early on **but** was still in the winning England team, as he was several times.

He was 3rd in the National of 1961 behind Basil Heeley and Bruce Tulloch but the following year he turned the tables on Tulloch when he won in the sprint finish, with runners like Mel Batty and Ron Hill behind him too.

Also it is worth considering his victory that year, in the light of the fact that Bruce Tulloh, went on to become European 5000m Champion in Belgrade in 1962!

Gerry said about the National " It was a race on my home ground in Blackpool' and continued ' I thought I had got to win it. It was a race I completely dominated and I had that feeling I was going to win. When anyone tried to overtake me I put in a little burst'

'I had a challenge from John Anderson (3rd). Bruce Tulloh worked his way through. I think he caught the group at six or seven miles. I was still doing all the forcing of the pace until 600 yards to go. Tulloh went past me and he went hell for leather.

'He thought he had got it. I kept a yard behind him then, as I came down the finish then I left him for dead. I was fresh as a daisy and he was on his knees having run himself into the ground. He had just come back from New Zealand and done a four-minute mile. He must have thought, 'I can outsprint Gerry no problem' It was not the speed at the finish- it was the strength I had"

Gerry North, who not only had a brother who ran but a couple of sons who did. One of those was a well-known junior Andy North but Gerry himself, actually started out at school as a footballer not just a runner. He gradually decided to stick with athletics. In fact he played in the Blackpool FC Youth club team with Jimmy Armfield who went on to play for England.


The three athletic clubs Gerry had been associated with were Blackpool & Fylde, Belgrave Harriers and Portsmouth AC. He was President of Belgrave Harriers in 2005 and was an England Road team Manager around that time too.

He had something special to say about his Father "He was very sporting. He did everything for us and went with us to the races. He encouraged Geoff and me right from the start"

One must never forget that special time when Gerry turned 50 he then won the 'Over 50' Southern Veterans and National Veterans cross country Championship. The secret was he never did win a National Veteran title in his 40's because he never took it very seriously and was only on 30 miles a week but before the two Veterans victories he did 50 miles a week to make sure of winning, which he was easily able to do with his talent!

You can talk to anyone who knew Gerry and many 'Great' runners and ordinary club runners would not have a bad word said against him and if you can say that about someone like Gerry then, his days were well spent.


John was involved for many years with MMAC and helped set up the course for the National Masters Open Road Relays held every year at Sutton Park.

April 13 LONDON MARATHON

y far and away the best veteran performance in the race was that of Emma Stepto but she was running in the Elite women's section in an effort to get a Commonwealth Games place in the England team. However a return of 2h:36:05 was just outside the required mark. Had the Cornwall runner been in the mass start it is likely that she would have improved her pb. from its current. 2h:35:02, just two seconds shy of the required time. Stepto had to run the second half of the race by herself.

England Cross-Country International Chris Greenwood pulled back a half-way deficit of nearly three minutes to win in the men's vests' title in 2:27:59. This was after Gareth Lowe ran 71:21 for the half-marathon but Greenwood, back in fifth after 13 miles, ran a negative split to win by just 35 seconds. "I paced myself really well so I feel OK as it all went perfectly, I tried to stay calm and hit my splits. Everyone said 20 miles is half-way but I lasted until 25 and then my last mile was my fastest, so I was fine," said Greenwood.

Ben Reynolds took the M50 race from Nigel Rackham by 100 seconds in 2h:33:53, the Thames runner also heading all of the M45's. The four time National Vets cross-country champion was more than two minutes clear at 13.1 miles, but lost a bit in the second half as Rackham ran splits of 77:47 and 77:46. "I have to be happy with that as I wasn't at all confident about going sub-2h: 35 so I'm pleased to squeeze under 2h:34. As usual I slowed 15 seconds per mile in the last six miles but it felt as if I was finishing fast but the times show I wasn't." His splits were 75:29 and 77.24.

Nearly thirty years ago Reynolds said he ran 2h: 31:42 for 333rd. This year he was 87th quickest overall, the figures telling their own sad story.

David Butler dominated the M60 age group, winning by 18 minutes in 2h: 48:46. He said: "My race went very well. My twin targets were to achieve a pb. Time of 2h: 48 and win the age group. I achieved both so I am very happy. I started slightly too fast but eased back slightly to reach half way as planned and loved the run down through the crowds and narrower roads near in Docklands. I then worked hard to keep the pace going back to Tower Bridge. The next two miles were very hard but I found a second wind to complete the last 2km strongly to achieve my target time."

Treena Johnson not only ran nine minutes quicker this year but also moved up from second in 2013 to take the W50 medal, in 2h:57:49. The Dewsbury runner was 86:27 at the half-distance and going away but despite losing ground in the latter stages held on to win by 51 seconds.

Jane Davies took the W65 section in 3h:22:12 and was on

Jane Davies took the W65 section in 3h:22:12 and was on schedule to break Angela Copson's British best time of 2:19:05 at 13.1M (98:00) but lost time in the second half.

Davies said: "I am totally pleased but got to mile 16 in two hours and thought I'm not going to be able to carry on at this pace, so I slackened off a bit."

Davies beat all of the W60s, where Caroline Horder won by nearly four minutes in 3h:36:06.

Among the older men, Martin Ford was favourite but saw himself only fourth in the provisional results. However, it looks like the first two were not correct which left Robin Scott ahead of the Cheltenham runner, just four weeks after running ten minutes slower in Barcelona

or the second year in a row, nine different clubs took the team awards and only M45 winners Leicester Coritanian retained their title, to make it four wins in a row.

M35 race

Mark Johnson's 15:09 for Mansfield, led on the opening leg, as the number of stages for this youngest age group was reduced from eight to six. It did see concerns about yet another change raised by clubs and, although the entry was higher, the number of finishing teams was still relatively low.

Billy McCartney took Salford to the front on stage two but Altrincham went ahead on the third before Matt Barnes put the matter beyond doubt with the day's fastest lap of 14:41 on leg four. "I've always loved doing the six-stage here and we have run together in the seniors a lot," said Barnes of his team mates.

Les Croupiers were a distant second and included M60 Martin Rees (16:15) in their youngest squad. It was left to Dave Norman, to anchor Altrincham with a 15:29 split.



In a race reduced to just four stages (why do they keeping mucking about with the format?) Leicester won for the fourth year in a row and had Gordon Lee again fastest overall, at 15:24. "It's good for our club, but it's only four legs and a bit of a downer being just four," said Lee.

Leicester were only fifth, after the first leg, as Simon Cotton trailed leader Thame's Ian Harkness . Before moving up, thanks to Chris Southam.

Jon James posted the second best M45 time of 15:38 on stage two, before Paul Simons put Salford ahead.

Gerry O'Neill had no answer however, as Gordon Lee flew past for a 38 second winning margin.

M55 race

Woodford Green took victory by more than a minute with an evenly balanced team in yet another category where the number of runners was reduced, to just three. "We looked at last year's result and they were averaging 19 minutes so we thought; 'you have to come and do it," said David Cox of his team's win.

On the first stage, Jeremy Hogan had given Bristol an early lead with a 16:51 clocking that bettered Cox's 17:00 for the quickest M55 time of the race. "I didn't expect it. It's my first time inside 17 minutes since I turned 50," said Hogan.

M65/M75 race



The older men's races saw Rotherham Harriers dominating the M65s once they hit the front on the second leg through Bob Tintinger's 18:46. Oxford City's Roy Treadwell's 19:48 led at the end of the opening stage, but Rotherham took victory by nearly two minutes.

Two over-75 teams finished as Exmouth won from Bingley, who's Fred Gibbs was fastest. However the British M75 ten mile record holder was sent away at the start of his leg too early, leading to confusion with his time. It was eventually resolved ten days later (at 21:12) and Gibbs said: "I enjoyed it, another great day but we will be back next year to challenge Exmouth."

Women W35 race

Claire Martin ran 17:09 last year and, with Llsa Palmer, exactly matched the time, but the team honours went to

Stroud and District. It was Palmer who broke away early up the opening hill to post the time with a big first stage 'win' for Heanor. "I led from the start and just tried to go as there wasn't anybody with me," said Palmer. Salford's Hayley Kuter ran 17:39, to narrowly lead at the end of the penultimate lap but they faded badly at the end. Stroud tried hard through the former Heidi Moulder (now North) but the former Junior National Cross-Country and Inter-Counties champion, on her return to the sport, after five years out, could only muster an 18:20 time and they were 43 seconds off of the lead.

Gwen Kinsey, a former Modern Pentathlon international, who won a Team Gold medal in the World Championships in 1999. Did the business for Stroud and her 18:07 was more than enough, at 41 seconds over the game Heanor. She said: "It's our first entry into the Masters," while their Joanne Fifield added: "injuries have prevented us having a full squad in the relays.

Further back Martin, from a lowly eighth, delivered Telford bronze medals with that 17:09. Charnwood's Tara Krzywicki, who was returning to the sport after a break, was one of her victims' *en-route*.

Martin said: "I could see Tara (Krzywicki) on the line and I've been struggling since London but I gave it everything."

W45 race

Denby Dale Travellers were yet another new name on a trophy as Bristol and Dulwich Runners followed. Holders Winchester and Arena failed to put in an appearance, despite being entered.

Sarah Everitt, for Bristol, ran 18:30, ahead of Ola Balme's Dulwich at the end of the opening stage, as Denby Dale's Lesley Leggett was nearly a minute off of the lead.

Clare Elms then not only led the W45s, but also the W35 group at the end of the second stage. Her race fastest 17:47 opened a big lead, but they dropped to third as Nichola McNally for Denby and Clare Jolliffe for Bristol moved up to take gold and silver. Elms said: "I passed everyone up the first hill."

Winners Denby were overjoyed at their success and second leg runner Bridget Coomber said: "it's our first proper team win." McNally added: "that felt like hard work."

W55/W65 race

Jo Thompson, with the fastest lap of the race, gave Team Bath a lead on the first stage and they never looked back. Thompson, who holds the W45 record at16:51, ran 18:57 and said: "I went really well but I've had a year when I haven't been doing a lot but I'm good at hills and won the Glastonbury Tor race, so I thought I'd try again." Louise Jeffries and Karen Butler rounded things off for Bath as Winchester took second.

Hastings' Sylvia Huggett was quickest of the W65s with 23:55, as only one team finished again.



ell I thought the "Friendly Games" started on the 23rd of July, however, the spirit in this year's Inter Area Challenge scored very highly on the index of enjoyment if such a factor exists for Athletic meetings.

Everything about the Meeting scored "A" plus factors. With good, warm and dry conditions. A track and its facilities in reasonable condition. The competitive nature of the events, plus the good natured Athletes and Officials, so let me tell you what happened.



Firstly four British Records, the day's first going to Neil Tunstall who shaved 1/100th of a second from his own Record with 14.39 in the day's second event, the 100 metres Hurdles.

Moira West set the second, finishing second to the younger Caroline Marler. Her time of 73.48 seconds for the W65 400 metres being almost a second faster than Angela Copson's record set in the 2012 European Veterans Championships.

Kevin Murch has been throwing Javelin for an awfully long time, and set a British best of 54.47 improving on the record he set in June.

Julie Briscoe from Northern Vets was a runaway victor in the Women's 300 metres winning by almost 36 seconds from Eastern Counties Ellen Leggate. Julie's track appearances being somewhat of a rarity as most of her running is done on

tarmac. Indeed she finished third British Female in the London Marathon in 2h 39.43 just outside the 2h38:00 required for European Selection.

It's not often we see an Olympian turning out in a domestic Masters meeting.

However, that unusual event occurred in the EAMA Challenge at Solihull.

The Athlete in question is Sue Richardson who finished second in the Women's 50 Triple Jump, who resumed her athletic career after a 24 year break.

This is the outdoor championships, so there should never, really, be any suggestion of holding any events indoors. The indoor champs were at Lee Valley in March.





M45 400m winner Michael Gardiner with 51.01, showed up the runners in the M35 and M40 groups as they were all slower.







She had a narrow victory over Helen Godsell in the 100m, in 14.09 and a more comfortable 65.10 400m on Saturday before returning for the 200m and, a rare, 800m on Sunday. Her 28.82 EUROPEAN RECORD 200m win was followed by 2:43.68 to round off a successful weekend.



Darren Scott produced an M45 sprint double and said: "my 11.35 was a legal season's best but I'm more of a 200m man." After his 22.66 200m he said that he now plans an attack on some indoor records.

The first day saw three British records in the steeplechase. Jane Pidgeon improved her own W50 2000m mark to 8:09:22, while Gwyneth Heuter set a new W55 standard at 8:56.88. 75 year old Eric Hughes also got into the act with 12:05.09 in the Men's event.

Kevin Murch set a new M55 Javelin record of 52.09m (54.47 at Solihull in the Inter Area). Two more British age group records came from Rosemary Chrimes in the W80 long jump and javelin at 2.34m and 12.40m, both previous marks being held by Mary Wixey.



Chrimes also added four more titles in events at which she already holds the British best, including her specialty discus at 20.79m.

W65 Angie Copson regained her age group 5km road race best earlier in the week and here she narrowly took the 1500m, from Ros Tabor, on the opening day, in 5:40.45. It was all easier in the 5000m on Sunday in 20:19.48. Tabor won the W65 800m in 2:54.85 but said; "I wanted a time but it was so windy."

Fellow Dulwich Runner Clare Elms won the W50 1500m on Saturday, in 4:45.92, but did complain of some breathing problems.

Elsewhere in the throws, Neil Griffin took four M65 titles, including 45.71m in his specialty discus, "I am sure I can get over 50m with this," said the Windsor man after his other wins in weight, shot and hammer.

Carole Filer equalled her own W55 long jump record with 4.72m, as she just headed Averill McClelland, who took both sprints in warm up for the European Vets in Izmir. In the same group, Jane Horder took both hurdles events.


The men's distance races saw a hat-trick of M70 wins for Martin Ford over Peter Giles, A 5:26.91 1500m was followed by 5000m on the second day, with 19:24.59, but he said: "it was hard today as the wind was everywhere." Ford then continued his unbeaten M70 streak with a 2:44.63 800m.

There was a British record in the W75 400 and 800m when Kathleen Stewart added to her own W70 mark with an 800 metre time of 3:33.47, which betters the existing hand timed 3:33.4. "I was 75 on the 7th and did the 400m yesterday also a new British mark of 1:26.82 but I was so stressed as we got stuck in holiday traffic," said Stewart.

He now goes to Izmir as one of only a few Brits in the long distance events. "I only started running four years ago and am still improving," he added.

Swiss national Charles Eugster, competed in the M95 sprints, running 25.76 and 58.03.



M65 Ian Richards took the 3000m walk distance in 14:17.84 for the weekends only World Record and M75 Arthur Thomson did 17:35.28, while Cath Duhig won the W55 event in 18:46.39. Quickest over 3000m was M50 winner Francisco Reiss with 13:57.59. All except Richards returned on the second day to win the 5000m walk event, with Reis again being fastest overall. Thomson summed up a lot about veteran athletics when he said: "I'm a bit slower every year."

Alan Mellett ran a new British Record of 33.25 in the M80 100 metres, and Dalbir Sing-Deol did likewise in the M85 with a time of 47.34.
