

BRIAN OWEN WRITES:

In the last issue I suggested that 108 could be the final paper version of the Magazine, I have produced for the last 12 years.

At the last Executive Meeting of the B.M.A.F. a decision was taken to put this matter to the membership at the Annual General meeting at Alexander Stadium.

To gauge some idea of the thoughts of our members Peter Kennedy, has produced a questionnaire asking for your views on this matter, this is now on the BMAF website.

Basically the questions are do our members want a paper copy of Masters Athletics?

Would they feel that communication could be handled by what is a totally professional Web Site? If the majority of members wished to retain the paper version would they be prepared to meet the regularly rising cost of publication?

As I have already mentioned my involvement has now entered its twelfth year, and I would like to think the publication has reached a very good standard. However, I feel that my abilities to maintain this level are somewhat challenged, so I am sorry to announce my retirement from this project.

Should the membership wish to continue with a paper version, a new Editor would need to be appointed?

Following negotiations with London and Cardiff, it appears that there will be no bid from a British City in near future.

The fundamental problem being that the Cities are not able to cover any loss made from the hosting of Championships, and the B.M.A.F is not in a position to underwrite any losses.

We appear to have a problem in this Country that the heavy cuts imposed by Central Government, have caused Local Government to adjust the spending it makes to sport. This has meant that Stadiums have been forced to close or have been pushed into the private sector, who need to profit from their operation.

Again the money made available to Sport has been aimed at the podium level Athlete, leaving little to grass root level.


Another passing is Jim Hogan, who has died in Limerick, Ireland. Although this luminous character was never a member, many of our members will remember him.

JIM ALDER M.B.E A GREAT RUNNER AND A GREAT MOTIVATOR by Alastair Aitken



JIM ALDER is not recognised just as, a Commonwealth & European Games Medallist but as a well-loved runner and coach and adviser to many, including Mark Hudspith of Morpeth Harriers, who was third in the Commonwealth

Marathon of 1994 and Neil Black the UKA Performance Director of 2015.

Nicholas Swinburn, a 26 year old Morpeth Harrier, who was third in the Senior National cross country Championships of 2015 remarked, after receiving his medal "I am inspired by Jimmy Alder. He is always about. He adds inspiration and humour" I will add to that by saying, I always found him forthright and honest, when I first spoke to him in the 1960's.

James Noel Carroll said "Jim Alder had a tough start in life. His Mother died of tuberculosis and his Father was killed on the last day of the World War Two so, he was a foster child".

"When he left Glasgow and came down to live at Morpeth in 1949, he was inspired by seeing the Morpeth to Newcastle road race".

Jim comments "I always liked running as a youngster. Until the age of 15 when he preferred football. I loved football but realised I was just a local footballer like hundreds and thousands of others". He continued "I realised if, I had been introduced to regular training at 12 or 13 I would not have walked away from football"

Regarding his early years as a runner "I always liked running and was quite good but I could not make the County team so, I never ran in the English Schools".

"Suddenly at 16/17, I started to get better and won a couple of races. The biggest improvement was between 16/19"

HE THEN HAD AMBITION

"I started to move away and I realised I am going for it".
"I wanted to win the Scottish National (He did that in 1962), the Morpeth to Newcastle the oldest road race in the UK". "I wanted build my home (He was a brick layer) and start my own business". "I had those four ambitions at 18 and achieved the lot but I never dreamt I would win a Gold medal at a 'Big' Games".

It was 1962 that he won the Inter-Counties 20 mile road race in 1h 45:16 (He did run even faster in 1964, a World record race, in 1hr 40min 58.0sec).

Jim Alder represented Scotland in the International (Now World) Cross Country Championships. It was 10 years later in 1972 he was 20th in the International at Cambridge.

In the English National cross country Championship of 1969, at Parliament Hill, won by Mike Tagg, he was 13th but ahead of such respected runners as Allan Rushmer, Ron Hill and Bob Holt and so it goes on.

In 1964 he got injured, just before the Olympics in Tokyo, which appeared to dash his chances of being selected but that did not put off the hardy Northerner.

As it is recorded in 2015 "Peter Mathews & Mel Watman's" International Athletics Annual " World Best for running 2 hours on the track by JIM ALDER covering 37.994km at Walton on Thames on the 17th off October 1964.

"That was my biggest win in my formative years, the World record at Walton on Thames, I ran in Dunlop sand shoes on an ash track, when the World Record for the marathon was 2:13.45. "You work it out" Said Jim and continued "I am not saying I would have won a medal at Tokyo but I was in the best form of my life, World class form at the right time in the wrong place".

MEDAL RACES

British Empire & Commonwealth Games Marathon 11th of August 1966.

The first Three runners , first James Alder (Scotland) 2:22:07.0; 2 William Adcocks (England) 2:22:13.0; 3 Mike Ryan (New Zealand) 2:27:59.0; Jim led for the last 8 miles, before entering the Stadium, then was misdirected so, he had to make up 50 yards, as Bill Adcocks had gone the correct way and had taken the lead. Jim caught Adcocks and overtook him just before the finish. He also obtained a bronze medal previously, on the 6th of August in the 6 miles track Championships 1. Naftali Temu (Kenya) 27:14.6 (Commonwealth Record); 2 Ron Clarke (Australia) 27:39.4; 3 Jim Alder (Scotland) 28:15.4 and they were followed in by Ron Hill, Dave Ellis and Fergus Murray.

European Games Marathon, in the hot weather, finishing in the historic old Olympic Stadium, on the 21st of September 1969

1 Ron Hill (GB) 2:16:47.8; 2 Gaston Roelants (Belgium) 2:17.22.2; 3 Jim Alder (GB) 2:19.05.8; 4 Jurgen Busch (East Germany) 2:19.34.4; 5 Ismail Akcay (Turkey) 2:22.16.8; 6 Denes Simon (Hungary) 2:22.58.8.

In the race "I went from 9th to 2nd and took Ronnie at 17 to 18 miles. I thought I am going to win this for my daughter. I had a cable from Kathleen in the camp that she was just born, a fortnight early and it was a breech birth".

Then, with 3 miles to go Ronnie (Hill) came past me like a train. He caught Roelants in the final mile. I was holding off Jurgen Busch for 3rd spot!"

Edinburgh Commonwealth Games marathon 23rd of July 1970.

First six:- 1 Ron Hill (England) 2:09.28; 2 Jim Alder (Scotland) 2:12.04; 3 Don Faircloth (England) 2:12.09; 4 Jack Foster (New Zealand) 2:14.46; 5 John Stephen (Tanzania) 2:15.05; 6 Bill Adcocks (England) 2:15.10 Some strong words were said before the race, according to Jim, by the Australian, Derek Clayton, who had broken the World record twice (But dropped out in the race in Edinburgh). He said "Alder is only good when the conditions are bad. The British runners are no good, as they can't handle a fast pace. However, my 10k time was half a minute faster than Clayton's."

At 5 miles the times were Drayton 23:31; Clayton 23:31; Ndoo 23:31; Hill 23.31 then Harnek Sigh of India 23:57 Stephen 24:07; Alder 24:09; Adcocks 24:09; Faircloth 24:10 and Foster 24.10. "

"I looked at Billy and said 'God what have they done". At 8 miles Hill broke Clayton and Jerome Drayton of Canada At 10 miles the first 8 were Hill 47:45; Drayton 47:50; Ndoo 47:55; Alder 48:40; Adcocks 48:40, Stephen 48:40; Faircloth 48:45 and Clayton 48:49,.

The first four at **15 miles** were Hill 1:12:18, Drayton 1:13:17; Alder and Stephen on 1:13.27. At **20 Miles** it was Hill 1:37:32 and Alder 1:38.51. Then at **25 miles** it was Hill 2:03:10; Alder 2:05:10 and Faircloth 2:05:30.

JIM COMES IN WITH SOME PHILOSOPHY

"When I was running 120 miles a week I could regularly run a 2 minute half mile when I wanted. UK's distance runners now are not rounded enough. They should do 800's and 1500's. Perhaps we over trained a little bit but now they under train." About running and training Jim said "I would train 4 miles in the morning 8 miles in the afternoon and then do a race at 3.30. A lot of the time it was a means to an end. The only races I eased off for were the 'Big Ones' I only failed at one big day and that was in Mexico 1968.'

"If I was doing 120/140 miles a week I would do a 2 minutes 800 after running 13 miles. I knew I had a little speed but not a lot of sped".

Jim Alder likes to keep fit, even now at 75. and is always very interested in how his County Northumberland & Durham does. He was particularly pleased this year (2015) when, they won the Senior Men's Inter-Counties cross country Championships team title. That was at Crofton Park, Birmingham (2015).

Jim achieved so many fine performances in his young days, when he was in his prime **but** still went on to run competitively in his **40's**. It was then he came up against a Master who blossomed out as a World Veteran Champion by the name of 'Taff' **Davies** from Wales, who had not previously been in the top flight of internationals but was a true fighter between the age of 40 and 51, winning so many races

I remember the National Veterans 40-49 cross country race at Arrow Park on the 15th of March, 1981 and, I wrote about that in *Athletics Weekly*. In the middle of my report it read "Alder took the initiative at four miles, opening up a good 15 metre lead on Davies. Alder glanced back, and slowly but surely Davies drew him back. Davies spurted ahead with 1½ miles to go". The 40 to 49 results were 1st Taff Davies (Aldershot & Farnham AC) 32:47; 2nd Jim Alder (Morpeth AC) 33:13 and they were followed by Leo Carrol, ExSouthgate international who ran for Vale of Aylesbury, Ron Gomez, and Fred Pendlebury a previous winner of the event.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT -ARTHUR KIMBER

2015 so far has been a very busy year for indoor track and field athletes, with four meetings on successive weekends in February and March. In the South of England Championships, which included the BMAF Pentathlon, Eastern Veterans and VAC Championships, 49 year old Sally Reed-Cayton won the W45 400m. In a very fast 61.65, and her target for April when she turns 50 must be Caroline Powell's 61.29 British Indoor record.

The Southern Counties Championships followed a week later and then on March 1st the EAMA Indoor Inter Area Challenge, where Viv Bonner broke the British W60 60m. Record with 9.10.

The British Masters Indoor Championships on the 7/8th March concluded the domestic indoor season, and 95 year old Charles Eugster set a 200m. World record of 55.48 and a 60m. British record of 15.32,

Sue Yeomans broke the W60 European pole vault record with 2.91 and Guy Bracken set an M50 British record of 4:11.87 for 1500m.

The Manchester Metropolitan University research project on athletes over 60 has now recruited over 300 athletes. If you have registered, but have not yet received your accelerometer or an invitation to go to Manchester, you have not been forgotten, and will be contacted in due course: the researchers have a large number of athletes to test.

It looks unfortunately now that will be no British bid to stage the World Track and Field Championships in 2018 as there has been no further progress from either Cardiff or London.

Looking forward to the spring and summer, the European Non-Stadia Championships take place in Grosseto, Italy on May 15/17th and the World Track and Field Championships in Lyon, France in August. A reminder that the closing date for Grosseto has passed, and is June 2nd for Lyon.

The IAAF World Championships in Beijing this summer will include two Masters Races, an M50 800m. and a W50 400m. There are high qualifying standards and some British athletes have reached them. At present Sally Reed-Cayton leads the women's list and Rob Andrew the men's. We send our best wishes to them, hoping for their selection.

Tony Bowman writes to say he read in the "Daily Telegraph" That after studying 1,098 runners, they found that those who ran fastest tended to die earlier than those exercised less vigorously. In fact according to P Schnohr from the "Copenhagen Heart Study" who states that vigorous exercise performed for decades could provoke health risks especially to the cardiovascular systems.

Tony goes on to say that he has partaken in vigorous exercise for all of his life, has had four serious episodes in the last nine years, so he can sympathise with this research.

He has as some of us know competed in Masters Athletics, since the age of 42, winning National and International Titles in the Sprints, Hurdles and Combined Events. He has trained hard for this level of competition. He has, however, had artery problems in the past resulting in a stent and a balloon around his heart and also the removal of 30cm of small bowel due to the non-circulation of blood.

Last November he was admitted to A&E shortness of breath following a tennis match which has resulted in him being diagnosed as having Hyrial Flutter similar to Atrial Fibrillation. He is awaiting a course of Warfarin, followed by treatment to regulate his heart rate.

He would be interested in hearing from Athletes who have had similar problems, especially those who have taken Warfarin. He would like to know how it has affected their participation in Sport.

or this season's championships we visited Ruthin, a small historical market town in North Wales. The course was a "traditional cross country course", with the athletes having to negotiate farm yard paths, compared to the modern trend of circumnavigating the perimeters of football pitches. Entries for the event were high; with our masters challenging the current analogy that cross country participation is waning in the UK.




Race One. (Approx. 6k) All Women's age groups and Men 65+

On the first small lap, before leading into the two larger laps, a trio of Lucy Elliot, (Winchester & Dist.) Claire Martin (Telford) and Hayley Kuter (Salford) developed a small 3 metre lead over the rest of the field. At the finish of the second larger lap, Claire Martin had obtained a 10 metre lead over Helen Berry (Holmfirth) with Lucy Elliot in close attendance. These 3 had now stretched the field, putting a 100 metre gap between 4th placed Eleanor Fowler (Nuneaton) and Kathryn Bailey (Winchester & Dist.)

At the finish line, a fast finishing Helen Berry just could not catch the inform Claire Martin, losing out by just 3 seconds. Both athletes were contesting the o/40 age group medals, with 3rd finisher Lucy Elliott also showing her younger rivals how to compete in winning the o/45 Gold Medal. Nuneaton's Eleanor Fowler finished in 4th place to take her deserved o/35 Gold Medal followed by a pair of o/45's from Winchester, Kathryn Bailey and

Karen Rushton, ensuring team Gold and a successful day's racing for the Winchester & District Club.



Slightly further down the field, a battle for the o/65 men's title was ensuing. After the first two laps Rotherham's Bob Tintager had developed a 50 metre lead over the next male athlete, Ryde's Peter Young, with the prolific over 70 year old Martin Ford, just another 100 metres behind. On the long run in to the finish, Peter Young made his move to sprint past Bob Tintager to clinch his Gold Medal.

Martin Ford held his position to obtain his o/70 Gold. In the Women's over 50 age group, Caroline Wood (Arena 80) safely earned her Gold medal and East Hull's Beverly Jackson did likewise in the over 55's. Maggie Statham (Holland Sports) received the o/60 Gold and in the 65+ age group

Derby's Angela Copson renewed her rivalry with Ros Tabor to take Gold. There were 6 finishers in the Women's over 70 category, with Dot Fellows from the Cannock club taking Gold. Colwyn Bay's Maureen Singleton actually competed in the very first BMAF Championship and was delighted to still compete and win the o/75 title. Bingley's runners Peter Covey and Fred Gibbs took control of the 0/75 men's section, finishing 1st and 2nd respectively, with Edinburgh's Walter McCaskey making the long trip down to Wales to secure his o/80 Gold Medal. The very first BMAF Cross Country Championship race winner, Arthur Walsham (Salford) also competed in the o/80's and took Bronze in this age group.



Race Two (Approx. 8k) Men 35+ to 64.

There was a tremendously high standard of competition within this race. On the first small lap before going out to the country, British Army champion Ady Whitwam from the Morpeth club, developed a 10metre lead from James Scott-Buccleuch (ThamesH&H) and Mark Powell. (Leicester C) On completion of lap two Ady Whitwam had increased his lead to 15 metres over Mark Powell with the o/ 50 Welshman Austin Davies (Brecon) showing his younger counterparts how to compete in third place.

Ady Whitwam held his lead to win his Gold Medal, from England's International Mark Powell and with previous BMAF Cross Country winner, Tipton's Phil Hinch, taking the Bronze Medal. Amazingly Austin Davies finished 4th overall to clinch his o/50 Gold Medal, with 5th placed Paul Ward (Telford AC) achieving his Gold in the o/45 age group. Last year's o/50 Gold medallist Ben Reynolds (Thames H&H) also had a tremendous run to finish 6th and receive his Silver medal.

There was a close battle for the o/40 Gold Medals, between Warrington's Nick Jones and North Shields Poly AC's lain Twaddle. Nick eventually winning by 11 seconds. On home soil, Welsh Champion, Swansea's Ifan Lloyd was a clear winner in the o/55 age group. Returning from injury the evergreen Mike Hagar (Tipton Harriers) also comfortably accomplished Gold within the o/60 age group.

The whole event went very smoothly. The entry list was higher than expected, reflecting the masters Commitment to cross country competition. The Ruthin School venue was perfect with its picturesque mountain backdrop and excellent facilities (Showers, Hot Food etc.) and the traditional cross country course was well marked and marshalled. The feedback received from the athletes has also been very positive and well received.

I would therefore on behalf of our federation, congratulate and convey our thanks to the organising committee at Prestatyn RC,(especially Gareth Hughes) plus all the officials, first aid, marshals and everybody else involved with the smooth running of this event, helping to make it one of our most successful cross country championship events.







Eight area clubs competed in the match and for the first time W70 events were included in the programme. Southern Counties dominated both men's and women's matches with a total of 547 points, with Eastern Veterans second on 485 and Midland Masters third on 444.

In the men's match Southern Counties won by a margin of 51 points, secured by a substantial number of wins in both track and field, with Eastern Veterans second and Midland Masters third. In the sprints M35 Josh Wood, M60 Wally Franklyn and M70 Vic Novell won the 60m. races, 7.09, 8.22 and 8.73, while Ray Watkins, M60, ran a fine double to take the 200m. in 26.77 and the 400m, in 59.38, M35 Adam Bellis won the 200m, 23.77 and M50 Bob Lewis the 400m, 58.27. Southern Counties won the 800m. races in all age groups, M35 Craig Sharp in 2:06.97, M50 Jon Tilt in 2:09.77, M60 Dave Wilcock in 2:21.84 and M70 John Batchelor in 2:45.13. Dave Wilcock also took the 1500m. in 4:45.11 and Craig Sharp the 3000m. in 9:44.94. To complete the track victories international star M50 Francisco Reis, dropping down to the 35-49 age group, won the 2k. Walk by over two minutes, clocking 9:00.29 and Chris Hobbs won the M50 race in 9:40.68. Southern Counties also took the M60 and M70 4x200m. Relays.

In the jumps Vic Novell added to his 60m. win by taking the long jump, 4.10, M35 Andy Lewis the M35 competition with 6.07, M35 Keith Newton won the triple jump, 11.58, and M50 John Andrews, dropping down to the 35-49 age category, pole vaulted 3.70 to win. Southern Counties took three of the four shot competitions, M35 Mark Wiseman, 13.73, M50 Allan Leiper, 12.72 and M60 Neil Griffin, 11.56.

Eastern Veterans produced wins on the track with Ricki Huskisson taking the M50 200m. in 25.50, Malcolm Tuff the M50 1500m. in 4:32.56 and the M50 relay, while Ian Reeve, M60, scored a double victory in the field, high jump, 1.40 and long jump, 4.39. All the 60m. sprinters scored valuable points with second places.

Midland Masters M50 Greg Dunson won a fine track and field double in the 60m. Hurdles, 9.13 and high jump, 1.70. Michael Gardiner, M35, won the 400m. in 52.24, David Oxland the M60 3000m. in 10:39.89 and the club took the M35 relay. Richard Jegou won the M70 shot, 10.62.

For fourth placed VAC M35 Alwyn Lombaard won the 60m. Hurdles in 9.41, and the high jump, clearing 1.78, Brian Lewis won the M50 60m. in 7.63 and Ben Reynolds and M70 Peter Giles took the 3000m. races in 9:34.51 and 11:58.17. W65s Ros Tabor and Angie Copson resumed their rivalry over the middle distances when they again battled in this championships that drew a record 581 individual entries. Some of the 233 British entrants for the European indoor event in Torun Poland missed the championships but Tabor and Copson would resume their rivalry there.

Here it was Tabor who came out on top after they had dead heated in their previous outing, albeit over 800m and the Dulwich Runner was less than a second outside Copson's 1500m world record, at 5:37.62, her quickest for five years and said she found it really easy. This was after a bit of pushing and shoving on the final bend but all was well.

World record holder Copson was back for the 800m on the second day and won with 2:50.76 before later adding the 3000m in 11:50.18, but said: "I was quite frightened," (as the women had to run with younger men).

There was a British 1500m record for M50 Guy Bracken, at 4:11.87 a time only few seconds short of the world age group record, while Karen Brooks missed Nancy Hitchmough's W55 1500 British best by a fraction with 5:08.97.

Charles Eugster set the only World record of the meeting with an M95 200m best of 55.48, a performance that saw the Swiss resident elevated to celebrity status in the National media. He also set a British 60m mark of 15.32 for good measure. He said: "I'm absolutely delighted. It proves that you can set yourself challenges and goals at any age and achieve them."

Carole Filer competed in the most events and won four including her staples; the high and long jumps.

Helen Godsell won the W60 60m in 8.85 to narrowly head Joan Trimble and Caroline Powell. "I had a terrible start," said Godsell. Powell added the 200m and 400m. "I have done a lot more strength work in the gym this winter," said Powell, who finalised her Euro preparations.




Moira West won the three W65 sprints: the 60m was won in 9.63 before the 200m in 32.31 and 400m in 75.98. "You don't get a lot of competition and only get a couple of chances indoors," said the Winchester runner.


Danny Graham, in his first high jump competition for 13 years, soared over 2.01m for an M35 championship best, despite gashing his thigh with his own spikes. This was the first two metre jump in British Masters competition. "I did 2.22m as a 22-year-old then did nothing for 10-11 years," said the 35-year-old.

Lithuanian Gintaras Varanauskas added the M40 high jump with 1.95m, while the pole vault saw a European W60 record from Sue Yeomans, who was over 2.91m. W75 Kathleen Stewart won the 400m in 88.46 before returning, to set a British 800m W75 record of 3:36.93 on the Sunday.

The outdoor winter throws meeting saw summer conditions on the first day and there, Steve Whyte added three M50 long throws, including the Hammer in 52.17m, to go with an indoor shot 13.83m victory. His fourth event saw a new British M50 weight record of 21.12m.

However Whyte said: "I've got a meniscus tear in my knee and am waiting for an operation." The walks, over 3000m, had Poland bound M50 Francisco Reis clock13:35.64, M65 Ian Richards 14:41.27 and M75 Arthur Thomson, 19:27.10, to confirm their usual form.

EUROPEAN MASTERS INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS 23RD-28TH MARCH, TORUÑ, POLAND Words: Bridget Cushen Pictures: Tom phillips. first impression on arriving in Torun was the convenient siting on the edge of town of what proved to be one of the best Indoor facilities we have so far encountered. Completed last August; adjacent to an 8-lane outdoor track with separate throwing area, a coniferous wood and within walking distance of all hotels, it met all other criteria - food outlets, ample parking and easy access from major roads and had no difficulty accommodating 2,409 competitors from 42 countries who entered a total 4,887 events. Well organised with a hoard of friendly young volunteers, the Polish Masters have raise the organisational bar. The media coverage featured a live TV stream as well as some coverage on the national channels and the Press.

For our 233-strong team ranging in ages 35 through to M95, it was a very, very successful and enjoyable trip, returning home with a haul of 155 medals and several Seasons Best performances. Germany again had the biggest team but the host nation's large entry included 19 Olympians as hosting this event engendered huge interest. But despite the size of the German and Polish teams we managed second place in the medal table. On the first day, centre field was a hive of activity with a nail biting women's W35 and W40 high jump competition, men's long jump, 3000m finals and the 400m heats in the first

afternoon. It is encouraging to see 4 and 3 heats respectively in the M/W35 400m as this much maligned age group continues to expand. The first World Record to go however was in the women's shot where the Romania WMA W60 champion Milaela Loughlin bettered her Budapest 13.39m in the 2nd round with a 13.70m heave. At the conclusion of the morning's competition, the women's 3000m races were dominated by BMAF members as W35 Joanne Locker knocked over 10sec off her winning time at Picketts Lock, Louise Rudd took the W40 title, Bernadine Pritchett won the W45 by a clear minute, Margret Phillips the W60 in 12.34.44sec. Ros Tabor dominated the W65 race and Betty Stacey took the W70 silver. Seeded races were needed in some of the men's age categories. Guy Bracken set off in the M50 race looking as if he was after Nigel Gates' 2004 8.49.37 World mark but slowed over the last few laps.




The 400m heats were scheduled for the afternoon where the M50 and W50 group necessitated six and three heats respectively. All eyes were on the M35-ies as NVAC's Richard Beardsell clocked 51.16 in his heat and the new Kid on the Block, Poland's Piotr Klimczak, ran 51.47 thus setting up what would be the race of the Championships scheduled for 21.00 the next day as Klimczak has a pending WR time in this year. Outdoors, the M35-54 hammer and M55+ javelin throwers had dry weather with a cold cross wind.


Our eleven Walkers were off to an early start on Day 2 where Francisco Reis had to give way to the remarkably youthful

Peranez of Spain in the M50 3k. Ian Richards achieved the M65 double leading the strong M65 team to the 5km road walk gold.

British men and women dominated the 60m after endless heats and semis. In what other major international championships would one find so many British vests in finals? Non-Europeans were allowed to enter here for the first time, but run in heats only. A questionable decision, European Masters Athletics has now carried out a Survey, we have said no to non-Europeans, and it would appear that the majority of Affiliates also ticked this box. It will be on the Agenda at their next Congress. A Canadian, Christian Lemassif, clocked 7.51 in the 5th heat of the M45, the same time as the winner Eduard Gonaus, Austria, however 7.63 was needed to progress beyond the semis in a series where Jason Carty and Mark Dunwell held pole positions throughout culminating in Jason winning in 7.24 from Mark 7.29sec. Our Photographer, Tom Phillips, in top form here got through to the M60 final this time finishing just out of the medals. The Italian Mario Longo sped to a 7.18sec European record only to break the World Record in the final with 7.10sec. Donald Brown clocked 7.47sec in the same heat and 7.50 in the final for a well-deserved bronze



As can be seen from the results, the women were incredibly successful with a clean sweep in some age groups. Caroline Powell continues to re-write the W60 records, here setting a European 200m record and dominating the 400m.



Alasdair Ross ran beautifully judged 200/400m. The clash in the M35 final did not materialise as the Pole pulled a hamstring and scratched, Richard Beardsell strode to victory. The M40 title went to Mike Coogan in 52.35. Mike Who? Keeping himself reasonably fit until he hit Four-0 and realised he needed to do something more. At 41 Mike joined East Cheshire Harriers and the NVAC only last summer and training with a group he has made astonishing progress. He was runner-up over 200/400m to Baba Tindogo at the BMAF Indoor in 53.51. "I am overawed by the whole experience here, everyone is so friendly. What I really like about the Masters is the level playing field, the 5-year age groups", he enthused, before going on to get a bronze in the 200m.

It was another World Record for another NVAC star performer, Darren Scott, over 200m and W40 Louise Rudd set a British record over 1500m – must be the Northern air! One member whose series went largely unnoticed in an action packed six days is Carole Filer. No stranger to the rostrum in international championships; the EVAC member medalled in all her events, winning two gold, a silver and a bronze despite being only a few months short of moving into a new age group. A remarkable series against such strong opposition.

Unfortunately there were some casualties in intense finals with a few fallers. Tennyson James was well positioned on the final bend in the M55 400m but appeared to get into a leg tangle and Mike Toal needed five stitches in his leg after the M40 1500m Final. Greg Dunston finished up hobbling around on crutches after a nightmare Achilles tendon snap during his second attempt in the long jump. After his

experience in the World Championships in Sacramento in 2011, he bounced back, and I know you will all wish him a rapid and complete recovery. The W50 long jump was won by the German, Birgit Burzlaff, (4.75m) from Joanne Willoughby (4.60m), a special Trophy was given to the winner in memory of the W50 Polish long jumper Marianna Biskup who sadly died from cancer three weeks before the championships.

World records were broken in the relays one by the British M35 quartet of Ossai, Collins, Bolan-Ashworth and Beardsell with 1:29.24, the W60 did likewise in 2:02.39, the team being Trimble, Nelson, Godsell and Powell. We also got plenty of medals Gold in the M45, M60 and W55. Silver in the M55, W35, W50 and W65. Bronze in the M70.

The 5km cross-country was held over three laps in the adjacent wood, hilly and with a stretch of road, competitors found it quite hard.

We did not have many entries in the Outdoor field events. Both men's and women's Shot competitions were of a very high standard as we have come to expect at European championships. Spectators were glued to the M45 high jump where the Russian straddle jumper, Vitalii Romanovich and Lasmanis of Latvia had a great tussle with both clearing 1.87m, the Russian was unlucky as he just brushed the bar and the Latvian took the title.

In going through the results I noticed that John Mayor set a new British Record of 9.07 in the M55 Hurdles, in the men's Pentathlon.




