Welcome to the second edition of the online and subscription versions of "Masters Athletics", we hope you enjoy reading the issues.

In the World of Masters Athletics we have had a brilliant European Indoor Championships, reported by Bridget Cushen in this issue, where the UK team finished third overall. In additional we report on British Indoor and Cross Country Championships, with the assistance of the amazing photographs of Tom Phillips, Alex Rotas and Jeremy Hemming.

In athletics generally, events appear not to be as successful as in the Masters. The Moscow test centre has had its Anti-doping accreditation revoked which will not help Russia gain the ability to compete at Rio, whilst Kenya could also find themselves banned from international competition as they struggle to convince the rest of the world that their drug testing programme is fit for purpose.

In Brazil the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Commission Chair Nawal El Moutawakel has backed Brazil and the Brazilians, to deliver successful Olympic Games this August. Following the 10th and final IOC Commission visit to Rio de Janeiro on 11-13 April 2016. However, recent press comment suggests many problems remain regarding the completion of facilities, a contaminated water sports area, and dare I mention the "Zika Virus".

As I write this article, the Brazilian lower house of congress has passed a motion of impeachment against President Dilma Rousseff. The Country's Senate must now decide if she is to stand trial, which would likely take place just before the Olympic Games in Rio.

I read from Ken Stones website that USATF Masters Track & Field have rolled out a plan it hopes will grow USA's medal count at Perth. Called the Executive Committee Travel Assistance Reimbursement Programme, it aims to spend up to \$5,000 on "travel grants to USATF athletes likely to win medals who otherwise would not be able to participate. It is a great pity that we are unable to have such assistance in the UK.

Local Government funding cuts have forced Stoke Gifford Parish Council to become the first in the world to charge Parkrun a fee for the use of its grounds following its 12th of April vote. Following its decision, a petition backed by a number of high-profile sporting names was launched. It has attracted more than 35,000 signatures.

A survey of Decathletes / Heptathletes taken a year or so ago showed unanimous preference for the all-time rankings maintained on our website over power of ten. The reason is that I am retiring after 20 years on the job and my computer system is totally outdated.

The job specification is as follows:

To collect all performances by UK combined event athletes in competitions wherever they occur and enter them into a new rankings program being written specially for the BMAF.

To send a report at the end of both the outdoor athletics season and the indoor athletics season to the BMAF webmaster to update the Masters all time UK ranking lists. The volunteer, ideally from the combined events world, should contact myself so I can brief them on the full details of the task.

I hope that we get someone soon or the rankings, maintained since the eighties originally by Rodney Charnock, will be discontinued.

The IAAF World Indoor Championships drew to a close in Portland yesterday as the USA handed the baton to the UK who will host the next edition in 2018 at Birmingham's Barclaycard Arena.

Birmingham previously hosted the Championships in 2003 as well as the European Indoor Championships in 2007, giving the city a proven track record and pedigree in staging major championships.

The World Indoor Championships in 2018 will follow soon after London has hosted the outdoor World Championships in the Stadium at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park in the summer of 2017, giving British athletes the massive incentive of competing at another home championship.

Chief Executive of UK Athletics Niels de Vos said: "We are confident that Birmingham 2018 will build on the successful IAAF World Indoor Championships in Portland and continue innovating to make it the best ever staging of the event.

"Birmingham has hosted the IAAF's number one ranked Indoor Grand Prix for many years, showing proven ability in staging an event of this stature. With the expertise we have to organise and deliver these Championships combined with the great support of the home crowd, Birmingham will produce a special atmosphere in two years' time."

Councillor Ian Ward, Deputy Leader of Birmingham City Council, said: "The IAAF World Indoor Athletic Championships in Portland have been well organised and a great success. They have brought new innovation to the event and set the bar high for Birmingham 2018, but I am confident that Birmingham will rise to the challenge and deliver a championship to remember."

Lauren Jeska accused of Alexander Stadium triple stabbing



An ex-running champion has appeared in court accused of stabbing three men at a major UK athletics stadium.

Lauren Jeska, 41, is charged with attempted murder and wounding two others with intent, at the Alexander Stadium in Birmingham on Tuesday.

The men are reportedly officials from UK Athletics. One, 51, is in a stable condition in hospital, police said.

Ms Jeska, from Powys, was remanded in custody to appear at Birmingham Crown Court on 25 April.

At the championships and other events a world record and six British records were set. Glyn Sutton claimed the world record, 8.12 for an M70 60m. British records were set by Len Tew, 3:35.39 for a M80 800m, Phillipa Millage, 2:06.50 for a W35 800m, Mensah Elliott, 7.95 for a M35 60m. hurdles, Joe Appiah, 8.46 for an M45 60m. hurdles, Iris Holder, 3.00 for a W75 long jump and Carole Parker, 11.74 for a W45 shot putt. Outside the BMAF 10 Mile and the BMAF Cross Country Championships were held. Reports on many of these fixtures can be read inside.

Congratulations must go to two athletes who were selected to compete in Masters 800m. events in the IAAF Indoor Championships in Portland, Oregon. Dave Wilcock won the M60 800m. in 2:15.90 and Karen Brooks took third place in the W60 800m. in 2:40.14. A great follow up to Beijing.

However fit and healthy we are there is always a danger of an emergency arising during a Championship. We will be introducing stickers for you to fill in listing emergency details - contact No. of your next-of-kin and, optionally, a list of any medication/medical problem you may feel necessary unless you are wearing a Medical Band, to stick on the back of your competitor's number. It would also be useful to take a similar sticker with you when you enter a European or World Championships as Team Managers may themselves be competing and with up to 500 travelling it is impossible to cover all.

F.A.N.S

Some Local Authorities operate the Free Admission to National Sportspersons (FANS) Scheme whereby any athlete who has ever competed in any international championships, including World/European Masters Championships, the British & Irish Masters International Cross-Country, or if you are ranked in the first six in your event, you may be eligible for free admission to your Authority's Leisure facilities. Local Authorities will ask for proof, please make my voluntary job easier by give them my email address, list age group and your qualifying event(s).

here was a good entry for this year's Indoor Pentathlon at Lee Valley and also some very good performances for so early in the year.

I have always considered that 3000 points was a good indication of an outstanding performance but in the men's event we had to wait until M55 before this figure was achieved. In fact it was the ever reliable John Mayer who came up with a great all round performance of 3649 points.

In M60 we had two great performances with Peader McGing winning with 3513 from Clem Leon with 3307.

Continuing the 3000 plus theme M65 saw both Adrian Essex winning with 3494 from Dave Cowley with 3145.

As to individual event excellence I would draw attention to the 1.61 cm high jump of Chris Ness in M45 and that John Mayer was still long jumping more than 5 metres in M55.

Turning to the ladies there were fine performances from Monica Brown winning W50 with 3250 points while in W55 no less than the first three exceeded 3000 points with Susan Frisby coming out on top with an excellent 3892. Sally Hine was the gold medallist in W65 with 3416.



The highlight of the day however was the fantastic performance of Carole Filer not only in scoring a World record 4568 points but also breaking the W65 indoor World record in the hurdles with 9.96 seconds. Altogether an excellent day.

Again eight area clubs were represented in this well contested fixture with many high standard performances. Two British records were set, W75 Iris Holder 11.74 long jump, 3.00 and W45 Carole Parker shot putt, 11.74.

The men's match was dominated by SCVAC who scored 301 points to second placed VAC's 254.5. Josh Wood, M35 in 7.17, Tom Phillips, M60 in 8.25 and Vic Novell, M70 in 8.85 won three 60m. races, with only Pat Logan, competing for his new club, NIMAA, winning the M50 event in 7.69 and preventing an SCVAC clean sweep. Pat claimed a fine double by taking the 200m. in 25.11, with the other victories going to Ben Owen, MMAC, 23.47 in the M35 race and Ian Broadhurst, WMAA, 27.15 in the M60 race. SCVAC took all 400m. races, M35 Adam Bellis, 52.06, M50 Jonathan Tilt, 55.33, M60 Clem Leon 61.93 and M70 Terry Bissett, 71.27. Mensah Elliott easily won the 60m. Hurdles by more than a second for SCVAC in a fast 8.16, with John Mayor, EVAC, winning the M50 race in 9.36.

In the 800m, SCVAC athletes scored well in three of the age groups, Steve Baldock, aged 46, winning the M35 race in a very fast 1:59.71, Jonathan Tilt, M50, gaining his second victory, 2:12.62, and Dave Wilcock outclassing the opposition in the M60 with 2:18.57. Richard Bloom, VAC, took the M70 event in 2:57.82. VAC were the dominant club in the 1500m, M35 Mohammed Ismail winning in 4:16.61, M50 Steve Roberts in 4:42.49 and M70 Peter Giles in 5:34.31. M60 Dave Wilcock scored a fine double for SCVAC to add to his 800m, clocking 4:48.63. MMAC won two of the 3000m. events, M35 Calvin Scoltock, 10:02.38, and M60 Dave Oxland 10:40.01, while EVAC's Colin Ridley took the M50 in 9:49.75. SCVAC won both the 2k. walks, Steve Allan 10:26.83 to take the M35 and Chris Hobbs, 9:48.85, the M50.

Honours in the jumps were more widely spread than on the track. Long jump winners were M35 Andy Lewis, SCVAC, 6.07, M50 Paul Guest, SWVAC, 5.45, M60 Rashpal Singh, MMAC, 4.32 and M70 Allan Cheers, WMAA, 3.87. Allan doubled up by winning the high jump in 1.25, with Duncan Talbot, SCVAC, taking the M60 with 1.40. Alwyn Lombaard, VAC, and Clint Nicholls, EVAC, tied at 1.75 in the M35 event and Richard Phelan, also EVAC, won the M50 with 1.50. MMAC took both triple jumps, M35 Donovan Davenport, 11.74 and M50 Albert Earle, 10.34. Shot putt victories were gained by SCVAC's Mark Wiseman, 14.06 in the W35 group, M50 Andrew Turner, WMAA, 10.97, M60 Geoff Tyler, EVAC, 11.99 and M70 John Watts, NMAC, 11.28.

The 4x200m. relays were won by EVAC, M35, 1:37.95, VAC, M50, 1:47.64 and two by SCVAC, M60, 1:55.52 and M70, 2:12.75.

The women's match was more evenly balanced, EVAC just edging out SCVAC by 246.5 points to 241.5. In the 60m. races Joanne Frost, WMAA, won the W35 in 8.06, VAC's Angela Bates the W50 race in 8.57, EVAC's Carole Filer the W60 in 9.07 and Iris Holder the W70 in 10.95. Paula Williams won the 200m. for MMAC, 28.02, Avril McClelland, MMAC, the W50 in 29.44 and SCVAC's Joan Trimble the W60 in 31.69. Former senior international Lesley Owusu, SCVAC, ran a fast 58.43 to easily win the W35 400m, Lisa Webb, VAC, took the W50 in 67.70 and Carole Filer added to her 60m. victory to take the W60 race, 73.81. Diana Norman, SCVAC, won the 60m. hurdles, 9.55 and Susan Frisby, MMAC, the W50, 10.12. Diana added to her hurdles victory by winning the 800m, in 2:20.27, EVAC's Karen Brooks took the W50 race, 2:35.05 and a very close contest in the W60 race

led to Ros Tabor, VAC, winning in 2:55.18, just edging out Nancy Hitchmough, MMAC, 2:55.54 and NMAC's Joan Howe, 2:56.46. Pat Gallagher, WMAA, had an easy win in the W70 race, 3:24.81. VAC took two 1500m. races. Bernadine Pritchett won the W35 in 5:03.49 and Lisa Webb the W50 in 5:08.70. Angela Copson, MMAC, easily won the W60 in 5:44.36. SCVAC newcomer Penny Cummings won the W35 2k. Walk, 10:51.99 and Wendy Bennett, WMAA, the W50, 11:15.52.

In the long jump W60 Carole Filer won her third event with 4.36, W35 Joanne Frost her second with 5.46, MMAC's Jo Willoughby, the W50 with 4.55 and record breaker Iris Holder, the W70, 3.00. Carole Filer completed her quartet of victories with another win in the high jump, 1.20, Ayamba Akim, VAC, easily won the W35 even with 1.60 and Melanie Garland, WMAA, jumped 1.30 to win the W50 event. European record holder Sue Yeomans, now 62, from SCVAC, won the W50 pole vault with 2.70 and Jemma Eastwood, EVAC, the W35 with 3.10. MMAC won both triple jumps, Paula Williams the W35 with 9.55 and Jo Willoughby adding to her long jump success with 9.96 as a W50. The shot putt victories went to record breaker MMAC's Carole Parker, W35, 11.74 and the other three age groups to SCVAC, Julie Wilson, W50, 9.96, Vilma Thompson, W60, 9.36 and W70 Liz Sissons, 8.55.

WMAA won the W35 4x200m. relay in 1:54.88 and SCVAC the other two, W50, 2:01.73 and W60, 2:12.45.

Joe Lancaster was a champion distance runner, a football trainer and journalist.

He died at his home in Italy the age of 89, in December 2015.

Joe was fitness coach to the title-winning Manchester City side run by Joe Mercer and Malcolm Allison. But, in truth, Joe was much prouder of his involvement with the great Charlton, Best and Law Manchester United team.

He was also a tremendous distance runner setting the World Two Hour record in 1955, 22 Miles and 418 yards.

Ron Blastland 1931-2015 by Alan Roberts

Ron was born in Grimsby and started running in the fields at Grimsby back in 1946.

Ron was a member Derby Athletic Club for 25 years and was a good club runner for them over the Half Mile and Mile. He was also part of Derby's 12 Stage road relay winning team. Ron joined the Vale in the late 70's (1979?), by which time he was a Veteran. He was then only a 25 to 35 miles a week enthusiast and never a fanatic, but still achieved a 2 hour 40 mins marathon as a veteran 40 which was at the time the second fastest time by a veteran, only to be denied the Club record when narrowly being beaten by his rival Ken Fiddler in the same race at Glasgow. A few years later though he ran 2.41 as a vet 50 to set a club record which lasted 18 years. The 80's and 90's saw Ron with Ken Fiddler and Pat Ferguson travelling and competing in Europe in Veteran competitions and with the addition of Ron Gomez and Ian Addison he was part of a formidable Vale force in the Southern Veterans relays.



Ron was a member of Midland Vets AC and a regular correspondent in the Midland Vets newsletter up to 2014. In 2000 after the race in Grimsby where he hung up his spikes he wrote "I hope to get to a few events if not too far from home and will continue to help the Vale of Aylesbury in some small capacity or other from time to time" Ron was true to his word and was always seen at the Ridgeway Run in Tring where he lived giving words of encouragement to the Vale runners who would pass him on route.

JOHN DISLEY (20/11/28 to 9/2/16) by Alastair Aitken



John Disley CBE was born in Corris Wales, educated at Oswestry Boys School and Loughborough Colleges before becoming a teacher.

He will be remembered, for helping Chris Brasher, put the first London Marathon 1981.

Alastair watched Disley, many times at London's White City stadium in the 1950's, where he was eight times Inter-Counties Champion.

It was Disley's impressive build and winning smile, which could be seen, as he hurdled the jumps. That certainly caught the imagination of the crowds that flocked to the White City Stadium....

Even though he was a top class steeplechaser, he also set a Welsh Mile record, in June1958 4min 05.4 on cinders. In actual fact he set 18 Welsh records and was the BBC Wales Sports Personality of the year in 1955.

His two most noteworthy performances came were the Olympic Games he ran in. Third in the 1952 Olympic 3000 steeplechase in Helsinki, followed by sixth place in 1956 in an Olympic Final when, amazingly the whole British team made the Final in Melbourne.

It is worth remembering that John set a UK record of 8:44.2 in 1955.


He had pneumonia six weeks before and Chris Brasher had only finish ahead of him twice in something like 50 races they had together.

He was a successful mountaineer, setting a record for the 'Three Peeks' in Snowdonia; He was one of the pioneers for Orienteering in the UK, something he loved doing.

It was in 1979 he came fourth in the National Over 50' Veterans cross country Championship at Parliament Hill... He was Vice Chairman of the UK Sports Council in 1974 to 1982 and one should not forget the likeable man was the first British runner to break 9 minutes for a steeplechase.

Sylvester Stein 1920-2015

We are sorry to record the death at aged 95 of the BMAF's first President and former Chairman, Sylvester Stein, on 28 December. First BMAF president also former Chairman, and founder of several well-known running magazines. We offer our sincere condolence to Sarah and his family.



Tom McCook, the long-time Birchfield Harriers stalwart and *Athletics Weekly* contributor, has died aged 69 from a heart attack.

Originally from Inverness, McCook moved to Birmingham and went on to become president of his beloved Birchfield and such was his popularity and impact on the sport he was given the prestigious Ron Pickering Memorial Award for Services to Athletics around a decade ago.

McCook was an ever-present at athletics events, especially at the Alexander Stadium, where he passed on his infectious enthusiasm for the sport with athletes, coaches, spectators and journalists.

The news of his death came as the first day of the Indoor British Championships was drawing to a close and cast a shadow over the weekend for those who knew him.

Andy Ferguson, one of the older Highgate Harriers, was a real lively character. .He sadly died on the 1st of March this year.

Andy Ferguson had a long athletic career, and he went on to run a good London marathon, as a **53 he ran 2:39.48**. But, his fame came long before that. He won the Junior North of Thames in 1948 and, the strongly contested, Senior North of Thames cross country Championships in 1951.

He represented Scotland, as a cross country international, coming second in their Championships in 1952 and, back in 1950 he ran 14.11.6 for 3 miles in the AAA's Championships at the White City, coming second to the Belgian Lucien Theys who ran 14.09.0.

Before that, he set a Scottish 3 miles Scottish Native record in 1949, when he was 3rd in the AAA's in 14.11.02. Ferguson also ran in races at the White City with Pirie and Zatopek. **The latter he congratulated when Emil won** and, said how nice Emil Zatopek was.

Arthur Keily (18/3/21 to 2/3/16) by Alastair Aitken.

There were five brothers Jerry, Bill, Dominic, Joe and Michael and, all were part of a very successful club Derby & County AC

Arthur Patrick Keily, died aged 94, which was a very impressive age, considering he had not had an easy life. He fought in the Second World War and then at 28, turned from being a good amateur footballer to being a serious runner...After that, he punctuated his life with countless good performances, too many to mention, that was despite having a tough job with British Rail and Rolls Royce, when he was in his prime. At that time he was often doing over 130 miles a week in training.

In Olympic year 1960, he achieved his fastest marathon time, when winning the Doncaster to Sheffield Marathon in 2:19.23

Leading up to the Olympics in 1960 in Rome. The British marathon runners only arrived in the heat of Rome, two days before the Olympic marathon. Besides that there was the rule that you could not drink in the early stages of a marathon or even have a sponge, till the 12 miles mark. That was of little real use in such hot conditions in Rome so, unless you were from some of the very hot countries, like the winner Abebe Bikila of Ethiopia and the Second runner Rhadi of Morocco, dehydration would have already set in.

Arthur Keily was leading the race at 10 and 12 miles but, he obviously started to wilt after that and came in 25^{th} in 2:27.0. He completed his first long part of his athletics career by coming 2^{nd} in the same time as the winner (1.8.25) in the Morpeth to Newcastle road race on December 31^{st} 1960.

He retired from the sport at the end of 1960 and then took it up again in the early 1990's and, promptly won the M70 prize in the BMAF 5k road Championships at Dunsford Aerodrome, on the 14th of April 1991. It was after that he went on to obtain track records as a Master over 80.

Arthur Keily, wrote two books, the second one, mainly photos was dedicated to his wife Betty. They were

called 'Arthur Keily Marathon Winner' and '80 years of happy healthy life"

Ronald Frederick Hopcroft

His death occurred on March 17, 2016 in St Peters Hospital Chertsey, a world record-holder for the straight 100 miles road race and former President of Thames Valley Harriers. He was 98 years old.

Ron was active in Amateur athletics all his life, both as a runner and an athletics administrator. There were two chief highlights. In 1987 he was made club President for the second time, to lead in the club's celebration of the TVH Centenary Year.

Then in October 1958, already the London-to-Brighton road-race champion, he won the IOO-miles straight road race from Hyde Park Corner to the village of Box in Wiltshire, and in doing so became the new world record-holder of the IOO-mile road race with his time of 12 hours 18 minutes. This feat was widely publicised and Ron received congratulatory letters from all over the world. Ron was always a believer in even-paced running, both in training and in racing, and in this he followed Arthur Newton's books on long-distance running.

His steady running attracted large groups of runners around him in his races, to benefit from his judgment of pace. With help from his wife Eileen, to whom he was married for 61 years, he encouraged countless young athletes throughout his long life.

Eileen has predeceased him, as has their only child Philip and as has also so many of the great family of club colleagues and young friends, that second family which he had built up in amateur athletics over 80 years. Ron and I were / are both members of the BMAF 300 plus Club.

Peter Giles is presently our top M70 Middle and Distance runner at home on Track and Country, but his earlier abilities were very much of a musical nature.

He and his Brother Michael's musical background came from their classical violinist father, but the 1950's saw them devour a diet of "Rock 'n' Roll, Jazz and Big Bands. Michael went to study drums, whilst Peter become at ease with the bass guitar.

They formed their first band in 1960, and in the following year made their recording debut with the "Dowland brothers".

In 1964 the brothers formed "Trendsetters Ltd", and toured the UK and Europe backing "Gene Vincent and the "Drifters.

In the summer of 1967, they formed "Giles, Giles and Fripp," The lineup grew to include Fairport Convention's Julie Dyble, Ian McDonald and lyricist Pete Sinfield.

Peter left that band after the production of its second successful album "the wake of Poseidon", but rejoined in 2002 for the acclaimed "21st Century Schizoid Band tour of the "King Crimson alumni".

Peter is still making music with his wife , classically trained pianist and singer Yasmine using the name "ALUNA".

MY DIARY OF ANCONA By KIM WEIR

I left the UK on Sat 19th March heading to Naples. I travelled with my 21 yr old foster daughter to spend some time in Italy.



Once we landed at Naples, we used the trains, buses and coaches to get about - the itinerary was as follows: 19th - Pompeii - afternoon walking around the ruins sightseeing, dinner out in town, overnight in local hotel and checking out by 8:45. 20th - Train to Sorrento at 9 am. Arrive Sorrento 11 am. Luggage into luggage store so we could wander about, lunch over looking the Bay of Naples, pick up luggage in time to get on the coach to Amalfi at 15:30. Arrived in Amalfi around 5 pm - check into hotel, look around town, dinner and sleep. 21st -Sightseeing around Amalfi, bit of time on the beaches in the afternoon, evening spent out after dinner to a couple of bars - rather late night and slightly more alcohol than normal!! 22nd - Up early, checkout of the hotel, get on the coach to Salerno and then catch a train to Rome. Arrive in Rome and find the hotel to checking. Get bearings then head out for a spot of sightseeing. Dinner and sleep. 23rd - Wake up to rain and wind. Head off to the Coliseum - there is at least a 90 min queue for purchasing tickets for entry so decide to spend the day on the double decker sightseeing buses. With rather large crowds everywhere and weather reminiscent of the UK, Rome is a bit of a disappointment. 24th - Checkout 9am and head back to to Termini train station catch a train to Cortona in Tuscany where I have an old friend who lives there permanently. There is always a lot of socialising, a lot of talking, food and alcohol!!!! Plus a bit of dog walking, swimming and anything else that a slightly eccentric English lady in Italy conjures up! 29th -Get back on a train to Ancona... its a4 hour journey if all goes to plan. The temperature has warmed up a bit and the sun is out. We arrive in Ancona around 2:30 in the afternoon. As I have double booked myself on Booking. com (1st time ever) I have the choice of a basic hotel right across the road from the train station or, a more up market hotel in the middle of the old medieval part of town. As both are going to have to be paid for anyway, we plump for the more upmarket one.

Instructions are "catch the 1/4 but to Piazza Carvena" nothing more so - we use a cab instead. E15 later and several more grey hairs from the extremely fast driving by the cab driver we arrive at the hotel.



Check in - Its comfortable and the staff are friendly. Get slightly better instructions on how to get to the arena.... 1 bus journey back to the station and then the 1/14 bus to the Paliandoor arena. Finally - we are there!!!! Check in is very quick and efficient.

We are handed our athlete and accompanying person passes, bus passes etc. Then onto stage 2 for registration. I am competing in the W50 Hammer the next day at 15:20. I start bumping into people I know throwers from around Europe and GB athletes I have gotten to know over the last 3 years of competing. What was supposed to be a quick visit turns into a 4 hour chat session. (My foster daughter found the bar instead of wondering who I kept talking to!!). Eventually the Opening Ceremony starts so we watch a bit of that before heading back into town and back to the hotel. The plan is out for a steak dinner then sleep except there are hardly any restaurants open in old town Ancona. Finally we find something open where we can eat. It looks promising - there is steak on the menu. Then we find it's sold out. The meal heads downwards from then on so we eventually call it a night and head back to the hotel feeling rather miffed. Next morning, we get a superb breakfast, pack our bags and arrange to collect them later in the day. My foster daughter wants to get a bit of shopping done so it's back out to the town centre where there is now a bit more open than there was the night before. 11 am - its time to head back over to the arena. Arrival at 12 is perfect for a spot of lunch, viewing some outdoor throwing (that's the closest I have been to

a hammer cage since I left the UK) and sunshine. It's going to be a warm one! 2 pm - warm up time nearly here so begin my mental prep list 1st call - suss out where the current competition in the throws cage is at looks like there is going to be a bit of a delay Head over the the call room to see what their take is. Am told there is a delay with the ongoing hammer competition so be prepared to wait. Warm up routines start around 2:45. Finally get the shout for the call room at 3:15 pm. Vest + nos are checked, shoes changed then it's comp time. 20 of the 21 W50 entries are there. Warm ups - 2 throws in the order of competition. Then it's time 3 throws each. The digital display has the athlete no, name and a 60 sec countdown. After each throw the display changes to the distance and position of the athlete in the competition. Its an interesting competition..... several of the top ladies are making a right hash of the first throw. Hammers are caught up in the netting - one takes 25 minutes to retrieve it's so high. Then the field ref changes the person with the EDM spike as the youngster who had been in charge of it seems to have been indicating where the ball ended up rather than where it first landed. After my 3rd throw, I am 7th but there are still a few of the potential medal winners to go (no throws for them so far). As the 3rd round progresses I eventually end up in 10th place (where I expected to be). As the competition is now over an hour late I have to say my goodbyes, pass on my thanks to the officials and head back as my train to Bologna is going to be leaving soon and we still have to head back to the hotel to retrieve bags. We make the train with 1 and 1/2 minutes to spare. Bologna then back to London.

Social media and a very good results service kept families, supporters and enthusiasts well informed on their loved one's performance, but what was not immediately visible is the sheer logistical problem facing every Meeting Director of a European or World Masters Athletics Championships.

The programme in Ancona incorporated 20 different disciplines including outdoor throws, road walk and a 5km cross-country, in 5-year age categories. 2,350 competitors from 41 countries whose ages range

from just 35 through to 96+ and who between them had entered a staggering 6,018 events, flocked in as the doors opened at 07.00 and were scheduled to close at 22.00.

Hordes of friendly young volunteers marshalled competitors; answered their questions and supplied them with hot drinks at just €1 and you could buy a cooked meal for €7. Accommodation was a problem as some competitors were billeted well out of town, others had no difficulty finding secure onsite parking space for their campervans. Another great advancement, spectators in the main hall were able to watch all the outdoor events, including the road walks and crosscountry being beamed in on the large screen. We looked enviously at the facilities.

Day 1 got off to a packed start with 76 entries in the women's pentathlon, endless heats of the 60m and 800m and in glorious sunshine the discus, javelin, hammer and weigh throw on the adjacent outside track. Technical cracks soon appeared however when the 3rd event in the pentathlon was held outside in an adjoining tent where the shot scraped the much too low ceiling; the men's pentathlon would follow the next day and the shot put specialists were yet to appear. The British sprinters excelled, virtually all getting through the 60m preliminaries. The packed stadium rose to Mark Finlay's 6.97sec clocking in the third of five heats in the M35 60m, the SCVAC man had run the fastest time this year.

Day 2 saw an even larger entry in the men's pentathlon, 60m and 3000m finals and a heavy jumps programme. In the younger age groups the pentathlon had to be delayed by well over three hours when the inevitable happened, repeated shots bouncing off the ceiling brought the structure to near collapse, eventually the competition had to be held in the main hall but only after the scheduled events had finished. One of those badly affected was the EMA Vice President and a member of the Organising Committee at the last Championships in Torun, Jerzy Krauze, competing in the M50 group. The lack of information given to those affected was unacceptable. 18 of the 143 starters failed to complete their events. M45 Mattias Sunneborn's 4113pts World Record is even more meritorious but the 1996 Atlanta Olympics long jumper has experienced many different championships. Fortunately the Refreshment tent remained open but it was a long tiring day for athletes and Officials.

The backlog cause more problems in an already congestion schedule, finalist in the 60m starting in descending age group order, found it hard to concentrate with Pool A of the W45 women's triple jump going slap, slap off the boards close to their right and rapturous cheers for a brilliant pole vault dominated by Italians on their left. At the Finish Line, Pool B triple jumpers and an age group in the pentathlon were corralled between their high jumps. It did not faze the much inform M70 Glyn Sutton however as the Welshman added the 60m World Record (8.09sec) to his growing collection, nor Tony Bowman who took the M80 race. Our oldest athlete, Charles Eugster, has to contend with a possé of Pressmen and Photographers, here it was even more exciting as he had a strong opponent but he managed to retain his M95 crown.






Pat Logan swept to victory in the M55 dash and BMAF vests were prominent in all sprint finals. After scorching the boards with his 6.97sec heat and 6.99semi, Mark Finlay strode to a 6.95 win. Tam Ossai dominated the M40 sprint and Jason Carty the M45 race. Making their first appearance at these Championships British sprinters dominated the W35 final with the European title going to Welsh Masters member Joanne Frost in 7.93 followed by Claire Spurway, SCVAC, 7.96, Samantha Bickley-Vaile 4th and the Harrogate based Naana Adusei 8th Iris Holder set a British W75 record in a nippy 10.72sec.

Caroline Powell had a brilliant Championship despite seeing her eight year old W50 400m World Record fall to Maryvonne Icarre of France, this superb W60 SWVAC member won all before her; she took the baton metres down in the relay closing the gap to almost winning on the line.

Frenchman Nils Portemer narrowly failed to clear 2m in the M40 high jump, M50 Steve Linsell came in at 1.65m just finishing out of the medals on 1.77m. Irie Hill defended her W45 European pole vault clearing 3.40m, W60 Sue Yeomans had 0.30m to spare over her rivals and the remarkable 63-year old German Wolfgang Ritte with his devoted followers, cleared 4.02m, Alan Williams picked up the bronze. Opting out of the 60m, Swansea Harrier Glyn Price concentrated on winning the M50 title with a 4.10m clearance.



Rachel Burns, NMAC, made her first appearance at a European Masters Championships a golden one racing to a decisive 10.00.27sec W35 3000m victory. Joanne Locker missed out in 4th. Pat Gallagher also struck gold in the W70 race and Ros Tabor won the first of her Championships haul of 3 gold and 2 silver medals in the W65 race. Some athletes said they found the dry warm air difficult to cope with. Ben Revnolds, VAC had a convincing win in the 21-strong M50 race (9.13.90sec) after leading all the way. Simon Anderson, who had run a qualifying 2.10.51 sec 800m heat the previous day, stayed in contention throughout putting in a fast last lap just getting caught on the line for the silver by the Italian Carporale 9.14.48 to 9.14.77sec. The Plymouth man had a busy and successful Championship as he headed up the 28-strong 1500m and 800m field after the heats: placed 9th in an elbowing 800m final won in 2.07.80 by the Italian D'Agostino from the Belgian Marc Neefs in 2.08.06, and went on to take the European 1500m crown (4.20.60) on Saturday.

Outside the Field event competitors got some early season throws in as the midday sun sent the temperature up to 20°C. Steve Whyte finished 3rd M50

despite whacking the discus into the net a few times. Mark Wiseman claimed the M45 gold and medals flowed in from the Weight Throw. By Day 3 early morning mist hung over the Port city, the temperature dropped



marginally but the British throwers had a very successful Championships. The various age groups shot putt competition was brought into the main hall and slotted in when time allowed, usually very late evening!

At the end of Day 3, the qualifiers for the 200m final the following afternoon had been decided after lively heats and semis in what is traditionally the most heavily subscribed event, over 600 had entered. The SWVAC's All-rounder Ian Allan wrote himself into the history books when drawn in Lane 4 of the first heat of the M50 200m, the athlete in Lane 5 beside him, Naim Malazezi from Kosovo, is the first athlete to compete for that new Nation at any international athletics championships. Their only other international appearance was in Judo.

Medals were hard to come by in the younger age categories 800m finals. After running so well in the Masters Invitational 800m at the IAAF Championships in Portland just a week earlier, Karen Brooks showed no sign of jetlag easily taking the W55 title as did Ireland's

M60 World Record holder, Joe Gough, who lost out to Dave Wilcock in Portland by a fraction. Steve Baldock, who had run such a well-judged race in the semis, finished 3rd M45 and it was bronze also for M55 Ludwig Ramsey. Ian Snow, Bruce Hendrie and Mike Mann all hit top form right on cue making the final in the older groups. Belgrave Harrier Zoe Doyle in her first international missed out on a W35 medal in a race won by Ireland's Katherine Neely in 2.09.04. W65 Ros Tabor and Nancy Hitchmough finished 1 and 2, Pat Gallagher, back to form after injury, won her W70 1500/3000m and was 2nd in the 800m. Also making a successful return was EVAC's Eva Osborne, taking the W75 title ahead of Betty Stacey 3rd and the versatile W80 Anne Martin, claimed a new British W80 record (4.07.36sec), one of many the every improving octogenarian achieved at the 6-day Championships.

Allowing up to 38 walkers on the track together inevitably resulted in some bumping and barging. Peter Boszko came to a halt in the first 5m after losing a shoe, he did extraordinarily well to work through the large field to finish 8th overall. Ian Richards soon hit the front to win the M65 title.



British Masters hurdlers reach more finals and win more major International individual medals than any other

section of British athletics. Only four out of our 21 failed to advance to the final, Carole Filer was by then carrying an injury, Jody Ward had finished 7th in the W35 pentathlon, Peter Benedickter is better known over 400mH and Andrew Webb is not far short of 70. The haul of individual titles here was remarkable, with Joe Appiah setting a M45 8.35sec European record and Susan Frisby a W55 European 9.80sec record. Mensah Elliott taking the M35 title (7.97) from Liam Collins (8.09), Donald Brown winning the M50, Neil Tunstall making a welcome return to international Championships, was 8th and I have never known Tennyson James to miss the Podium, a decisively M55 winner here. Two of our most durable hurdlers, M65 Tony Wells on the comeback trail, finished 3rd and Barry Ferguson was out of the medals here in 6th while Yorkshire man Tony Bowman made light work of the M80 barriers to win in 11.24sec. After a 9.65sec W35 semi Samantha Bickley-Vaile was slower in her final finishing 5th. Sarah Burke was also faster in her W40 preliminary, 9.76, getting 8th in the final. Jacqui Brett placed 4^{th.} Jane Horder won a W50 silver medal behind Susan Frisby with Gaye Clarke 4th. Emily McMahon made a welcome and golden return to international competition, taking the W65 title in 11.63, Jean Fail was 4th.

Heats were necessary in the M35-M60 1500m dominated by the Spanish and Italians; when six of the 21 entries did not show up for the M45 group, they ran A and B races from which David Cowlishaw emerged with the silver medal behind Angel Balague, Spain, Andrew Mitchell 6th and Mark Champion 13th. Contrastively, the younger women's races were not well supported with 5.05.86 good enough to take the W40 race and Lucy Elliott's super fast 4.43.54sec W50 win would have given her any of the 35-45 titles.

British records were broken in the horizontal jumps by W60 Carole Filer, W/M75 Iris Holder and Anthony Treacher, and in the high jump by evergreen M80 Prof. Tony Crocker who cleared 1.24m to write himself into the history book. Carole Filer had already notched up 4408pts in the Pentathlon for a W60 European Record. The Shot Putters were also in record form despite the technical hassle with M50 John Nicholas and M75 John Watts reaching out to new boundaries. Caroline Marler broke Riet Jonker's 2009 W65 European 400m Record running 73.57 just ahead of Ros Tabor. Two further Records went in the M70 relay, inevitable with Terry Bissett, Jim Smith, Glvn Sutton and Vic Novell in the team; they knocked almost a second off the 2011 European record, running 1.55.51sec. The W75 quartet of Mollie Mills, Eva Osborne, Betty Stacey and Dorothy Fraser took an amazing 24sec off the 2011 World Record held by Canada. Disaster struck the M35 team on the 2nd leg when Gavin Stevens pulled a hamstring as he challenged the leading French team on the bend. Richard Beardsell handed over behind the Frenchman Jimmy Melford on the first leg and with Tom Bolan-Ashford and Liam Collins to run; they would certainly have got a medal.



Team Managers Archie Jenkins and Lynn Marr also managed to run in the 5km 5-lap vermicelli-like crosscountry course adjacent to the outdoor track that included two short sharp hills. With the return to international competition of Julian Critchlow, taking the individual M55 silver here and leading Paul Jeggo and Steven Doxey to 2nd team, it was gold and silver team medals at last for regulars Steven and Wendy Doxey as the W55 team, led home by Susie Tawney 6th, Sue James moving down and Wendy 16th they won the team title. Others to get individual medals were W40 Claire Thompson, W50 Susan Ridlev and W75 Eve Osborne. we picked up several team awards. The M35-40 race had no British entry, but what a race to watch! It was won by M40 De La Fuento from Spain in 15.58 just 2sec ahead of the M35 Italian Lugi Del Buono, with another Italian, M40 Landi 3rd in 16.08sec.

The Dutch delegation was not able to confirm Apeldoorn as the venue for the next Indoor in 2018 pending the outcome of Elections. The 285 British competitors returned home not only with their medals but with fond memories of Ancona and a friendly Championship despite the technical problems.



ell on the wonderful new green track in Portland in the United States. Our Master Athletes performed to the top of their abilities to succeed in the World Indoor Championships. Whilst team GB could only accomplish a silver and two bronze medals from our total team.

Our two Athletes in both Masters 800 metre races achieved a terrific first and third ! How did the BBC react to this success, well hardly at all - an after-thought at the very best.

Pride of place went to Dave Wilcox who won the Men's race in 2:15.90 (just outside the British Record). In a close finish which saw Joe Gough of Ireland throw himself at the finish in a desperate attempt to win. He did not, as David won by just 11/100's of a second.

Helene Douay of France won the Women's race, but Karen Brooks battled through the race to register a great third.

KIM COLLINS who will be 40 on the 5th April, ran a semi-final time of 6.49 but could only finish 8th in the Senior 60 metre Final, whilst Ruth Beitia of Spain finished with the Silver Medal with 1.96 in the Women's High Jump, an early 37th Birthday Present for the 1st of April.

wo great days of well organised Athletics at what is now the home of British Masters Indoor events.

However, there did not appear to be as many records as usual, and injuries and absences did reduce what Maurice Doogan had stated was a record attendance.



The meeting started with a bang! With Leicester based Susan Frisby W55 setting a new European Record in the 60 Hurdles with 9.89. Susan was delighted with her first ever Regional record and with the efficiency the application was completed. Emily McMahon now W65 then obliged with a new British Record of 11.46 over the sticks.

Tony Bowman asked me via this report, to thank the many who advised and helped him combat his AF problems. He was back to his very best setting a M80 60 metres World Hurdles Record of 10.86 knocking almost a quarter of a second of the currently listed best.



The 60 metres flat produced the closest finish with Kirstin King and Angela Bates in the W50, with the electronic finish team going to thousands of a second, before awarding the race to Kirstin.

The W35 was also very tight with former Midland Counties Champion Claire Spurway, edging out World Masters Long Jump Champion Jo Frost by 2/100's whilst Lesley Owusu, who still stands 11th on the UK all-time 400 metres with her 52.15, set in Fayetteville in 2001 was third.



Mark Findlay who was a European Junior Gold and Bronze medallist back in 1997, came though strongly to take the M35 short sprint from Mensah Elliott and Liam Collins. Whilst Esmei Ossai matched his time of 7.05 in the M40's. Tom Phillips our top notch photographer won his first British title in the M60's. "Have you ever viewed his mountain photography? In a word "awesome". The 400 metres produced three British Records, Kathleen Stewart went faster than her unratified



performance of 2015, to record 1:27.12. Anne Martin now 80 recorded 1:48.97 to fill an empty slot in the list of records. Double Olympian Eric Shirley, won the M85 in a new British Record time of 1:40.37. Talking to this amazing gentleman , brought back to my memory his tremendous run of 56 years ago , when he won the Steeplechase of the year against the World's best in a race before a crowd of 50,000 people at London's White City stadium his time of 8:47.0 would place him sixth on last year's Senior men's Steeplechase rankings.



Jo Locker (W35), Lucy Elliott (W50) had good wins in the 1500, Susie Tawny then had to fight all the way down the short straight to win by 0.40's, and Anne Martin filled another line on the W80 record list. In the men's event

Simon Anderson had a good win from Guy Bracken in the M50.

David Wilcox won the M60 race from David Oxland, prior to his trip to the USA for IAAF Wold Masters race.



The 200 metres started the programme on the second day with a win for back to competition Julia Hubbard in the W40's. Joanna Flowers completed the sprint double in the W45's, as did Kirstin King, Averil McClelland, and Helen Godsell. Moira West matched these performances setting a new British Record in the W65's with 31.98. As did Anne Martin in the W80. Multi-talented Liam Collins won the M35 event in 23.11, World Champion Esmei Ossai was faster 22.69 in the M40's.


Giuseppe Minetti born in London to Italian parents won the M45 for his first title. Third in last year's World Indoor Pat Logan repeated his win from last year.

All-rounder Diana Norman won the W40 800metres, Bernie Pritchett won a middle distance double (She also won the 3000 metres latter in the day) so three out of three has got to be good!.

Lucy Elliott did not defend her British cross country title preferring win all three track races 800-1500-3000 metres over the two days, all in majestic style.

Three British records were achieved in the 800 metres, Pat Gallagher in the W70's 3:16.89, Anne Martin in the W80 4:15.26, and Eric Shirley M85 4:05.38. Middle distance doubles were achieved by Aaron Brown M35, Cathal McLaughlin, Dave Wilcox and Ian Snow. Whilst Scott West and John Batchelor doubled over 1500 / 3000 metres.

There were many fine performances in the field Gintaras Varanauskas had the best clearance at 1.80 in the M40 High Jump Competition, whilst World and European Champion Ayamba Akim cleared 1.60 in the W40.



Jemma Eastwood was the best of the Women Vaulters with a clearanceat 3.10. Sue Yeomans was close to success with another World Record attempt.

Ian Parkinson achieved the highest clearance of 4.30 in the competition, Chris Mills and the now 50 year old Mark Johnson who recently increased his British Record to 4.64, finished with 4.20 on the day.

The Horizontal Jumps produced a British Record for Worcester based Iris Holder with a 6.81 Triple Jump. One Athlete missing from the weekends competitions, with an injury was our new World Record Holder Carole Filer who has set World Records for the W60 60 Hurdles and Pentathlon.

I congratulated her on her latest reported Long Jump a massive 4.86 at the Inter Area meeting, only to be told it she thought it was incorrect and was around 4.30. The Field Card has since been checked and the result altered to 4.36.


There was just one record in the Shot with 11.27 to John Watts in the M75 event.

On checking the Records I was surprised to see that we are listing both records pre April 1999 / Post April 1999 specifications for the Women's Javelin. Totally bizarre as the pre April implement can't be purchased and cannot legally be used in competition, so just how can it be improved?

There were two British Records in the Outdoor Weight Anne Martin in the W80 with 8.57, and Steve Whyte with a massive 21.20 in the M50

Francisco Reis also achieved a new British Record with 13:57.94 in the M55 Walk.

ollowing on from a winter of record rainfall and a night of further rain, our expectations of the ground conditions on arriving at Bath University were surprisingly much different to what we had first envisaged. The National Trust owned fields were surprisingly well drained with conditions good under foot, therefore providing some great cross country running. Although unavoidably clashing with other major events on the same day, our total entries were still very pleasing with over 200 signing up for the day's competition.

The first Race. All Women and Men 65+ (approx. 6k)



Bristol & West's Nicola Brookland took an early lead and maintained it unchallenged throughout the race to lead the field home and receive her 40+ Gold Medal. The second woman home was also a 40+, Coventry Godiva's Paula Richardson, travelling down on her birthday to compete. Third overall placer, Christine Lathwell (Stopsley Striders) did just enough to hold off challenger, Cirencester's Holly Tugwell by a mere 2 seconds to obtain her 35+ Gold medal, with Holly receiving Silver.

Jane Wassell from the Stroud & District club had a very good run finishing amongst her younger counterparts in 6th place overall to claim her 45+ Gold, with Northern

Ireland's Debbie Matchett representing the Ballydrain Harriers Club, just 20 seconds down, to receive her 45+ Silver. It was also 20 seconds that separated the 50+



Women's age group, with Maureen McCarthy from the West Suffolk Club finishing in front of her club team mate Christine Anthony for her Gold Medal for a club 1-2. Amongst their female opposition the first of the 65+ men were finishing, with Des Michael (Barnet & Dist.) pursuing a close battle with Luton AC's Alan Dagleish, with Des eventually receiving the Gold.

It was worth Ruth Perioli (Lagan Valley) making the long trip over from Northern Ireland as she successfully took home the 55+ Gold Medal, with Tipton's Penelope Barber receiving the Silver. Maggie Statham was amongst the finishing younger age groups and was also battling with the men to obtain her 60+ age group Gold, the leading 70+ male, Geoff Newton (Tadworth) was in close attendance. Geoff securing his Gold from twice previous winner, Welshman Gordon Orme (Carmarthen)

The women's 65+ age group was once again contested with the friendly battle of the super vets Rugby's Angela Copson and Dulwich's Ros Tabor, with Angela taking the honours. Yuko Gordon (N Herts) was a close finisher for the Bronze Medal. David Moorekite led the 75+ men home with Exmouth's Ray Elston battling with Welshman Brian Gough (Pontypridd) for their Silver and Bronze. Brian just edging it for his Silver by a mere 3 seconds. Dot Fellows (Cannock) clearly led the 70+ women for her Gold Medal with Cambridge's Mary Holm taking home her 75+ Gold Medal. Scotland's Walter McCaskey

contested with the North East's Ian Barnes all the way for the 80+ Medal's with Ian eventually earning the Gold.

The team medal results gave us a real headache on the day, mainly due to the (on the day) requests of down aging. These requests had to be manually calculated from the results and therefore prolonged the medal



results and presentation. It also resulted in some provisional errors on the day and also a delay with some teams leaving without being presented with their medals. This situation is not acceptable and is an area that I have to review and correct for future championships. Two of the women's sections produced some close contests for the medals. The closest of all was within the W45+ age group, where Brighton & Hove City AC triumphed for Gold by a mere one second over Bristol & West AC. On aggregate scoring it proves that every second counts!

Julian Critchlow (Watford Harriers) led home, current Welsh Champion Ifan Lloyd by 20 seconds for his Gold.

It was pleasing to see Brighton & Hove City's Nigel Gates return to competitive running after a lapse of many years. Nigel returned to winning ways taking his Gold medal within the 60+ age group, with Salford's prolific Stan Owen receiving the silver.
