

Steve Parker and Tim Dolder of Opus Restructuring were appointed to Hastings Printing Company on 3rd August and the firm ceased trading the same day, with all 33 employees made redundant.

The circa £3m turnover firm was established in 1915, and had been owned by the Knoll family since 1978, with a number of family members working at the business.

It had developed a specialist role such as posters and programmes for the entertainment industry, alongside magazines and corporate literature.

Opus said that 50% of the firm's sales were in the highly-competitive magazine printing market, and Hastings had found it difficult to compete due to a lack of investment in the latest printing technology.

The Editor of Masters Athletics is looking for a new printer, hopefully the printed Edition of this Magazine will not be delayed.

Following a review of Maurice.Doogan's suspension from Masters Athletics, the WMA have determined that the charges levelled against him, and the subsequent finding of guilt, should be set-aside. As such, he will be resuming his role with the British Masters Athletic Federation with immediate effect.

Although the WMA have reserved the right to look at the circumstances surrounding his suspension again. Maurice has sought all documentary evidence relating to the initial charges brought against him. Should the WMA elect to take any further action against him, charges will be vigorously defended.

ARTHUR KIMBER

Edward Betts set a new World M45 400 metres Hurdles record, whilst competing in Spain on the 9th July.

Here is the result first Lander Gil Oiarzabal SM 53.62; second Mikel Calle Navarro SM 54.07; third Edward Betts M45 54.92;

Ed moved to Spain in 2003, and lives and races in Oviedo, North Spain. He is still a member and club record of Thames Valley Harriers, he is their 400H holder (50.49 in 1997)..

He came to Spain after receiving an offer to run for F.C. Barcelona, for whom he completed for two years. He then I joined the University of Oviedo, where he still coaches, trains and races.

Last year was his first ever world Masters in Lyon, where he finished second in the final, running 55.34 off hardly any training at the age of 44. This gave him the motivation, that if he could stay injury free he could run close to the World Record for Men 45.

What he has learnt is that he cannot do as much Hurdling now due his calf injuries, and to make this achievement more surprising was the fact that this year he probably only hurdled in training once. Ed believes he can still go quicker and maybe injuryfree he can run better than 54.3.

Due to family and work commitments making it back to race in the in the UK is difficult.

He plans to see how things are for the Denmark's European championships next year, but the main goal is to run in Malaga's World championship in 2018.

We set a good example to our children/grandchildren, we inspire those who would like "to have a go" at competitive sport but feel that they may be too old. Now we are the active competitive parents of Olympians. Watching the drama unfold on the track and on the field in Rio, you may well have spotted several Masters athletes. The oldest was the Spanish 50km walker Jesus Angel Garcia aged 46, one of 11 Masters in the 48-strong Spanish team. He finished a very credible 20th in 3.54.29sec. The mother of Nafissatou Thiam the Heptathlon gold medallist, is Daniéle Denisty the current European Masters Athletics W45 Heptathlon gold medallist in Izmir where she scored a total of 5043pts to beat Ireland's Geraldine Finnigan. She is now in the W50 age category.

Another Mother/Daughter team and making her fourth appearance for the Cz Republic at the Olympics was 35-year old Barbora Špotakova. She won the javelin in Beijing and London and took the bronze medal in Rio with a throw of 64.80m. She was the only CZE athletic medallist in Rio. She was at the European Masters Athletics Championships in Zittau in 2012 to watch her mother Ludmila win the W60 javelin title.

The men's hammer was won with a sub 80m throw, lower than the current WMA M40 World Record. The silver medallist is Ivan Tsikhan from Belarus, an M40.

In the women's high jump four cleared 1.97m, two are 37-year old's, Ruth Beitia who won with no failures, and Chaunte Lowe, USA who finished 4th.

One of the best performance by a Masters athlete (note TV Commentators referred to them as "older athletes") came in the 4 x 400m when Chris Brown, who will be 38 in October, took over on the last leg for the Bahamas bringing them home third in their fastest time this year 2.58.49sec. His split time must have been in the 44-sec mark. He is now the first man in history to win four Olympic medals in the 4 x 400m, taking his total to two bronze, one silver and gold at the 2012 London Olympics. BRIDGET CUSHEN

Eligibility: BMAF Area Club members only, UKA affiliation mandatory Individual entry, no team selection necessary Entry fee £10 online by BMAF OpenTrack only **Awards:** Trophy for the wining Area Team, certificates for scoring runners in the winning team

The teams will be scored by points for 4 runners in M35 and M45 categories, 3 runners in M55+ and all women's categories.

Annual General Meeting

An increased number of members stayed on after the conclusion of the first day's events during the Track & Field Championships to attend the AGM on 17th. It is always nice to see a good turnout and to know that members are keen to play an active part in the future of the Federation despite their need to refuel and get some rest.

The Reports from all Officers reflected on a very successful year in all disciplines. Mel James reported that entries for both the Cross-Country Relays and the main Championships were up on the previous season. Recording his thanks to Robert Fox and his Long Eaton club team for their help in promoting the Relays, Mel confirmed that we have decided to make a return visit to Long Eaton on November 19th. The Cross Country Championships were promoted by the SWVAC at Bath University in March and he is looking to visiting the North West next March.

Walter Hill's report covered Road and Trail Running outlining the geographical spread of the

various races. In February a top quality Masters field competed in the 10 Mile Championships held near Poole over a challenging course, and the Olympic Park in Stratford was a popular venue for the 10km. He thanked the SWVAC, Peter Kennedy and the VAC for their help. The Road Relays in Sutton Park witnessed an increase in entries. After organising this popular event for many years, our Midland Masters AC was unable to continue and an amazing BMAF team effort ensured a successful day and a vote of confidence for 2017. He recorded his thanks to so many people who made this happen under what could be best described as difficult circumstances.

The 5K at Horwich saw stability in entries and the recommendation of chip timing ensured we avoided the difficulties in 2015. The Mile races in Cardiff were also popular. The multi terrain Championships in June moved to the North Downs 30K and thanks to Trevor Edgley who assisted him, the event was an outstanding success. Next year we return to the same venue and this is one race you need to think about entering. It is best described as a first class experience. All 4 races had excellent coverage in Athletics Weekly which we all appreciate.

The final Championship before the AGM was the Isle Of Man Marathon on the 14 August. BMAF members dominated this event and he can only recommend it for the future. In his opinion it is one of the best Marathons in Great Britain and Northern Ireland. Thanks once again to the IoM Masters and Peter Kennedy who assisted him on the day.

Olympian Ian Richards covering race walking, said it has been another year of excellent achievement by a small band of race walkers who have attended international Masters Championships while the programme of domestic Championships has continued to provide good age group competitions over all distances to enable every walker in the UK over the age of 35 to compete against their peers. Overall numbers of Masters walkers has not changed much over the year with very few 35 to 50 year olds. Meeting the technical requirements of the event remains the biggest deterrent. Before the introduction of the straight leg from point of contact to the upright position, runners would often switch to walking when they started to encounter knee problems. Today it is not uncommon for walkers to switch to running!

Despite being Meet Director, Maurice Doogan managed to attend, reporting that 808 competitors had entered this weekend and despite more entries and a slight increase in entry fees, Championship losses are substantial. The Official only get basic pay; we have to bring them in from Scotland etc. they need overnight accommodation. Questions were asked from the floor why he does not try to get local Officials and asking if Maurice Doogan is the Track & Field Secretary this weekend. The Chairman said Maurice is currently Co-opted on the Executive.

Questions also arose from Peter Duhig's report covering international Championships. Peter said 283 members have entered for Perth. The Executive agreed to provide more information for athletes in preparation should they be randomly chosen for an Anti-Doping Test. Please check on our website for updated information on this.

BMAF IT Manager, Peter Kennedy's comprehensive report outlined the move from AREG to ReportLab; the new membership and competition entry system called BMAF OpenTrack, the cost of which represents a considerable saving to the BMAF and its Clubs over the cost of using AREG for all Clubs or continuing the inconvenience of only some Clubs using the system. Seven of the area Clubs also now allow their members to pay their membership online by debit/credit card and four of the Clubs use it for online entry to their maior There were some teething championships. problems with payments in the first month due to communications problems with the banks, but since then there have been no lost/duplicated payments or other issues.

He said the system has now been in operation for nearly nine months and although all the major functions are in place, there is still a long list of improvements to address. We have to be patient with this, since we share the development resources available rather than having any dedicated support staff. This is a consequence of paying for IT services on a usage basis, rather than as bearing the costs of development. In the remainder of the year we will address the following key changes:

- Automated checks on UKA registration and enforcement of the UKA rules of competition for registration
- Enhanced checks on British nationality due to revised WMA rules on eligibility.

Alex Rowe (NMAC) is helping Peter.

Questions were also asked on Kevin Dillon's Vice-Chair Policy & International Affairs, Report which alluded to the cancellation of the Clothing Contract and the switch to the new Supplier,

Ridgeway Textiles. The latter were at the Championships and official BMAF athletic apparel is readily available. A link will be on our website.

After twenty two years on the Executive and with his wife Pat helping out in other capacities, Danny Herman delivered his final Report as Treasurer. Handing over a healthy Balance Sheet to newly elected fellow NMAC member, Daniel Upton, the Meeting thanked him for his loyal service and welcomed Daniel.

Chris Jager keeps our 300 Club going and with increasing venue hire costs etc, this is one source of income for us as we get no official help and I would encourage members to sign up and you have a good chance of bagging a prize.

All outgoing Officers were re-elected, Maurice Doogan was elected Track & Field Secretary and Arthur Kimber was nominated a Life Vice President for his contribution to our sport.

Club Championships

I was privileged to attend two of our Club Championships earlier this year, the South West in Exeter in June and the combined SCVAC/VAC in Kingston in August. The SWVAC have wonderful facilities at Exeter track. Both were well supported. Some Open entries added to the excellent local competition; Championships records were established as families socialised and Club Championships remain as popular as ever

World Masters Athletics Championships in Perth

Where the 2020 Championships will be held will be decided at the General Assembly in Perth and it could be a difficult decision for your Delegates to decide as the two Bidders, Toronto and Gothenburg, hosted the first Masters gathering in 1975 and 1977 and did a perfect job. The five BMAF Delegates are Arthur Kimber, Ian Richards, Maurice Doogan, Mike May and myself. We would like to have an indication of our members' preference, let us know, although much will depend on what facilities the Bidders offers, transport, accommodation etc.

Masters in the Olympics


No doubt you would have noticed that the Hammer gold medal was won with a throw below the current M40 World Record and that the field included a few Masters. I lost count of the number of 40-plus competitors – Kim Collins, Bernard Lagat who lowered his own M40 5000m World Record finishing 5th in 13.06.78sec. The USA's other 41-year old, Meb Keflezighi, was seen to stop during the marathon but came through to finish 20th in the 2.16.46sec. The 46-year old Spanish Jesus Angel Garcia, finished a very credible 20th in 3.54.29sec from an 80-strong field in the gruelling 50km walk in weather conditions described by some as worse than Beijing. A record that went largely unnoticed is that of Chris Brown who turns 38 next month, running the final leg for the Bahamas 4 x 400m relay team to take them into bronze medal position, he ran 44.54sec and becomes the first man in history to win four Olympic medals in the 4 x 400m, taking his total to two bronze, one silver and gold at the 2012 London Olympics.

Jo Pavey may have been the fulcrum of British Press attention but there were other Masters women not just competing, but on the podium. The 48-strong Spanish team included eleven Masters and their first ever female Olympic Track & Field medal was won by their 37-year old high jumper, Ruth Beitia, who took the gold on the count back and became the oldest woman in history to win this event. Jessica Ennis-Hill's nemesis, 21-year old Belgian Nafissatou Thiam, is the daughter of Daniéle Denisty the current European Masters Athletics W45 Heptathlon gold medallist. She scored a total of 5043pts to beat Ireland's Geraldine Finnigan in Izmir in 2014 and is now in the W50 age category. 35-year old double Olympic javelin champion, Špotakova making Barbora her fourth appearance for CZE, won the bronze medal in Rio with a throw of 64.80m. She came to the European Masters Athletics Championships to watch her mother Ludmila win the W60 javelin title

The most remarkable Masters athlete in Rio however is Ly Nary. She was rescued as a nine year old by the Red Cross as the Khmer Rouge overrun her country and fostered in France. She went on to study Medicine, returning to Cambodia to help the less fortunate. The 44-year old ran a sub 3-hour marathon in 2015 but finished 133rd and last in Rio in 3.20.20sec. As greed and avarice creeps into international sport at all levels, how refreshing it is that there are those of us who compete just for the love of it, and of course we are the Masters.

CONRAD PHILLIPS

Sadly we hear that Conrad Phillips passed away recently , having lost his battle with Cancer.

Conrad was 76 and had won several British Masters sprint titles in the 1990's and in the first decade of this century.

He was Lead Coach to Greg Dunson, and contributed to "Masters Athletics", and he will be missed by his many friends in the Sport.

LEO CARROLL

Leo Carroll, for many years one of Wirral Athletic Club's leading runners, passed away suddenly in June after a short illness.

In pre-veteran days Leo had a highly successful career as a marathon runner,

winning the Northern marathon title three times and having a best time of 2 hours 17 minutes and 12 seconds. He won the Road Runners Club Championship in 1965 with a time of 2 hours 21 minutes and 38 seconds shortly after finishing third in the Inter Counties 20 miles' race in 1 hour 44 minutes and 12 seconds behind Heatley and Adcocks.

When he became a Veteran in 1979 Leo became an integral part of the highly successful Wirral team of that time, leading the Club to four victories in the annual Bruges 25 kilometres event. His best placing was in 1982 when he was fourth to Tim Johnston in 81 minutes 04 seconds.

In 1981 Carroll won the European 20 kilometres title in Riccione, Italy being rewarded with a huge cup and a real Gold medal.

Also in 1981 Carroll finished third in the B.V.A.F cross country behind Taff Davies and Jim Alder, probably his best cross country performance.

On the track Leo won the M.45 5000m in 1985 at Wolverhampton.

In 1982 Carroll took over as Secretary of Wirral A.C., a post he held for thirty-four years.

For services to athletics and Cross country Leo Carroll was elected President of the E.C.C.A. in 2007, and in 2015/16 he became President of the North of England A.A.

A busy man who fitted in his athletics achievements around his career as a particle physicist, Leo was a Senior Lecturer at Liverpool University. He also attended Harvard where he ran the Boston Marathon. He fitted in many unsung European races when he spent time in Geneva working on the Hadron Collider.



MEET OUR MEMBERS

TOM PHILLIPS PHOTOGRAPHER AND ATHLETE





Readers of Masters Athletics will have been impressed for a good few years now by the world-class standard of the photographs that Tom Phillips captures for us. Tom will also be well known to the track racing community as a sprint star, medallist in National, European and World events. Others may never have met him, and some might be curious to know more, so we've made him subject of one of our occasional athlete profiles. TOM in interview;

"I've been a sprinter pretty much since primary school days in South East London. I was a kid who could run a bit, and I went on to a secondary school with a good athletics tradition. I joined Blackheath Harriers, as it was then, aged 14 in 1968. I've realised I'm not long off 50 years of membership with them.


I was a fairly good senior athlete, by the standards of club athletics in the 1970s, racing in National and Southern League, and that kind of thing. Sadly, my diaries and souvenirs of those days were lost when a flat I lived in got flooded. It was way, way before the advent of the internet, of course! I ducked under 22 seconds for 200m a couple of times, and had a 100m best of 10.7 something. I remember racing against Allan Wells when he was still basically just a longjumper, amongst other "names" from the time. In the early 1980s I had an accident that badly damaged my back, and put an end to my sprinting - or so I thought! For several years it was far too unstable for running and training. I did eventually get into the jogging boom and ran what, for a sprinter, still look to me like decent times for 10k and half marathons. I've never run a full marathon on the roads, but took part in some of the early South Downs Marathons, at the goading of the late Cliff Temple.

I'd taken up mountain walking and climbing in my teens. I was lucky to be introduced to the Italian Dolomites by a dear and now long-departed friend. Imagine my joy, several years later, at having the opportunity to live and work there on several occasions. Even better, I had a UK job that gave me headroom and (often unpaid) leave opportunities for this, and opportunity to be a leader for mountain hut touring parties in "my mountains". I've walked and climbed in most of Europe's mountain areas over the years. It was while doing stuff like that that I began to gain a reputation for my photography.

A chance encounter in Oxford Street with a former running pal led to me taking very tentative steps back on to the track in about 1999. In spite of my back problem, climbing and walking had kept me in good shape. They had even helped with my rehab. I was a regular gym user by then. It remains one of life's great joys to have set off on the third leg of a Kent Masters League 4x100m relay, and to find that I could still run fast!

I suffered the agonies of injury familiar to most new Masters! It wasn't until 2006 that I felt up to entering the BMAF indoors, held not long before that year's WMA Indoor Championships in Linz. Here was this 52year-old bloke who almost no one in the British squad knew, who turns up and wins a 60m bronze medal in the British, and then a silver medal in the relay at his first World event! I was, of course, joining one of the best sprint squads in the world, in its toughest age group. On more than one occasion (e.g. Ljubljana in 2008) I made the finals of both the 100m and 200m at a big championship, yet still only got to be reserve for the relay squad!

I hit what, for me, counts as a purple patch in 2008/9. winning double gold in the European Masters Games, and getting 5th place in the WMA Lahti M55 100m. The nearest I've come to an individual WMA medal was in Lahti too, where I lost bronze in the 200m by 0.02 of a second to a Canadian who literally fell at my feet as we crossed the line together. I do cherish my WMA and EMA relay golds, though. I still regard my best Masters performances to date as being my 4x200m third leg in the Indoor final in Clermont Ferrand in 2008, and the lead-off leg I ran for the 4x100m squad in Lyon in 2015. That hurt! I took a retirement deal from "real" work in 2011 and I'm now quite a busy freelance photographer with some great clients (and always looking for more, too!) My work covers a wide range, including landscape photography, which remains my first love, despite the volume of track and field stuff I shoot in a typical year! For fun, I have also amassed a very big portfolio of pictures from things as diverse as classic motorsport and Morris dancing. I'm also blessed to have time these days to do a little painting and pen and ink work.



I'm holding my second photographic exhibition in Maidstone through November 2016. My first, in 2014, was a general show, described by someone as my "pre-retrospective"! The new one is exclusively of landscape work shot along the River Medway, close to home. I'm looking forward to it a lot. The show will include some of my paintings, as well as photos.



The match again provided performances of a high standard and competition between eight area clubs. MMAC won the men's match, narrowly beating SCVAC, 312 points to 304, but SCVAC took the women's match by a larger margin from MMAC, 295.5 to 264.5, ensuring that SCVAC won the combined match. Ten CBPs were set, two by Carole Filer, one British record, in the high jump where Steve Linsell equalled the British Record, and one British best performance in the 2000m. walk by race Anne Wheeler.

In the men's match MMAC had only five victories on the track, a 2000m.walk double, M35 Mark Williams, 9:33.78 and M50 Dwane Butterly, 10:17.77, a double in the 3000m, M35 Rob Keal, with a sub nine-minute clocking, 8:59.65, to win by over 30 seconds and M60 David Oxland, 10:41.17, and they took the M50 4x100m relay. They scored more heavily in the field, in the throws with a clean sweep by the M50s, discus by Kevin Brown, 47.72, javelin by Kevin Murch, 49.87, shot by Morris Fox, 15.03, and hammer by John Pearson, 56.97. Dean Storry set a CBP in winning the M35 high jump with 1.98 and Donovan Davenport won the M35 triple jump, 11.65.



For SCVAC Peter Davey got the club off to a good start with his 17.02 run to take the 110m. hurdles and the club scored heavily in the sprints, with winners M35

Joshua Wood, 11.41 and M60 Wally Franklyn, 13.44, taking the 100m. races, M35 Adam Bellis the 200m. in 23.33 and Simon Barrett, M60, 61.09 and Terry Bissett, M70, 69.98, winning the 400m. races. M60 Dave Wilcock was the only middle distance victor with 4:56.24 in the 1500m. and Chris Hobbs, also M60, took the 2000m. walk in 10:09.49. The club won three of the 4x100m. relays, M35, M60 and M70. In the throws M35 Mark Wiseman easily won the discus, 47.19, and shot, 12.25, Richard Nash took the M35 javelin, 41.42 and victories in the jumps came from M35 Ian Parkinson, 4.00 in the pole vault, Andy Lewis, 6.23 in the M35 long jump, Roger Bruck, 1.23 in the M70 high jump and Vic Novell, 4.17 in the M70 long jump.



EVAC had three winners, M35 David Brown, a fast 50.86 400m, M50 Tony Roberts a 2:13.86 800m, and M60 Geoff Tyler, shot, 12.16. M50 Tony Wright scored a double win for SWVAC, a 4:25.71 1500m. and a 9:32.22 3000m. Kevin Archer won the M60 800m. in 2:31.80 and Neil Tunstall the M50 100m. hurdles in 15.24. Paul Guest took the M50 long jump, 5.47 and Mario Lapka the M60 event with 4.70. VAC's Aaron Brown set a CPB in the M35 800m. with a fast sub two minutes clocking, 1:58.79, and also won the 1500m. in a fast 4:07.41. Richard Bloom won the M70 1500m, 5:53.92 and in the sprints Mark White the M50 400m, 56.00 and Pat Logan the M50 100m, 12.16. Dave Blunt won the M60 high jump, 1.44. M70 Glyn Sutton scored a fine double for WMAA, 100m. in 13.20 and 200m. in 27.39. Ian Broadhurst won the M60 race with 27.46 and in the field M35 Graham Holder easily won the hammer,

50.11. NMAA's Steve Linsell, M50, set a British record and CBP with a 1.77 high jump and also won the triple jump with 11.03. john Watts won the M70 shot, 11.38 and Mark Johnson the M50 pole vault with a very high 4.30.



Tony Crocker started the concept of Masters Teams competitions, with his West Midlands Veterans League and Inter Counties Championships back in the late 1970's.

In the women's match SCVAC scored heavily in both track and field. Diana Norman was outstanding in the W35 events winning on the track the 80m. hurdles, 12.61, the 800m. 2:21.17, the high jump, 1.59 and triple jump, 10.95. In the sprints newcomer Claire Spurway won the W35 200m, 25.82 and Joan Trimble, W60, the 100m, 15.64, and the club won all three 4x100m.relays, W35, W50 and W60. The W35 team of Sharon Dooley, Diana Norman, Kathryn Miles and Claire Spurway set a CBP. In the field Teresa Eades won the W50 pole vault, 2.30, Debbie McCaw the W35 shot, 9.83 and Liz Sissons W70 shot, 8.30.

MMAC compiled a substantial numbers of points in winning track events, W35 Ellena Ruddock, a 12.86 100m, W50 Jane Horder a 30.00 200m. and M50 Susan Frisby a 67.73 400m. The distance events winners included W60 international stars Angela Copson, a 5:56.81 1500m. and Nancy Hitchmough a 2:53.29 800m.



Zara Hyde Peters set a W50 800m. CBP in 2:33.87 and Caroline Dyall won the W35 2000m. walk with 11:00.33. Deborah Murch won the W50 hammer, 36.09 and Jenny Cooper the W50 discus, 30.95. W60 Carole Filer worked hard for EVAC, competing in six events and winning four, with two CBPs, long jump, 4.49 and high jump 1.35. Her other two victories came in the 200m, 30.98 and the 400m, 72.46. Monica Brown won the W50 100m, 14.06 and W35 Andrea Jenkins the hammer, 46.42 and discus, 38.47. VAC had four victories on the track, two in the 1500m, W35 Joanne Locker a 4:44.51 1500m. and W50 Lisa Webb, 5:11.22, and two in the 3000m, W35 Indoor 3000 Champion and Marathon Champion Samantha Amend, 10:29.54 and W50 Anna Garnier, 12:39.59. For WMAA Iris Holder won the 100m, 18.39 and long jump, 3.09, W70 Pat Gallagher set a CBP with her 6:48.43 1500m, and Wendy Bennett, W50, the 2000m. walk, 11:15.30. M50 Melanie Garland won two field events, long jump 4.46 and triple jump 9.09, Alison Murray won the W35 pole vault, 3.20, a CBP, Joanne Frost the W35 long jump, 5.56 and Janice Timberlake the W50 javelin, 24.51. W50 Wendy Laing took two events for NMAA, high jump, 1.45, a CBP and shot, 9.79, while W35 Clare Constable won the 400m. in 62.44.

The European 400 metres Record was achieved by Caroline Marler whose 72.37 was achieved in some style. In taking to Caroline it appears that she ran faster in Wakefield on the 11th September but was not sure of the time. However according to the Internationally acclaimed UKA Statistician Ian Hodge who was a spectator during the meeting the time was 70.89. Which unless the necessary paperwork can be produced may not stand as a record.

British Records came from Anne Martin in the 200 and 400 metres, she set a further three during the weekend in her first outdoor championships as a W80.

George Cheetham now 85 set a new British 200 metre record, and 90 year Dalbar Singh Deol did likewise in the 200 and 400 metres.

Sprint royalty in the forms of the exceptional Steve Peters and Caroline Powell, who both produced fantastic trebles in the 100/200/400. Elegance, power and grace being a feature of their running.

World Masters Champion Esmei Ossai produced the days only sub 11 second 100 metres in wining the M40 100 and backed this up with a solid 200 metre win.

MIDDLE DISTANCE:

Doubles were achieved by Jo Locker, and Irelands Anne Gilshinan. Anne had an excellent win over Coventry Godiva's Zara Hyde Peters O.B.E. In the 1,500 metres.

Fiona Matheson showed her stamina and range in winning the 800 /1,500 and Sundays 5,000 metres. She also achieved a noticeable victory over Karen Brooks who ran in the I.A.A.F 800 metres race in Portland in March.

Aaron Brown just squeezed inside two minutes in the 800, and Andrew Ridley ran a fast 4:25.11 1,500 metres.

Anne Martin added a further two British Records at the 800 and 1,500 metres.

DISTANCE:

Pam Jones set a new British Record in the W80 5,000 Metres.

Fastest times came from Paula Richardson in the W40 5,000 with 17:40.30, and Kerry Liam Wilson in the Men's event.

In the Steeplechase British Record Holder Claire Thompson was the fastest in the women's race with 7:25.96, whilst Steve Millward had the men's leading time with 10:04.68.

Lisa Kehler W45 won the 3,000 Walk in a new British Record time. Making her the fastest Walker at both 3,000 and 5,000 metres in the first three age groups.

HURDLES

Tony Bowman set a European Record in the M80 group, equaling the time he ran on the same track in the Multi-Events. The time 14.93 will go forward and all the necessary information was correct so perhaps this time the Europeans will list it. Talking to Tony he was astonished as he tripped during the race and did not expect the time to be so fast.

Jane Horder was the fastest with 13.43 over the 80 metres, however the tightest race was the M50 100 metres where Donald Brown beat Greg Dunson both given the same time of 14.74, the digital photo finish deciding in Brown's favour.

The M40 race saw Mensah Elliott speed his way to a new British Record of 14.26. That would put Mensah 13th on the years UK rankings, however our hurdles are three inches lower than those used by Senior Men.

JUMPS:

Janice Pryce set a British Record of 9.75 in the W55 Triple Jump, she has actually beaten the Record three times this season but on the previous occasions the Stadiums used did not have a wind gauge. However, this time BINGO!

Anne Martin set British record number five in the W80 Long Jump, as did 95-year-old Charles Eugster noticeably not sprinting this weekend.

Mark Johnson was the best of the Vaulters this time clearing 4.20m.

Sue Richardson won the W55 High Jump to my knowledge her first BMAF Championship win, she is certainly better known as the 1984 Olympic Long Jump Bronze medallist. These days, it's all for fun!

THROWS:

David Abernathy set a new M60 Discus record with 53.87, although it should be noted that M60's now throw the 1kg implement, the previous record was set by Dr. Macsimczyk at the old Alexander Stadium in 1979 with the 2kg Discus.

Other British Records came in the Weight competition, from John Pearson M50, Phil Spivey M55 and M85 Graham Roberts.


