

XV European Track & Field Championships 19-30 July 2006 WORDS: Bridget Cushen PICTURES: Tom Phillips. Lesley Richardson Sezgei Demidov

s 3086 competitors and their supporters from 37 countries arrived in the capital city of the Wielkopolska region of Poland, the country was about to experience its warmest 8-day spell for 227 years. Poznan, the city that sparked the 1956 uprising when workers from the "Cegielski Metallurgical Plant" took to the streets in a mass protest against working conditions and unrealistic production quotas set by their Communist rulers, they were brutally suppressed. Poznan had just marked the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and commemorative posters and wreaths were visible all over the city.

The Mayor's rousing welcoming speech at the Opening Ceremony on the 19th confirmed the City's commitment to the success of the Championships after the University, the main supporter when Poznan made their presentational bid four years ago, had withdrawn. The Deputy Mayor ran in the M50 marathon, and Poland's current Minister for Sport finished 7th in the 50km walk at the I.A.A.F World Championships in 1997. Some sponsorship was obtained from the local media; a minimum 3000 competitors are necessary to financially break even. Facilities attached to the University were not upgraded as promised; there was no stand cover in either of the two stadiums. Accompanying persons either sizzled or took refuge in the refreshment tents. The stands remained empty. Any shortcomings were more than compensated for by the friendly, obliging hoards of young volunteers. Team Managers recommendations were immediately acted on and the Championships will be remembered as one of the friendliest that we have been to. A 3-course meal cost less than £10 and there were quite a few food outlets at the main stadium and plenty of international cuisine in the Town Square. All competitors and visitors were issued with free passes for the efficient trams and buses that criss-cross the city. Taxies were incredibly cheap. A jogging trail around a large lake and through woods adjacent to the main stadium was idea for training or a cooling swim.

### Thursday 20th, Day 1. Friday Day 2

The heptathlon and decathlon started at 07.50 in the main stadium. The official temperature at 09.00 registered 31°; by midday it had soared into the 40-ies. The multi eventers had to cope with two days of searing heat with no shade or umbrellas, they were walking around with their towels over their heads. Yet, as can be seen from the results, three championship records were broken in the heptathlon, including the W55 by Caroline Marler, and 5 in the decathlon. Psychologically, it must have been even harder for the men with the daunting prospect of running the last event, the 1500m in such heat. Jennifer Van Deelen unfortunately pulled a sheath of muscles in her calf on the second lap of the 800. She had amassed enough points to hold on to 3<sup>rd</sup> in the W35 age category, but what a sad way for the Kent teacher to go out. Our excellent medical team was quickly to her aid as they did at the World Indoor in Linz when Janice Price ruptured an Achilles tendon.

The first of the two M65 10,000m seeded races took off at 08.00 at the University track. By 11.00 it was 35° as the first of the women's 10,000m was reaching the half way stage in the main stadium. Worse was to follow. At noon the M70-plus age groups lined up for their race, it had clouded over but the humidity was high. Derek Howarth, who has re-written the British record book since turning 75 last autumn, raced around the 25 laps to win the first of his three individual gold medals. Ron Franklin is unfazed by any weather conditions and ploughed through to finish 4th as did Peter Robinson in the M70 group. Down at the University track there were two seeded races in each of the M50, M55 and M60 groups. The M55 races at 13.00 and 14.15 took the brunt of the extreme heat with 42° on the thermometer. The arena was a cauldron. Officials ferried water from the university but by the time it reached trackside, it was tepid. Experienced ex-international Omer Van Noten of Belgium was one of 12 DNF's. MVAC member Paul Williams 9th led the British home. Arnold Bradshaw, Alan Rich and prolific Surrey racer Alan Davidson, all finished. Rob Sergant, running later in the M50 category and debutante W35 Sarah Allan, both enjoyed their races despite the heat. Carmel Parnell of Ireland set a championship record in the W50 race, as did the Italian Agnoli in the M80 event. Royal Navy Officer Dai Roberts won the M45 title run at 17.30 but still unbearably hot. Ian

Johnston in the last race at of the day picked up a silver medal in the M35 category. The M40 race at 16.00 in the main stadium must surely rate as one of the toughest. Poland's Zbigniew Murawski toed the 24-strong field through 70sec laps before the current WMA/European titleholder Jose Torres of Spain and the Russian Oleg Strizhakov, the fastest man in the field, shared the lead beyond the halfway mark. They finished in that order well clear of the chasing pack. Stuart McLay worked steadily through to finish a very credible 5<sup>th</sup>.

The weight throwers had to cope with a below standard circle in a somewhat uneven field adjacent to the main stadium. The dry arid ground with no spectator area was hardly conductive to good performances. Whether the Championship records set by the Germans, Rocken in the M65 or the world record by M75 Rzehak can be ratified, remains to be seen. Statistically more women entered the Weight Throw (72) than the 10,000m. The medals in the W45 10k went begging, as the lone entry did not start.

### Saturday 22nd Day 3

The sprinters revelled in the heat and virtually all the British sprinters got through the morning qualifying rounds of the 100m, but where were all our W35 and sprinters, not one entered. Did the start of the school holidays prevent them from travelling? It was left to the W45's to fly the flag with all of them getting into the final and Wendy Dunn getting a W40 bronze. Several seasons bests were recorded, British records were set by W75 Christine McLennan (18.88) and W85 Mary Wixey, 25.74sec. Val Parsons won the W60 dash.



After making the second false start in the M35 final, Rule 162 - the One False Start rule does not apply to masters -Will MacGee sped to victory followed by Michael Culshaw in 4<sup>th</sup>. Anthony Noel had a brilliant run in the M40 race defending the title he won in Denmark two years ago and defeating the Italian 200/400m world recorder holder, Enrico Saraceni, for the third time they have clashed. Noel set a British record of 10.74 when taking the

World title last year in San Sebastian. His winning time, 10.93 is a season's best. "I knew it would take a time like that to win here today," he said after getting his gold medal. 12 of the 39 entries in this age category were British, four got through to the leight. The gold rush continued as Patrick Logan ran his second fastest time ever, 11.50, over 100m to take the M45 race. He clocked 11.43 behind two Americans for 3<sup>rd</sup> in San Sebastian and he was 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 60m in Linz.

The line up for the M50 final included the defending champion Stephen Peters, Wally Franklin, Viv Oliver, Geoff Walcott and Tom Phillips, a 100% record as the other two Britains who entered, John Browne and Robert Cawson, did not make it to Poznan. Such is our depth here that only the 52-year old Serbian, Gojko Banjevic, snatching 4<sup>th</sup> was able to split them. Walcott, taking the bronze at age 54 moves up an age group next April, Viv Oliver 5<sup>th</sup> here, also goes up this October and Wally Franklin timed it perfectly for Italy next September as he turns 55 next August. As a team these eight men, including Alasdair Ross, have won every international championships relay open to them. Spectators at World and European championships have made a point of watching the fantastic British M50 relay team in action. We have taken for granted the familiar sight of the first out of the blocks, the widening gap down the back straight, and the commanding lead on the last change over. As they split up next year, we can only say Thanks Boys for the memory.

The men's discus, women's shot and the qualifying heats of the long hurdles and 1500m completed the day. After finishing 11<sup>th</sup> in the discus, 76-year old British record holder, Jaroslav Hanus asks why should I have to eat breakfast before 05.00 every morning and be in the stadium by 07.00 for all my five events? Why do we event at the stadium stadium, why not change it around sometimes, he lamented? He returned to London on this occasion without a medal, but how many 76-year olds are remotely capable of undertaking his 9-day Poznan schedule?

### Sunday 23, Day 4

A slight drop in temperature as the field events dominated. In the women's hammer W45 Margrith Duss of Switzerland came close to breaking her own world record with a throw of 50.37m. In the M50 long jump Trevor Wade cleared 5.99 for a British record. Wendy Lang and Caroline Marler picked up their second gold medal in the W40 and W55 high jump. Manndy Lang is still a spectator following major back surgery last year. 65-year old Ursula Stelling, Germany, cleared 1.37, an improvement of 3cm and there were some very close finishes in the hurdles. BMAF Vice Chairman, Tony Bowman, raced to a European record in the M70 long hurdles, as did Peter Field in the M75 event, both having broken the British records at the BMAF Championships in Birmingham. 76 delegates and athletes attended the open EVAA Congress on Anti-Doping in the evening. The presentation by the Director of Sports Medicine at the local University School of Physical Education was well received. It was announced that a one euro levy would be added to all entry fees effective from 2007 to pay for extra doping tests at future championships.

### Monday 24, Day 5

women's 5000m walk got away at the second track at 08.30 and still no let up in the weather. At the BMAF championships on 9 July, 70-year old Arthur Thompson erased one of the longest standing world records from the books. The M70 5000m walk in 27.02sec that had stood for 24 years to the Australian Tom Daintry, Arthur lowered it to 26.01.52. Here he sped home in a championship record 26.34.87 winning by almost two laps.

Woking walker Fiona Bishop, had the pleasure of receiving her W45 bronze medal from the legendary Olympian Irena Szewinska, now an IOC and IAAF Council member and President of Polish Athletics. After some timetable changes the 400m heats commenced in the main stadium, followed by the 1500m finals. Michal Bartoszak gave the Poles something to shout about as he took the M35 1500m in a championship record. He was 37<sup>th</sup> in the Athens Olympics marathon and a regular member of their international cross county team. Peter Parker 2<sup>nd</sup> led the British entry home in 4.01.44. Dave Taylor now back to full fitness, retained the M40 crown he won two years ago, just failing to dip under four minutes and Bob Minting led all the way in the M55 race. Bernadine Prichard shot to the front of the W35 field and stayed there. An exciting W50 followed as Sandra Branny, Paula Fudge and Joan Howe made it 1,2 and 3. Pat Gallagher W60 and Pam Jones W70 completed another medal topping day. Out in the field Evaun Williams threw the W65 javelin to a European record 38.07m. Mary Wixey reached 1.61 for an ER in the W85 long jump and BMAF Overseas Entries Co-ordinator Carole Filer collected gold in the W50 jump. The Official Get-Together Party was held in the tented area beside the main track. (ith no competition the next day, athletes were able to "hydrate" on the excellent eap beer, abundant food and socialise with other competitors.

A rest day for the competitors. Some of the team paid a visit to the immaculately kept war graves dedicated to the 50 attempt escapees and Allies Forces featured in the film "The Great Escape" in Park Cytadela. At the General Assembly, ably chaired by Dieter Massin, the BMAF Chairman Winston Thomas and Marina Hoernecke-Gil, Spain, stepped down from the EVAA Council to much appreciative applause for their considerable contribution over many years. Lamberto Vacchi, Italy, as Technical Director and Kurt Kaschke of Germany as Secretary, replaces them. An EVAA proposal to change their title to European Masters A.A. got 48 votes in favour, 33 against, not reaching the 2/3rds majority. They remain European Veterans Athletic Association. Delegates were updated on the EVAA Indoor championships in Helsinki in March, Non Stadia in Regensburg, Germany next May, 2008 Stadia championships in Ljubljana. Arhus was the sole bidder for the 2009 Non Stadia and Nviregyháza. (phonetic: New-a-chasa), in Hungary, twin city of St Albans, was the only bidder for the 2010 Stadia championships.

### Wednesday 26th Day 7

Athletes were saddened to hear that the 82-year old groundsman had been killed the previous day as the front wall of the equipment shed collapsed on him as he was preparing equipment for Wednesday's competition. He had worked there for over 50 years.



There are not many opportunities to compete in an international pentathlon. It was no surprise therefore to see large entries, particularly in the men's event, in the main stadium. After the earlier exhausting two days, the bifurcated athletes were all back for more. Down to 31° and humidity high, it was yet another long day out on the field. All the British came through with flying colours and enjoyed the camaraderie. Edward Williams sped to a M35 400m championship record in 50.06. Stephen Peters added to his considerable gold collection, defending his M50 400m Arhus crown, adding to his World title in San

Sebastian and coming home yet again with another five gold medals. At the second track the times of some of the 5000m had been brought forward to avoid the midday sun. A risky decision as not all countries have team managers and athletes not au fait with the logistical problems surrounding masters championships, can quite easily miss their race. Bottled water had been supplied in abundance after the first day and it is to the Organisers' credit that they were able to get things moving so quickly.

### Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> Day 8

Some 200m and 800m heats and the hurdles semis kept the spectators on their feet in the main stadium and seven age group championships records were established in the pole vault. In the field outside there were some excellent throws in the women's discus.

Despite the 08.00 start, the women's 10k road walk on a coned off 2000m strip of road parallel with Malta Lake on the south side of the city, was a test of endurance. Fiona Bishop 3rd, Susan Lozano Rey and Liz Harris came away with W45 team gold. The M35-50 20k followed on at 11.00 with the sun directly overhead and no shade. Mark Wall and Anthony Bell's finished times are very credible performances. John Hall led the field home in the M55/60 race in 1.55.59. David Kates and Glyn Jones finished well. Team Manager Eric Horwill was spotted munching a bread roll in the shade, no way to prepare for his own race later on that afternoon, but in such conditions he had to be there. Liz Harris took over from him and some of the spouses also helped. Fortunately Malta Lake is an international water centre and there are hotels and eateries close by. The biggest cheer however was reserved for Arthur Thompson finishing 2nd in the mixed age group race in another world record time of 1.56.44sec. In what many felt was the performance of the championships, he broke James Grimwade's 1986 mark of 1.58.10 despite the conditions. He led the team of John Payne, Eric Horwill and Ken Livermore to M70 gold. Ed Shillabeer got silver in the M65. Jack Fitzgerald, an ex-BVAF Secretary, picked up a silver medal in the M80 race, his first in these championships for 18 years. "I would have caught him [the winner] had I not run out of road" he reminisced afterwards over a cooling beer!

### Friday 28th Day 9

An exciting M40 javelin competition in the main stadium, won by the Solvakian Pavol Florek, concluding with a 65.36m throw. Evaun Williams got another CR, this time in the weight throw pentathlon to conclude what must be a memorable 9 days for the retired north London Health Visitor. She got a World record in the javelin, British record in the shot, 2<sup>nd</sup> behind the Russian Olympian Tamara Danilova in the discus, and just losing out in the hammer to the Estonian, Erikson in the final throw. Dorothy McLennan was also kept busy setting European and CBP's in the W70 age category heptathlon and pole vault. The temperature had dropped to 31° for the semis of the 200/800m and short hurdles finals in the main stadium.

### Saturday 29th Day 10

Athletes woke up to a wet morning for the finals of the 800m, triple jumps and the conclusion of the weight pentathlon. W60 Pat Gallagher successfully defended her 800m in a British record time of 2.47.09 as the rain had ceased and humidity rose. Bernadine Pritchett, Sue Aperghis, Mary Edwards and Geraldine Finegan were involved in pretty fast W35/40 finals. Joan Howe and Nancy Hitchmough put up spirited performances to get silver. After heats and semis, legs were feeling tired but Edward Williams fractionally missed out on winning the M35,

John Headley's winning time in the M40 race in 1.59.97 was faster than either in the World or in Arhus two years ago. Bob Minting got a CR in the M55 race. Conditions were ideal for the 200m finals in the evening and our sprinters were out in force for another flush of medals and season's best times.

### Sunday 30th Day 11

An early start for the 242 men and 52 women who entered the marathon, 71/2 times round Malta Lake. Mercifully it was overcast with a light cool breeze. The Austrian, Georg Ruess and Rolf Schwabe, Germany, dictated the pace throughout. Ruess finished in 2.32.43, Schwabe just 9 seconds adrift, but there was a terrific run by the 55 year old Russian, Vladimir Radaev. He came storming through after three laps to finish 4th in 2.41.42. The 44-year old Pole, Jerzy Siemaszko, had recovered sufficiently after finishing 4<sup>th</sup> in the M40 10,000m to take the bronze in 2.36.54. The first three 55-year olds all finished under two hours, 50 min. spotted finishing 174th in 4.25.33 was M65 Evgeny Zhukov, the grandson of the great Russian General who defeated the Nazis. Two 80-year olds, Kivioja of Finland who won in 5.27.54 and the Pole Parusinski was last but less than 6 hours in 5.56.09. Andrew McNeil was the leading Briton until a nagging injury forced him out at 15 miles. W35 Karen Haldane looked to be closing in on the leading woman, but she too had to pull out suffering from a cold and a foot injury, not a happy outcome for the Northumbrian runner making her first appearance and that was the only event she had entered. M55 Mike Spragg led the British home. Fiona Bishop must be delighted with her trip after picking up two medals in her number one discipline, the walks, she paced herself perfectly to get an unexpected silver medal in the W45 race. Angela Bent was just ahead of her finishing 2nd in the W50 and Carole Spong took the W60 silver medal back to Lowestoft. Team Managers Archie Jenkins and Kevin Dillon reported all home safely.

The steeplechase and relays were underway on the main track. Aleksander Swiecicli, who runs for Bedford but was running here for his native Poland, was lying 2<sup>nd</sup> in the M55 race until falling four barriers from home. Ireland's M80 Nick Corish took a fall at the water jump; the sensitive Organisers presented him his gold medal to the tune of Danny Boy! The hospitality of the hosts is unsurpassed. My camera broke; I asked the official photographer if he knew what the problem was. He took my camera back to the studio, dismantled it, fixed it, developed the film and inserted a replacement and then flatly refused to accept a penny.

The relays are always a great finale. Team Manager Maurice Doogan, got teams out in virtually all age groups. Caroline Marler brought her gold medal tally up to five when she anchored the W554 x 400m team of Yvonne Priestman, Nancy Hitchmough and Viv Bonner, to a European record 4.45.41. Our nonpareil M504 x 100 and 4 x 400m team raced away with another handful of gold.

A total of 13 British, 94 championship, 21 European and 10 world records were broken, mostly in the older age groups field events, but considerably less than in Arhus in 2004. The 360 British competitors returned home with a medal haul of 75 gold, 56 silver and 53 bronze, only the much larger Germany team won more. These championships are open to all athletes, they are not just for the elite. Once you have been to one, you are generally hooked.

What an inspiration our older athletes are to all of us. 85 year old Mary Wixey successfully negotiated her way through foreign tram and bus networks, set a British

record in the 100m and returned to Cheltenham with three gold and one silver medal. Derek Howarth reeled off laps of the track in equatorial heat for a clean sweep in the M751500, 5,000 and 10,000m. Peter Field leaped up on to the rostrum after setting a opean record in the M75 hurdles, to collect his medal. Doug Fothingham drove all the way from Lincolnshire, won the M75 5000m walk and drove home, and 97-year old Alfred Proksch of Austria won the shot putt. He tied for 6<sup>th</sup> place in the pole vault at the 1936 Berlin Olympics. Proof that old soldiers never die – they just fade away.

### Death of Paschal Morris

The death is announced at the age of 74 of the former Irish Cross Country internationalist Paschal Morris.

### DAVID McKirdy 25th July 1940-2nd August 2006

On Wednesday 2nd August this year the members of the Scottish Veteran Harriers Club were dealt a devastating blow with the news of the sudden death of their president, Dave McKirdy.

Dave was taken ill on the morning of Monday 31st July and was rushed to hospital by ambulance, where he was diagnosed as having meningitis. At first the prognosis was good and it was hoped that he would make a good recovery. Unfortunately the following day his condition worsened and it became obvious that he had very little chance of recovering from this setback and he died the following day, leaving his family and friends devastated and stunned by the speed of what had taken place.

In the midst of their grief David's family took the brave and commendable decision to donate his organs to help others. The following day David's eldest son Andrew received a phone call from the British Organ Transplant Coordinator thanking the family for their decision to donate David's organs. She went on to tell Andrew that at that precise moment David's liver was being transplanted in a young man who had been waiting some years for a suitable match, and without the family's courageous gesture he would have been dead in a matter of days. She also said that David's kidneys were being rushed to a hospital for two life saving transplants. Just knowing that out of this tragedy three people have been given the gift of life has helped the family come to terms with their loss.

I first got to know David when we were both working for the Standard Telephone and Cables Company in East Kilbride in1964. The realization that we were both interested in outdoor pursuits was the foundation that our friendship was built on. When you have shared a tent in some of Scotland's wild and beautiful places, and run thousands of miles together over the years, a special friendship is formed that stands the test of time, and so it was with David and me.

I have many memories of David, not least of which was when we were taking part in The Three Islands Peaks Race. We had run over Ben More on the island of Mull and had still about a mile or so to run to Salen, it was about 11 pm and very dark. We had been running for just over 5 hours and I had nothing left to give. Without a word Dave took my pack and put it on along with his own and I was able to run the last mile into Salen where our yacht was moored. That was Dave at his best, strong and reliable, qualities he continued to show over the next few days on the Bens of Jura and on Goatfell on Arran.

David would be the first to admit that he was not the best runner in the world, but he was far from being the worst. As a Vet he was running 2:47 to 2:48 for the marathon, excellent running by any standard. He also ran 2:00:18 for the Ben Nevis race, his downhill running on a par with that other doven of the hills, the late Eddie Campbell.

David had been elected to the office of President of the Scottish Veteran Harriers Club at our last AGM, and was in my opinion a first class president. He was ever the perfectionist and he would have thought that he could do a better job the next time around and he would likely have been reelected for a second term.


David was also an accomplished piper, as anyone who came on the Vets Spanish holidays will testify. His absence on the February holiday to Portugal next year will be keenly felt. His other great love was angling and he was at his happiest on a riverbank or out on a loch, rod in hand playing a salmon or a sea trout. Many a fine trout I enjoyed thanks to David.

Because of the age difference I always thought David would be writing my obituary, not the other way around. I have lost a good friend, the Club has lost a fine president, but his family have suffered the greatest loss.

The numbers that attended David's funeral bore testament to his popularity and the high regard he was held in. Among those attending were some of his old colleagues from Roll Royce Management, also members of the Scottish Media Group, many of his old adversaries who were also friends in the Vets Club, and members of the East Kilbride Athletics Club that he had also been a member of. Friends from his pipe band and angling dub also attended, all mourning the loss of a friend.

On behalf of David's many friends in our sport I send our deepest sympathy to his wife Betty, sons Andrew and Graham, daughters-in-law Joyce and Alison, and grandchildren Fiona, Euan and Gavin.

This was my last championship as Technical manager, and for Marina Hoernecke-Gil as Secretary. At the General Assembly we had no candidate for the office of Secretary, as our representative was not able to attend.

Marina and I were presented with plaques for our services to E.V.A.A. (12 years for me and 16 years for Marina). Lamberto Vacchi was elected to the new post of Technical Delegate, and the Non Stadia and Stadia positions have now been amalgamated. There was a motion for a change to the name from Veterans to Masters, this was defeated as there was no overall majority, this was unfortunate as it would have brought Europe into line with all other regions.

Following from the B.M.A.F. Outdoor championships in Birmingham, many athletes travelled to Poznan, in Poland. With a slightly disappointing entry all around as E.V.A.A. were looking for around 4000 entries and we had around 3067, B.M.A.F. had 336 and Germany 681.

We took a total of 184 medals, well done to all those that too, part, our medical team that helped so many achieve their goals, the team

management for all their running around and problem solving, and all the wives, husbands and friends that gave such verbal support. There were many highlights and I hope some of you will be mentioned he various reports, for me I have to at least mention a few athletes Steve Peters who has now done the treble 100-200-400 in the last 4 European championships, well done Steve. M35 Will MacGee in the 100-200. Anthony Noel M40 winning the 100m battle with Enrico Saraceni (Italy). Patrick Logan M45 100-200 and M40 David Taylor in the 1500 and the 5000m run in scorching heat. Caroline Marler and Wendy Laing in their many events, but particularly in the Heptathlon with Carole just falling shy of the World record and leading the others by over 900 points. Finally after seeing Arthur Thompson in Birmingham set new world records in the 5KM walk, it was a pity for me to miss seeing him dominating the 5KM and 20Km walks and setting new figures.

I hope you all have a very relaxed rest period in October (some at least) before starting training again for the rest of 2006 and then 2007.

Finally I will remind all those travelling to World and European championships please ensure you read the Anti-Doping notes on the B.M.A.F-U.K.A. websites, more details will be in the next magazine

### **TRACK & FIELD SECRETARY**

Having returned from Poznan where we yet again showed that we are the most successful section of British Athletics, where our national anthem was heard a magnificent 75 times, mostly to a chorus from other athletes, as opposed to the once in Goteburg with scowls, **I am now informed that we will remain the ONLY section of British Athletics not to benefit from the Olympics effect.** 

Following the awarding of the Olympics in 2012 to London, I had the vision of British Masters Athletics hosting the World Masters Athletics Championships in London in 2011, as a vehicle to obtaining ongoing sponsorship and backing in the lead up to those Championships and beyond. I had tried numerous areas of low-level sponsorship without any success, so would top draw sponsorship be the answer. With that in mind I set about putting together a submission, which eventually ended up as eight pages of introductions.

The aim was to develop all areas of British Masters Athletics, with 'world class' athletes being partly funded to assist in all areas of coaching, training [including warm weather training] and regular medical back up [injury prevention - massage etc.], with a goal of Top of the Medal Table on Home Soil.

After a few hundred hours of research, discussions / meetings with wheting professionals, drafting and re-drafting, vetting of outlines of both introduction and budgetary proposals by a 'non athletic' C.E.O. and marketing managers, the full submission was lodged in May. The date for lodging of bid proposal for the W.M.A.Championships was 1st September - it required Ken Livingston's signature on a piece of paper stating that he was backing the bid. Not one penny would have been required and if the full package of sponsorship was not forthcoming by Riccione next year or the budgetary matters did not stack up, then we could have withdrawn, as numerous cities have done before. However we never got that far, on my return from Poznan, the recipient of my submission, finally informed me after consideration, that they were to back disabled athletes.

The diminishing return principle seems to apply here - those over endowed with sponsorship continue to sink whilst those not weighed down by any sponsorship, **the CREAM**, continue to rise - apparently there is no such thing as justice. However, the day would have been worse if Fred Bush had not given me a winner and three places at Glorious Goodwood [on top of the Downs], and was it apt that I had to go downhill after that, to the meeting of rejection. As ever, you can only rely on a member of the TEAM.

So instead of London in 2011, it appears we are destined for Porto Alegra, capital of a southern province of Brazil or Sacramento, California, USA (see previous page).

Where do we go from here - as always, we move on, but this time on and a half fronts. The submission will be adapted with the London 'Olympic' effect removed, and I will continue to 'knock on the doors' of C.E.O's of flush international companies with submissions. The half front will be the back of the Ageism Act that reaches the statue books on 1st October. Although, I am informed by a friendly legal beagle, that it will not help us directly as we, athletes are not employed by U.K.A. or another sporting body, discrimination will be in the public eye and WE ARE discriminated against because of our age. It worked for the disabled athletes, why not us. WATCH THIS SPACE. Be sure of an enlivened winter.

I have been reminded of the F.A.N.S. scheme [Free Access for National Sportspeople] that Bridget touched on in her report in the last edition of Masters Athletics. Those selected for the Interland will automatically qualify for this scheme, as will all ranked athletes and most athletes who compete in International Championships, in all age groups. For a clearer understanding of the scheme, Jon Tilt has suggested you look at the superb scheme in Hampshire on www.hants.gov.uk/sports/fans.html this should operate to some degree in all areas of the country, you just need to check with your Local or County Councils to see how you apply and what paperwork you need to prove you qualify.

I have now firmed up the dates for the Indoor Pentathlon and the main Indoor Championships. I am also looking at the possibility of including a partial Winter Throws Championship alongside the Indoor champs. I was sceptical of the Winter Throws held in conjunction with the Sindelfingen World Championships on snow-covered fields, but a superb competition in Linz, luckily in sunny conditions, has caused me to rethink.

Regarding the main Outdoor Championships, I have had offers or enquiries from Exeter and Manchester as well as my preferred, centrally located Alexander Stadium. I hope to inspect all venues in October and prepare reports on all of them for discussion and decision at the November BMAF Delegates meeting.

I am also looking to hold the Weight Pentathlon, which happily has now outgrown a one day fixture, in conjunction with the Outdoor Pentathlon and 10K Track Walks, over a weekend, possibly at Milton Keynes.

I appreciate that will not be to everyone's liking, but the difficulties this year in finding a venue, let alone a date make this necessary.

I would also wish to thank, on your behalf, Peter Barber, Colm and Cath Murphy [Weight Pentathlon / Decathlon], Bruce Charles [Decathlon / Heptathlon] and Denis Field & Ron Steward VAA-NE Committee [Outdoor Pentathlon]. They all organised outstanding Championships with new entrants in all of them. So let me bring you up to speed on what dates have been fixed for 2007, so far: Indoor Pentathlon [hopefully with the SCVAC Indoor Championships and OPEN Track Events and Shot] Sunday 28th January. Indoor [Main] Championships PLUS Winter Throws competition [Discus and Heavy Hammer] Saturday 3rd /Sunday 4th March. Both of these will be at the brand new Lee Valley Athletics Centre, Enfield [Pickett's Lock]

I did have the the following weekend as a provisional booking, for the Main Championship when the diary was empty but on confirming that we wished NOT to clash with the European Indoors at the NIA, find that the diary now has National Squad weekend pencilled in. "So much for consultation". Yet part of UKA's Mission Statements says ". UKA plays a fundamental role in developing 'sport for all' by... no matter what your **AGE**.." together with " nurturing athletes of all **AGES** and preparing them for the world stage" The person, who wrote this must have left the building.

Moving on to the World Championships (Riccione). Please be aware that the dates for these have CHANGED, from those in the Entry Booklets available in San Sebastian and some of those available in Linz, where it appears they ran out of update stickers and inserts.

They now run from 3rd to 15th September, with the first day of competition being 4th September. The entry booklets and web site is also wrong with regard to age group dates, but they are being updated. Your age group is governed by your exact age on the 4th September 2007.

Finally, thank you for the dozens of e-mails I received about TULI'S CUPS, but in checking all the websites out, the best deal by far was Physio-Med Services Ltd at www.physio-med.com and all their other stuff looks a lot cheaper as well.



### Older People in **Competitive Athletics**

Brief Initial Review of 2006 Questionnaire Responses

**Bill Davies and Tonv** Crocker, University of Wales Institute. Cardiff

It has been a fanny old year, reading all about the government's plans to reduce obesity in children via lettuce lunches and much more sport, presumably to be taught by parents and teachers who never do any themselves. British research evidence now shows that people aged seventy are fitter and healthier than people aged fifty were twenty years ago. (They don't seem to have noticed it must have been the same group of people on both occasions, except that by now the unhealthy ones will have popped their clogs'.).

Then there was all the excitement over plans to be fourth for medals in the 2012 Olympics,

followed by noises that seemed to sound like 'Ha, ha, ha!" Coe said he wanted to get rid of the top guys in Athletics UK - looks as if he's on target - and several of us returned to competition in mainstream athletics because our lower division clubs couldn't raise teams without a good sprinkling of geriatrics chasing the points.

In our own world of athletics the World Masters Association decided to confirm 35 as the base-line entry age. In Britain this did not lead to a swamping of our championships by thousands of athletes in nappies, as had been feared only three years earlier. The only conclusion we can come to is that nowadays people in their thirties don't do sport.

Masters Athletics isn't going to be swamped by young newcomers - it's

going to fade away. The negatives went on. In August, despite having invested huge amounts of time, energy and knowledge into trying to sell London as an ideal venue for the 2011 Masters World Championships Maurice was informed it wasn't wanted. The higher media attention given to Para-Olympic sports, and the continued hostility from on high, (both veiled and open), from those who still believe that oldies should be managing, organising, coaching and funding athletics for youngsters, played their part in this decision. Despite the hundreds of research studies showing the advantages of physical activity to middle aged and older people it is still very clear that in their view of reality we should not be playing! That sort of attitude was, of course, a major spur reason for developing the questionnaire that you all received with the Spring issue of Masters Athletics. Well, where have we got to?

Firstly, a very, very big "Thank you" to the hundreds of master athletes who responded. We had intended to start analysing the information by about the end of June, but those questionnaires just kept on rolling in. All through July and on until the end of August. Amazingly they came from as far afield as Greece, Turkey, Italy, France, Spain Portugal plus all the far comers of the British Isles. Only one person sent his response with the added message "Oi, send a stamped, addressed envelope next time." So to every one of you - including, the seven anonymous respondents -"Thank you, once again for spending not only your time but also your money." An explanation re the lack of stamped addressed envelopes. During our development period we applied for research money. We got some but not all that we needed. At the cheapest rates of postage, plus the cost of 6,000 envelopes it would have cost about £2,000. Initially the IBA funded the entire costs of the development of

our methodology including early versions of the questionnaire. The final version cost £500 to print. That was paid for by UWIC. IBA again covered the costs that Masters Athletics had to pass on from the printers. Just thought you'd like to know.

Secondly, another big thank you to the many respondents who added letters, comments,

extensions, etc to their replies. This has added an enormous amount of richness of detail to the material we received and which is now have awaiting analysis. It will require different analytical

processes to those needed for the straight responses to the questionnaire but will put an enormous amount of valuable meat on the bones by the time we have finished and so can report back to you in fuller detail. What about analysis? Well, at this point in time we have only just processed all of your data into the computer. Collation and interpretation of your information is therefore still superficial. We

already knew from some of our earlier data collection that less than half of the masters age athletes, who still compete, are members of one of the masters/veterans affiliated clubs. This brings us to an important caution. We have to keep reminding ourselves that the data you have

provided only comes from those master athletes who belong to one of the BMAF affiliated clubs, so the responses may not be representative of all masters aged athletes. Beyond that roughly 15% of recipients of our magazine responded to the request to send the questionnaire. As with all researches involving similar requests for responses this isn't regarded as a bad proportion - BUT -it does mean we do not know how the nonrespondents think or act. Our sample may be completely representative of all master athletes. It may not. The following are therefore just a few of the early points that caught our attention and may well be of value to future debate, lobbying and decision making as these appear to affect our sport. Currently in Britain about 50% of the population have died by their mid seventies. Yet of those who responded some 22% were in their forties, 27% in their fifties, 28 percent in their sixties. We have to ask - "Is there a factor affecting involvement that is more important than dying that is causing this trend?" There was a drop to 18.4 % of responses coming from those over 70. But even that caused us some surprise. Is it true that nearly one fifth of competing master athletes are over 70? Or, is it perhaps that they have more time available for answering questionnaires, or again .....?

Although we are constantly being told we should concentrate on helping younger athletes not competing the evidence from this survey suggests that in fact some 32% of us already do this.

Indeed, more than 21% have told us that they are committed to more than one aspect of coaching, management or officiating. This is a major difference between the commitment of competitively active master athletes and younger adult competitors. Another group taken from all ages of respondents told us they would like to become more involved in coaching but currently lack qualifications in this area.

The data from our survey suggests that the proportion of women involved in competitive athletics decreases steadily as age increases. There could be several reasons for this. However, one aspect

mentioned by many of the women athletes was finding time for training. Not one man mentioned this as a problem. In both groups a high proportion said they had absolutely no intention of giving up competition unless they had to. This was probably one of the main reasons why some said that they had no current intentions of taking up mainstream coaching or administration whilst still competing. Despite that a very encouraging 30% felt they probably would do so if they ever have to cease competing. Over the next few months we shall be analysing your responses to the questionnaire and relating our findings to those in other investigations regarding athletics, sport in general and health. As soon as we can we will report back to you. Certainly it seems there will be much for all of us to do if our sport isn't to slowly die away as we move towards the point where obesity, computer addiction and lack of passion for active sport in younger people means it is only the aged ninety plus members of the population who wish to continue with athletic competition. We leave you with a question. It is one that needs serious thought and an answer. "Where would mainstream athletics be without us: as coaches, officials, managers, drivers, flinders, AND despite being master athletes, masquerading as seniors in inter club competition?

### **MASTERS ATHLETICS AUTUMN 2006** Northern clubs triumph in Cross **Country Relays**

he BMAF XC Relays held at Sunderland on the 16<sup>th</sup> September provided a medal bonanza for clubs from the north. Only North Belfast Harriers gained any success, of the few that did travel, by winning the M50 and coming second in the M35. The lack of entries from the south was noticeable in an event that was being considered as part of the selection process for the England Cross Country team. However this did not detract from what was almost a VAA-NE championship.

The course at Sunderland was undulating and in the words of a former International runner, " a true cross country track ". The weather was dry and not too hot which made for pleasant conditions for the runners who did take part.

### W35

Only 5 teams actually competed and the race positions stayed mainly the same until the final leg when a splendid effort, of 9.57, from D. legan, of Chester-Le - Street & district AC, managed to overtake M. Laney, of Clayton - Le - Moors Harriers for the all important first place. Elswick Harriers were in third place the entire race.

### W45

Despite there being only 3 teams, which turned up, this was an extremely interesting race as the lead changed on every leg. North Shields Poly led after the first leg from Elvet Striders with Tynedale H & AC almost a minute behind the leaders. S. Davis moved Elvet into first place on the next leg as L. Marr moved Tynedale up a position relegating initial leaders North Shields to third spot. On the last leg it was all change again as North Shields, through L. Miller, regained the lead from Elvet and Tynedale in third.

### W55

Only one team entered and Clayton - Le - Moors Harriers went home with the gold medal.

### M60

The result of the M60 race was virtually decided by from the start as Bingley Harriers crossed the line first at the end of each leg and provided the first three fastest legs. On leg 2 Barry Mitchell equalled Jennings fastest time of 10.49 and took Clayton - Le - Moors Harriers up a place to second ahead of Heaton Harriers. The order stayed the same till the end of the race.

### M50

The M50 race was a much more closely fought contest and the first four teams finished only 47 seconds apart. The race was won by North Belfast Harriers who had made the long, but relatively easy journey thanks to low cost air travel, trip for the race. Their enthusiasm was rewarded by taking the gold medal and with M. Shields putting in the fastest leg. Local team Elswick Harriers, with two English internationals in their team, finished in second spot, only 18 seconds behind. City of Sheffield AC took the bronze medal spot from Barnet and District AC, who were one of the few teams from the south to compete.

### M35

The introduction of the M35's into the event had raised the question of should they/ shouldn't they take part and how best to include them. This had meant a restriction of only 2 M35's per team, as not all clubs have M35's, and an increase in team members to six.

This did not affect Sunderland Harriers who, apart from being third on the first leg, led at the end of every leg. The difference in time between eir runners was only 23 seconds. North Belfast Harriers who had

rked their way up from fourth on the first leg to consolidate second place on the third leg followed them home. Ian Twaddle, of North Shields Poly, put in the fastest leg of the race, 8.45, to put his club into the initial lead. After dropping back to fourth, the team rallied and finished with a bronze medal.

Nene Valley Harriers were the only other southern based team to compete and they a credible fifth with M50 England International, Stan Owen, clocking up 9.42 which would have made him third fastest in his age group race.



### BMAF (ADMIRAL SWANSEA BAY) 10k Road Race – Transponder decides BMAF champion!

This event was incorporated into the popular Swansea Bay 10k on Sunday 24 September. As the 3000-plus field surged away from the St Helen's Rugby ground on this switchback course, the elite Kenyans soon broke away. The feedback information highlighted the number of masters who not only were running in the BMAF championships, but who were also selected to represent their area in the Senior Inter Region race. John Ward, Bristol & West won the M35 title in 31.18. MVAC member Phil Parry was the first M40 home and although his 32.00 minutes transponder timing was slower than his season's best of 31.09, it still took him to 12th overall in such a major race. M50 Martin Rees, wearing the red vest of the Welsh Senior team, came in immediately behind Parry in 32.10. After winning the international cross-country in Cardiff in 2003, he had knee surgery and advised that his running days were over. But it was a classic story for the Cumavon runner, proving his surgeon wrong he reappeared last January picking up from where he left off at the front of the field, clocking 32.33 for 10k.

The M45 age title went to Peter Hockin, Bideford AC and the strong Oxford team picked up team and individual medals through M55, John ey and Gareth Jones, M60. John Batchelor had a fairly easy passage take the M65 race. But who is the real M70 champion? Eric Barber is well known for his strong sprint finish, he recalled looking around at the

finish and seeing his rival Gordon Wiltshire behind him. The transponder results timed Gordon at 43.58.9 and Eric at 43.59.15. Gordon may have had the chip on his lead leg and Eric on his trailing leg!! IAAF Rules 164.3 and 165.2 are quite clear; it is the torso that counts. Without video evidence or a judge, the results are likely to stand and Eric returned to Bideford with the silver medal. With all age groups running together in an open race, it would be virtually impossible for a judge to identify each BMAF age group winner, but such are the logistics of masters' athletics. Clydesdale H retained their M60 trophy.

Fresh from taking Birchfield Harriers to silver medals in the Midland AA road relays the previous day in Sutton Park, Debbie Walters got away from Nicki Nealon to take the BMAF W35 title in 35.59. Melanie Ellis and Andrea Dennison, representing Wales and the North of England, were the first two in the W40 race. With Debbie and Nicki representing the Midlands AA, it proves just how dependent clubs, county and now areas are on the masters. Sian Monahan who tops the W45 BMAF 10k ranking list, held her form and Gail Duckworth had a successful trip up from Leighton Buzzard to retain the W50 title. The W55 entry brought together again the outstanding top four with Sue Cariss coming home in 40.55 to retain the title she won in Motherwell last year, again from Lou Lyness.


