





"When are you going to do something for British masters?" This has been a regular question since I became Chairman of UKA eighteen months ago, not least from Jason Henderson, editor of Athletics Weekly, who has wanted me to address the issue in one of my Official Line columns for him. Far better, though, to answer Brian Owens parallel challenge here in Masters Athletics.

As someone who didn't take up running until the age of 38, and who now always checks his M40 ranking after a road or cross country race, I have a great deal of empathy for the passion of athletes of, let's say, a certain age. It may be a little late for Paul Dickenson to teach me the Hammer, but I'm delighted that there is a vibrant community of athletes across track and field and not just in mass participation road races.

It may surprise you to know, however, that the subject of masters athletics has only arisen in a couple of UKA board meetings in my time in charge – and then only fleetingly. BMAF may be affiliated to UK Athletics, but it is not directly our charge. Rather, it is a sister organisation with its own governance structure. Like any sibling relationship, we want it to be healthy and to prosper, but we're certainly not going to presume to interfere in its decisions.

UKA's role in athletics is to provide a strategic framework for the sport (locking into the European and international governing bodies) and, assisted by public funding, to produce the best possible elite team performance with a particular emphasis on the Olympic cycle.

Most of our funding is either tied to this elite performance mandate, or is earmarked for specific development or competition programmes (in part negotiated with our sponsors who have their own ambitions for the money they invest through us). Not surprisingly, most of these programmes have a focus on youth, in part because this feeds into the elite pool of athletes.

Just as we don't invest directly into athletics clubs (and nor do the Home Country federations – neither they nor we have either the money or the remit), nor do we into BMAF or its affiliated clubs. However, that does not mean we don't want to see BMAF succeed. We do.

To that end, we have for some time provided support in kind, such as physio, to British teams at master's championships. More recently and more importantly, though, Niels de Vos and I have had meetings with BMAF committee members to see what assistance we can give from our commercial department to help them in strengthening both BMAF's profile and its finances.

Generating publicity for master's success in the national press is, frankly, a long shot. It is hard enough – drugs issues aside – to secure column inches for our elite team in the face of the media's football obsession. While this makes commercial income harder to come by, it is by no means impossible.

The challenge for BMAF is to organise itself to make the most of its assets – the body of committed members, many of whom represent their country with great success. At present, I feel, BMAF isn't yet in the best position to help itself.

There are examples of conventional clubs becoming more financially astute – such as Birchfield Harriers with their backing from Aga and their recent drive to bring in new sponsors to support athlete development ahead of 2012. BMAF needs to think in a similar way. That needn't mean the loss of the current kinship that exists within the Federation, but could improve the experience of athletes and ensure the future health of the organisation. I look forward to continued dialogue between UKA and BMAF to do what we can to ensure the continued success of Britain's masters.


BMAF 2008 AGM CHAIRMAN REPORT

2007 and 2008 was overall a successful year for BMAF members home and abroad.

I have to say that the International W.M.A Championships in Riccione and the Indoor version in Clermont-Ferrand had many problems with organisation and facilities. This made the championships less that acceptable for competitors from all Countries. Our B.M.A.F Medical team suffered some extraordinarily abusive conduct in Clermont-Ferrand. These

points have been raised with WMA and hopefully we will have changes in the future.

On the domestic scene we have had some very good competition and entries in Track and Field, Road Running, Cross Country and Race Walking. There has been a decline in overall membership of Clubs, this decline effects Athletics in general, and I am pleased to see that the influx of M35's into our ranks has seen a lower level of decline than open athletics.



There have been changes in both UK Athletics and the English Regions. In particular with registration and membership fees, I urge our clubs to get involved with regional developments in their areas and make themselves a part of the various set ups. This will make Masters part of the Sporting future in these regions, and you would be part of the financial set up. The ball is in your court and not that of the B.M.A.F, and I am aware that some clubs have been working on this and have had some success.

B.M.A.F have had talks with UKA's new Chairman Mr Ed Warner, and we have had some frank input from him. I have also had a very fruitful meeting with Mr Neils De Voss. Whilst it is clear that we will not be getting financial support to run our competitions, we have been able to get some aid for medical purposes, and in the future we would hope to increase this contribution. We also have the backing of the UKA and help when asked for in all non financial ways, as can particularly be seen in the anti-doping realm.

One problem that has been ongoing is on the subject of Antidoping and the position of Neil Griffin who is now free to compete in B.M.A.F Competition but not International Competition. I have to stress once again, that UK Athletics are the federated body for Athletics Anti-Doping and all anti-doping matters must go through them, and/to W.M.A as the I.A.A.F body for Masters Athletics, not the Sports Council. B.M.A.F is an affiliate of W.M.A and follow their Rules, which are arbitrary to the I.A.A.F Rules. As an affiliated body we follow these rules, and are able to challenge them at the bi-annual General Assembly as we did in 2007, and whilst these matters were not discussed the W.M.A. General Assembly, new anti-doping guidelines have been drawn up by W.M.A and will come into force in 2009.

There are several problems that we have encountered in the past year stemming from B.M.A.F Track and Field, and Citizenship of athletes competing in International Masters Competitions. The rules for citizenship are made by W.M.A. and are clearly set out in the W.M.A Constitution. This is not a B.M.A.F ruling, B.M.A.F has made representations to W.M.A which have been accepted, and put into in their new constitution. The track and field matters have been dealt with by an appointed committee and our legal advisor.

In September there will be the E.M.G.A .masters Games in Sweden, please take note that these games are not under W.M.A or I.A.A.F rules and therefore B.M.A.F will not support these Games in any way, and therefore will not sanction any athletes taking part.

In 2011 the I.M.G.A are planning to have Masters Games in Sheffield and B.M.A.F. have declined from backing the "Athletics" in the Games, so should Sheffield be awarded these games both B.M.A.F. and U.K.A. will not sanction the Athletics. Generally it is required that the Affiliated body for each sport supports the bid for these games, and other sports have also declined their support.

We will be looking at the possibility of a World indoor Championship in Birmingham in 2012, and an outdoor championship in 2013 or 2014, there are several venues available but transport and accommodation are causes for concern.

At home several members of the master's family have passed away in the past year, they will all be missed by many of us, and I am sure that you will all share with me in sending our deepest condolences.

Finally, I have to thank all members of the Executive and the Committees for the work and effort over the past year. To Tony Bowman who was the Vice Chairman until November a big thank you for his period of duty on the B.M.A.F, and thanks to Carole Filer for her work as the Overseas Coordinator in the past four years, she has done a splendid job. We will be looking to appoint someone to replace Carole within the next few weeks. As usual a big thank you to all that attend these AGM's. Also the Athletes officials and organisers that make our Championships as successful as they are.

Once again, I wish you all health, fitness, success and the ability to achieve your goals, see you all somewhere, sometime during the next year.

AGM 2008 Birmingham.

All Executive Officers, including the President Paul Dickenson and ex President, Keith Whitaker, were present at a crowded

meeting in the Hospitality Suite in the Alexander Stadium, Birmingham, on 5 July.

In his Report, the President said that he is currently on medication for high blood pressure. Should he compete at master's international level and should he be drug tested, he would fail. He finds this very sad as he has no intention to cheat. Some of our members are in the same situation. Something must be done about this for us older athletes.

There was applause for the Championships organiser, Maurice Doogan, for the excellent Track & Field meetings he puts on; for the Honorary Secretary for her work during the year and for the Editor of Masters Athletics. Apologies from the Road Running Secretary for problems with results, particularly in the half marathon, and from the Cross County Secretary for the delay in finalising team results. Race Organiser's guidelines to be reviewed. Eric Horwill reported that this will be his final year as Race Walking Secretary. Mike Wrenn from the Road Relays Organising committee reported a disappointingly low return of completed forms issued to all participating clubs this year proposing that the Men's teams be in 10-year age groups commencing from M35-44. 18 clubs voted against this change, 8 in favour. In response to a question from the floor on whether we should continue to use Picketts Lock for the Indoor where it is claimed that there is an uneven surface on the final bend, Maurice Doogan said it is the only 6-lane track that we can get.

A proposal that the Executive should meet at least four times per year, was carried.

A proposal to sever the application procedure for issuing Therapeutic Use Exemption Certificates through UK: Athletics caused a heated debate. It was withdrawn after Maurice Doogan submitted an amendment

"On the establishment of an independent panel of Physicians, to form a Therapeutic Use Exemption Committee to act as the National Anti-Doping Organisation for British Masters Athletics. and on its authorisation by WADA to act as such.

All TUE submissions by British Masters Athletes will be

All TUE submissions by British Masters Athletes will be forwarded to the same, in lieu of WMA's Anti-Doping Officer." This was voted on and carried.

The Executive will now have to hold further discussions with UKA and lobby World Masters Athletics at their General Assembly in Lathi next year. WMA will publish their new Guidelines in January 2009.

The Re-election of Officers caused further dissent after a proposal from the floor that all outgoing Officers be re-elected en block was challenged. With less than 10 minutes left before the stadium was locked, the proposal went through.

Arthur Kimber, Southern Counties VAC, was elected to fill the vacant Vice Chair, Policy & International Affairs position, and it was announced that Carole Filer, Overseas Entries Co-Coordinator, was not now seeking re-election. The Executive will announce her successor in September.

BRITISH MASTERS AT ALEXANDER STADIUM 4th & 6th of July

he British Masters Championships at Alexander Stadium, Birmingham, were a great success for the second year running at a conveniently placed venue in the centre of the UK..

There were strong winds which effected the track times on the Saturday and some heavy showers on the Sunday. However, despite all that, **Howard Moscrop**, defied the elements to break his own M50 400 hurdles World record of 57.68, with a time of 56.56. Moscrop, a maths teacher at St Josephs School, Swindon had run 57.7 in April, told me straight after his race in lane four "The wind was horrible to the first hurdle and as soon as you came off the seventh it was very strong. I had to save a little bit that is for sure.'

The interesting thing is Howard Moscrop coaches **Jane Horder**, the W50 300 hurdles World record holder and double World Champion in Riccione, who won the 300 hurdles in 46.86 at this meeting.

Regarding the World record at Alexander Stadium **Howard Moscrop** added ' It was 15 strides to the first three, a couple of 14's, 15 to eighth into the teeth of the wind with two 16's."

When **Rosemary Chrimes**, the 1970 Commonwealth discus gold medallist, appears at the British Masters there is certain to be fireworks and one is never disappointed as she achieved two World Bests for W75 with 8.58 in the shot and 26.82 with the discus although, one must point out, Rosemary threw the discus 8.95 at Solihull on the 6th of June. Brian Owen one of the announcers at the meeting and Editor of *Masters Athletics* said "40 years ago in May, Rosemary threw 58.02 for the discus in the 'Old' Alexander stadium a quarter of a mile away from the present venue, still the W35 Record."

I would like to make comment on the oldest and youngest competing at the British Masters for several reasons. Sylvester Stein, the oldest man competing at 87, who had a heart bi-pass 20 years ago and was World veterans 200m Champion in his 50's, ran 21.5 for the 100 on the Saturday and Mary Wixey, 86, was the oldest in the women's category and pointed out 'I met someone here who competed in the English schools when I was teaching her 40 years ago.'

It was interesting to see the improvement in some of the M35 age standards Greg Smith's 400 (51.63): Mark Turner's 800 (1:56.87) and Julian Emery's 5000 (15:45.76) all useful club standards. The former name Greg Smith had a viewpoint worth listening to regarding the controversy of whether Masters Men should start as young as 35 or 40"


"Modern trends show people are working longer hours. People have family commitments. It is hard competing against 19 and

20 year olds. It gives the old guys a certain amount of incentive to stay in the sport. I have started doing a bit of coaching and stuff like that. I might not have been motivated to do so; I can see why purists don't like it. I think it is a good thing though" Darren Scott nails the point in further. Scott won the 100/200 over 35 at 39! "I have not lost a race over 200 since 2005. I am looking forward to breaking the 200 World record M40 indoors which stands at 21.94. I ran 21.62 this year at 39 and so not far off and I got called up for Scotland for a proper international. I was on 'Sky Sports' doing a relay for Scotland'

'It has been a godsend, has Masters Athletics for me. I would have been finished. I have never had 'Age' racing before and, to be able to run in my own age group. It was for me an incentive to carry on a bit longer. As a sprinter it is a lot harder.

Getting an international at 39, that proves to anyone who is 30 it is still possible to represent your country. I have run 21.48 which was in legal conditions, which is a very fast time for most ages. It really keeps me going. It' great fun. I could have been running in the British League but I decided 'No' this is what I want to do.'

Rebecca Hardy came in to veteran athletics at 39 and, although she has done barely six sessions in two years, because of bringing up two young children she won the W35 discus with 35'45 in a devastating deluge on the Sunday and of course felt frozen afterwards but still looks forward to being 40 next year for more Masters Competition.



Talking of the field events there was an interesting M60 discus to watch on the Saturday afternoon when the M60 Javelin Champion, Mike Hazelwood, who also did a British Weight best of 4551 recently, went into the lead midway through the competition with a personal best of 48.30 but that great competitor Neil Griffin rose to the occasion and threw 49.59 on his very last throw to win the competition.

M50 competitor Malcolm Fenton was a clear winner in the M50 Shot and Discus with 19.32 / 56.44. Rez Cameron (48) did 13.31 in the M45 Triple Jump which was very good. Names like George Cheetham, Trevor Wade, Wally Franklyn, Gordon Daborn, John Hall, Viv Oliver, Paul Oakes, Pat Logan, Allan Williams, Colin Brand, Jaroslav Hanus, Derek Wardle, Barry Ferguson, Doug Fotheringham, Arthur Thomson, Mark Williams, Steve James, Andrew Wetherill, Bill Gentleman and Kermitt Bentham were all out again doing well in Masters Events. Dave Elderfield, won three M50 sprints 100/200/400 and has a son who ran 48.8 for 400 this year.

My favourite one's to watch were Epsom's Terry Bissett, despite back problems, won the 100/200 M55 in very close races and the Flying Scotsman John Ross who made good work of his new M70 age group over 400..

I suppose surprises are always welcome and Mike Field (M70), despite being a good 400m man, had never won a British Masters 100m Championships but he did on the Saturday. He beat the amazing Tony Bowman but one must admit Tony had an abductor strain. Another pleasant surprise was to see Bill Foster back again after being away from Masters Athletics for some time due to a torn Achilles tendon. He won the M50' 5000 in the very respectable time of 15:59.13.

Mike Smith and Peter Cartwright had some intriguing battles in the M65 1500/5000.

Regarding the women's results Iris Holder, Wendy Laing, Nancy Hitchmough, and Vilma Thompson were all excelling in more than one event. Pat Gallagher, Liz Sissons and Pam Jones have a long history in doing well as Master Athletes and the weekend was no exception for them. Clare Elms in the W45 ran a good time of 4:39.19 and Jane Pidgeon looked good again in the W40 2000 steeplechase. The quality of the W50' 100 was very high when Averil McClelland ran 13.47 into a strong wind but was in a close finish with Caroline Powell and Helen Godsell.

Maureen Lewington, who was an excellent International in her day, simply flew down the straight in the 100' W60, well clear of the field, which is amazing when you consider she was virtually written off by a doctor for competing again after surgery on her old athletic injuries.

44 year old Lolita Byfield-Moore, after her 200 win, said she had only been running two years and came into athletics because of her daughter Mika who is running 12.4 as an under 17 girl. Kirstin King (46) the 100/200 W45 winner had two kids and came back again into athletics at 42. She made the WAAA final as a 28 year old in the last year of Cosford.

Caroline Powell was impressive over 400 but then she was once ranked 32nd in the UK over 400. She has had four children in the meantime and I thought the breaks may have done her good for longevity in the sport.

Irie Hill's 3.60 Pole Vault at 39 was an excellent mark; she is looking forward to moving into the next age group next year, where she will go for the World Record which is the same as Sunday's performance.





Peter Galbraith King 1919-2008

Peter King, former veteran distance runner competing in the South, has died in Carlisle aged 88, after a very, very long illness. He was a man of great determination, yet always able to be relaxed, modest about his achievements and well informed.

A very notable thing about his life was that he was ready to try everything - and did. After his 10 marathons, innumerable half marathons and 10-milers he also turned to walking, doing the Pennine and Lakeland fells and back-packing over the Himalayas as well as setting up an age-related record for fastest time on the 40-mile Osmotherly to Ravenscar walk.

After that he was on to cycle racing, into gliding from 1967 becoming Glider Chairman 1979-1982. In his retirement he motor-biked around the world, to Sydney (London to Australia via the Khyber Pass), across Europe and right round Sicily.

A man looking for challenges! Not that he wasn't in addition up for many things in his family and business life. Yes, ten children and a great number of grand-children.

When war broke out he immediately enlisted as an AB in Royal Navy destroyers, before long promoted - as lieutenant in a cruiser and an aircraft carrier.

Peacetime saw him running the family stationery business "Galbraith King & Co". This developed in size as a litho printing business to a staff of 60 in a new City factory. It is hard to see in that rather eccentric sportsman, the eminently respectable bowler-hatted businessman that did the daily calls.

He sold out in 1968 and retired in 1971. After retirement he remained faithful to the printing trade, as treasurer of the Court of his livery company, the Stationers' Company, from 1980 to 1994.

It was in the 1990s that he first became aware that he was a victim of Parkinson's, and as the years wore on he became less and less able to look after himself and entered a nursing home; where he was reported to be quite heroic during the pain and suffering.

Notwithstanding, this was a life lived to the full.

ROB WHALLEY (b 11.2.68)

Q. Having been competing amongst the top-class in the country all the time, it must become easier when you are able to run freely out at the front all the way, as you did in the British Masters?

A. "Absolutely. I completely agree. When you are running free at your best there is a sort of sadistic enjoyment. Every step you try to run harder and push something further. Even though I was in front of the other guys by a reasonable amount I still tried to run harder and get the best out of myself. That is what I have always tried to do and that is why it has kept me quite near the front in races.'

Q. Besides having run in the World cross country championships something I have noted you have run well in the National 12 stage road relays.

A. 'I have always seemed to have got fit at that time of year. I can remember beating Bashir Hussein the first time I ran the first leg. Bristol & West always put me on the 3rd or 4th so, I could then pull through and that is what I enjoy doing, chasing people. I run at my best when I force people to run at my pace rather that at their pace'

Q. This year you were 35th in the National and 34th in the Inter-Counties and World Trial.

A. 'I was sick at Christmas and it has taken me a long time to recover and it took a lot out of me. I had a couple weeks off traning hard'

Q. 'Your coach Mike Down seems a great boon to you.

A. Absolutely. He is always telling me to get out and train. He could tell I needed to go easy for a couple of weeks after my illness even though I wanted to push myself. Even after all my years running it was Mike who knew what to say. Mike had said I needed to wait. A lot of people could listen to his advice. He does not get the rewards but he does not seek them, just enjoys the pleasure of athletes running well.'

O What brought you into athletics?

A. 'When I was 11 in school in Marlborough and it was the first time I did a cross-country. I found I was quite good at it and was not any hardship for me."

NIKKI NEALON (b 27.2.68)

O. In the British Masters when did you make your move?

A. "We came round for the start of the second lap, which was about half-way and someone shouted out there were seven of us in a group. I thought there were too many and I did not want to risk it and pushed on and nobody really came with me which surprised me'

Q. The previous weekend you led all the way in the World Masters Half-Marathon Championships in France (79.08) so, did that effect your run'

A. "I had been just out of the medals in the cross country in the World Masters and then ran really well in the half marathon so. I

was not quite sure how I was going to run in the British Masters but once I got going it was alright'

Nikki Nealon has two young children and has taken a year off her teaching work and looks back at her athletics so far:-

'I started running at school at the age of seven and did make the first three in the County as a youngster but it was not till 1997 I actually started running better. I got a few international vests as a late senior (*She ran 27.27 for 5 miles on the road in 1999*).

Q. What was your most satisfying performance then?

A. "My first World Masters at San Sebastian when I won the 10,000m on the track (35.45.54-2005). I had never experienced anything like it, and then to actually win was fantastic."

Q. Where do you train?

A "On the road, sometimes on the country. I do reps and interval work in my training"

BRIAN RUSHWORTH HAS BEEN IN THE FIRST THREE IN THE 40-49 AGE GROUP IN THE BRITISH MASTERS CROSS-COUNTRY FOR SIX YEARS

Q-What makes him still have those steely qualities as a competitor having run for so many years?

A- "I just enjoy running on all surfaces. I love cross-country running and I look forward to the British Masters cross country championships and, my goal this year was to be in the first three 40-50 year olds and I have kind of achieved that.

Q-Was the biggest satisfaction in Brian's career making the World cross country championships then?

A-'Winning the Inter-Counties, the Northern, and the British 10k road championships when I was 35. Even coming third at Banbury. It gets even more special because it is harder to achieve. Another year, as you get older is a pretty long time and you can lose a hell of a lot of your fitness. You are hoping to be as strong as you were the year before. Barry Royden won last year but now he has had a bad year. However, he must have been in half descent shape as he would not have travelled up to compete in the race.

Q-Was it a big turning point for Brian Rushworth when he stopped working in the docks and became a teacher?

'I worked in the ship yards when I first started running. You just fit in your running, no matter what you do. You just get on with it. I have always been a hard trainer but a very sensible one as well. I would not like to think I did anywhere near as much as I used to when I was in the best form of my life quite a few years ago. I train like a 40 year old, sensibly I like to think. Once upon a time I would not dream of having a day off where as now I have every Friday off. I need to I think. I prefer to race and I am never a high mileage man anyway. Average 60-65 miles a week and I like to race quite often."

BUD BALDARO IS THE UK ATHLETICS' ENDURANCE COACH AND HEADS ATHLETIC COACH AT BIRMINGHAM UNIVERSITY

He ran just inside 50 minutes for 10 miles on the road and made the British Universities and Midland teams. At the London Marathon Exhibition he looked back on his life in athletics so far and his biggest athletics memory.

"Probably the Dudley to Bridgenorth.It was on a par with the London to Brighton relay. It was one of those relays that sadly declined in the age of lots and lots of cars. It was a fantastic event over 55 miles. It was a lovely event and started at the Tipton Club House, ran through Dudley to Bridgenorth and back to Tipton.

He added "I got into coaching too early and did a marathon far too late in my career. I got involved with the kids coaching and advising Tony Milosorov at an early age. I took 60-70 kids to the Gwent League for three years and was looking after the family as well."







he top British masters runners were Hayley Haining and Darran Bilton as veterans dominated the front of the elite women's race.

In only her second race at the distance 35-year-old Irina Mikitenko ran away from Svetlana Zakharova in the closing stages for a W35 1,2. "I was in such good shape I knew I could do it," Mikitenko told the London Marathon website but her time of 2:24:14 was nearly three minutes slower that Ludmilla Petrova's London veteran's best time.

Zakharova was competing in only her second race since giving birth about a year ago but her time secured a Russian team spot in the Beijing Olympics. That was Haining's aim too but she could not quite reel in her non-master compatriot Liz Yelling, winding up fifth master as Ludmilla Petrova and Constantina Dita also finished ahead.

Haining knocked more than a minute from her previous best with 2:29:18 in 12th overall. At one point she got within 13 seconds of Liz Yelling and a possible Beijing Olympic berth but it was not to be, despite again achieving the "A" selection standard.

Elsewhere the rest of the British W35s were well down with Adele Salt next, just under 2:50.

Top W40 Liz Hartney came home in 2:49:24, despite slowing in the wind and rain from 21 miles. The Reading Roadrunner told Athletics Weekly: "my legs were beginning to cramp and I slowed from 6:24 splits to 6:50 then 7:00 as I really died in the last miles but I kept on trying. We turned into the rain and wind at about 21-22 miles and I started to feel rough."

Sarah Gee, who broke through to take the National Masters cross-country silver medal, was close behind and Hartney said: "I thought she may have been closing." Darran Bilton repeated his triumph of 12 months earlier, just a week after anchoring Leeds City home to victory in the Northern 12-stage road relay. He ran 2:25:10, in 2007, but improved to 2:23:49 this year and passed long time masters leaders, Jason Simpson and then Dominic Bannister, who turned 40 on April 1st. Both tired dramatically in the closing stages after going through halfway in under 70 minutes more than two minutes clear of Bilton.

Ian Crampton was over five minutes faster in retaining his M45 title in 2:30:40, while last year's W45 winner Vicky Perry moved up to take W50 gold this time with 2:55:08.

British Masters Cross-Country champion Angela Copson proved that her victory at Banbury two weeks earlier was no fluke as her 3:16:54 took nearly seven minutes from Ann Chapman's 1996 best also set in London and finished 16 minutes clear of the next over 60 woman.

Carole Spong is a former W60 winner but here moved up to take the W65 group from Sue Lambert in 3:38:29. Her time was just three minutes outside Jose Waller's 20-year-old British best. Also close to a record was Iva Barr's W80 time of 5:50:45.





any people believe that the start of the modern Olympic movement was in Athens in 1896. However, the movement really owes its existence to a certain Dr. William Penny Brookes (born 1809) the town doctor of Much Wenlock in Shropshire. Who founded the Wenlock Olympic Society in 1850, and proceeded to hold a series of annual games from that year onwards.

Brookes was active in athletic and physical organizations throughout his life and was a member of the national Olympian association which was formed in 1865. The


modern Olympic connection was made in 1890, when the true founder of the modern games Baron Pierre De Corbertin, visited the Wenlock games.

The Baron wrote enthusiastically in his periodical "La Revenue Athletique" in December of that year: "And of the Olympic games which modern Greece has not yet revived, is not a Greek to whom one is in indebted but rather to Dr. W.P. Brookes (now aged 82)...... Still actively, vigorously organizing and animating them..... Athletics doesn't count many partisans as convinced as W.P. BROOKES".

Dr. Brookes pursued his aims of athleticism both Nationally and Internationally, and in 1859 a prize of £10.00 was sent by the Wenlock society to games held in Athens and the winner of these games being made an honorary member of the Wenlock Olympian Society.

In 1881 it was reported by the Greek newspaper "Clio" that Dr. Brookes was endeavouring to organize an international Olympic Festival to be held in Athens. The Greek embassy in London responded well to the idea of reinstating a modern Olympic games in Greece.

The dream came to fruition on the 6th of April 1896 when 60,000 people packed into the splendid marble stadium in Athens. The vast crowd was in a state of great excitement and pride as King George the first of Greece declared the Games open. Thousands more spectators climbed the hills which overlooked the open stadium, but were determined to see the start of the games for nothing.



Dr. Brookes magnificent obsession had therefore been achieved, unfortunately however Dr. Brookes died the preceding December, and could not witness the magnificent event.

So what were the 1850 Wenlock Games all about, well they were closer to the old rustic Country sports than the modern Olympiad. The first games included football, cricket, an old women's race for a pound of tea (a good prize in those days, and could this be the start of Masters Athletics), a blindfold, and a wheelbarrow race. The programme changed in

character, and in the 1870 more modern events began to appear in the program. Track and field events both flat and hurdles, putting the 32lb Stone, Hammer, High and Long jump and even the pole vault (the pole was balanced and climbed then).



The day of the Games was accompanied by much pageantry, started by a speech from BROOKES outside Much Wenlock's principle Inn the Gaskell arms. The victors of the events were presented with a OliveCrowns, elaborate medals and were read odes.

The famous Pentathlon was first introduced in 1868, with a prize of a silver medal valued at £14.00. The event in those days were: climbing a 55 ft rope, a running high leap, putting the 35 pound stone, running long leap and a foot race. The most famous winner of the event was Harold Langley, who represented Great Britain in the 1924 Olympic Games alongside Harold Abrahams and Eric Liddell (Chariots of Fire and all that!).

The games were revived in a 1950 following the Second World War marking the Centenary of the original games. The games continued intermittently and after a gap of several years were revived in the queen's jubilee year of 1977. Whilst in the 1980 special games was held to mark the founding of the Amateur Athletic Association.


In 1990 the society celebrated the centenary of the visit of Baron de Corberertin , with the Baron's grandnephew Geoffrey de Navacelle present. The guest of honor was the president of the British Olympic Association her Royal Highness the Princess Royal .

The early games were held on the racecourse at Much Wenlock, and are still held today at the local high school in the Shropshire town and are always held during the second week of July. Today's programme includes a full range of track and field events including the famous Wenlock pentathlon based on the Olympic pentathlon as is the BMAF pentathlon.


he gale force winds on this three lap course did not deter our top British Masters from producing excellent performances.

PRESTWOLD HALL **10K**, BMAF CHAMPIONSHIP, LOUGHBOROUGH, 29th JUNE

The 10k Championships were organised by the local club Barrow Runners and hosted by the Midland Masters; the race also incorporated the Inter-area match and the Midland Masters Championships.

The course consisted of two circuits of an airfield perimeter, with a lap of the village of Hoton in between. With the strong wind and the exposure of the course, record breaking attempts would be at a premium.

There were some very good attempts though; closest was Val Naylor (44.24) who was just four seconds shy of Myfanwy Louden's 0/65 best set in 1999. Angela Copson was thirty six seconds short of Carol Wolstenholme's 0/60 best of 40.12, set at Rothwell last April, and Daphne Ellmore ran thirty eight seconds over her own 0/55 best. In the Mens section, the evergreen Stephen Charlton (45.17) was only thirteen seconds outside his own 0/80 best set in Newtown last year.

Records aside, there were some close battles for medals with Paul Ward (32.50) just holding off Steve Platts for Gold by four seconds in the 0/40 age group. In the next age group 0/45, there was another close finish for the medals with Rob Hand (32.51) just eight seconds ahead of Bill Foster. Jon Cordingley an over 50 didn't let them have it all their own way finishing in an excellent 32.57. With just nine seconds between all five athletes, what a battle. In the 0/65 section Les Haynes finished twenty one seconds ahead of John Batchelor for Gold. Closest finishes in the Women's section were Liz Hartney twenty eight behind Nicki Nealon in the 0/40s and Wendy Joy thirty one behind Lesley Whiley in the 0/45s.

In the Team Sections, Reading Road Runners won the 0/35s with L. Hartney, L.Whiley and C. Bowker, and Bro Dysynni won the 0/55s with B. Jones, M. Griffiths and S. Symonds the scorers.

The Mens 0/40 section was won by Nene Valley Harriers with S. Beard, P.Thompson, I.Aunger and C. Clarke the scorers. Silver went to Redhill Road Runners, P. Newton, N. Cobb, C. Grayson and M. McHale.





event of the Masters calendar in this, the 21st running of the event that began in 1988 at Tring. Bristol & West, the course record holders for the main race, the 8-stage M40 event, made if four wins in a row, as Birchfield and Reading Road runners retained their W35 and W45 titles respectively while there were new winners in the other age groups.

The conditions were generally good for road running, although there were a few showers throughout the day. There were big margins of victory for some of the winning teams and this seemed to point to the difficulties that some clubs had in finding a quorum. Herne Hill, runners-up to Bristol for the last couple of years, had to back out a day before the race and M50 holders Telford were also scuppered when Tony Power was a late withdrawal.

Bristol fielded a balanced squad and, although they were held over the first half, they gained five minutes in the second, to win by a massive margin. Mick O'Doherty just took them to the front of the field at the half-distance and their stalwarts Martin Hula, Phil Parry and Dan Moore rounded it off for them. Their race was again run in conjunction with the M35 4-stage event, where North Shields Poly won gold after two second places in the first two events for this group.



lan Twaddle anchored them home and then said: "it gives a bit more motivation (to run as masters) as it gets hard running against the kids." However their event was once again poorly supported and calls into question the BMAF policy of having Masters starting at 35. There was also yet another vote among clubs on changing the age groups to M35-44, M45-54 etc but this appeared to be met with only patchy support.

O'Doherty, for his part, was certainly motivated as he sprinted up the final hill just ahead of the M35 winners as he finished his fourth leg ahead of their last one:

"I wanted to beat them to prove a point," he said after moving up from sixth overall on his leg with a 15:01 effort. O'Doherty's point was that that M35s should not be classed as Masters but, if they are, then keep them in a separate age category.

Phil Makepiece, with 14:54 on the fifth leg briefly led for Leicester Coritanian before they wound up with surprise silver medals. "Most of our team has been together for 30 years," said Makepeace after handing over to Joey Masterson.

Greg Wilson took holders Telford into the lead on the third stage of the M50 race with the group's second fastest time of 15:54 en-route to what most thought would be a repeat victory but as one of their number said: "Tony Power let us down." So their challenge petered out.

lan Furness for Dudley had 'won' the opening leg in a useful 15:16, as Wesham Road Runners were always in the top three before going on for a surprise victory over six times champions Oxford. Furness was pleased with his effort and said: "I would have liked to have done 15:10 as I ran 15:13 last year, but doing it on your own was hard. I hung back then went off uphill," said the 50-year-old.

Oxford's Brian Green had taken the lead on the final lap by the Jamboree Stone but Gary Pendlebury had other ideas for Wesham. He closed down the advantage and went ahead by Keeper's Pool to give Wesham their first ever National title.

"We were never any good in the 40's race and I only started running when I was 39," said

Pendlebury. "I played football but broke my leg; I wish I had taken up running when I was 15!"

Oxford were also surprised in the M60 race as Elswick came good thanks to solid runs from Steve White, Mark McNally and Harry Matthews, who were always well ahead.

Royal Sutton Coldfield had Richard Cashmore to thank for their first ever team title in this group as the 70-year-old collected his own first individual National medal with a fastest lap.



Dulwich Runners' Clare Elms led on the first leg of the W35 four-stage event with a fastest of the day time of 16:32, a minute clear of Birchfield's Amanda Dalkins.

Andrea Pickup, Amanda Smith and Debbie Walters then went right away for the holders to give them victory by over two minutes.

"I enjoyed it and am really pleased to get (team) silver and it makes it worthwhile as it's quite a long day," said Elms whose time was 10 seconds better than Walters' effort. "It's really hard when you are in front," said 39-year-old Walters who added: "we had three of the same team who won last year." With 55-year-old former senior international Ann Ford in their team, Redhill Road Runners took third.

W45 winners Reading Roadrunners were anchored home by another long time international Marina Stedman, who said after securing gold: "I looked round and saw the Blackpool girl (Bev Wright) catching me up." However her perception was wrong as she built on her team's lead for an eventual 35 seconds winning margin at the end of their three-lap race.

Stedman ran 17:58 but Jo Thompson was quicker with 17:48 for Team Bath, who led the group on the first leg. Dulwich Runners took the W55 class after early leaders Wolds Vets only had two runners and failed to finish a team. Their Daphne Elmore had 'won' the opening leg 'race' with 18:21 on the first stage, over a minute clear of Dulwich's Lis Pritchard and Bath's Zina Marchant. Barbara Brown kept Wolds in front on lap two before Ros Tabor saw Dulwich home for the gold medals, an improvement on their 2007 silvers.

Sprint Training for Masters or "Get Stronger!"

Conrad Phillips: UKA Senior (14) Coach. BWLA Instructor. Former GB Team Coach.

"You're not strong enough" are words I have used to every single athlete I have ever coached- and athletes I have coached have been to World, European, World Student and Olympic Championships (and won medals at all but Olympics).

A few years ago I spent some time in hospital. When I came home I could get from my bed to the shower only with the help of my son. As I recovered I used more and more weight training, started running again and eventually became interested in competing.

I'll give a few tips, as requested by OUR Editor and then return to the main theme at the end.*

Remember Bill Marlowe's "Coaching S's": <u>Strength</u> (and there are many types of strength) <u>Speed</u>, <u>Stamina</u>, <u>Skill</u>, <u>Suppleness and <u>Sychology</u> as it applies to you and your event.</u>

DO:

Know the purpose of your session before you start. Is it to gain Speed? To gain Stamina? To relax and freshen up for a race?

DON'T:

Say "What shall we do tonight, lads?" when you get to the track or gym.

DO

Use free weights and not machines.

DON'T:

(1) Never bench press alone! Always use a spotter.

Remember that <u>Suppleness</u> reduces with age (making stretching an important component of your training) DON'T:

Stretch too much before competition or training.

Remember that agility declines with age DON'T

Be afraid to try different types of training; too much of the same thing will cause motor-stereotypes and over use/repetitive-strain injuries: variety is the spice of sprinting!

DO

Use free weights; hurdle chopping; running drills WITH ANKLE WEIGHTS; punch bag; speed ball; cycling on the road or static exercise-bike; sledge and tyre dragging; free weights; medicine ball; soft grass to warm up; free weights; training exercises from other sports (especially SAQ from Rugby football and circuit training from boxing); two-ball catch with your children and grandchildren; dance or aerobics classes; mini-circuits (painful but very effective!), skipping; oh, yes- and free weights!

Train through an injury: if you have a repertoire of training techniques and methods if/when you get injured, you'll be able to rest the injury but keep training the rest of you!

DO

Remember the link between a strong upper body and fast powerful legs is the strength of your mid-section, so use back, oblique's and abdominal strengthening work throughout: you can even incorporate some 'core stability' training. Having said that, make certain that all your drills and exercises are done with good posture: long waist, tall neck, shoulders down and back, pelvis tucked under (ask a good ballet teacher about the "First Position".

aim is to get stronger all over- so the 'three sets of ten', for example, may not be appropriate- especially if you do use many exercises; Greg Dunson and all the other athletes I coach use as many as twenty different resistance exercises in a weights session- but usually one set only- and if we can do twelve reps of an exercise then it's too easy and we increase the load. For runners I do not advocate squats or dead lifts because: one mistake and you've killed your back or your knees!

Throwers of course must use squats and the Olympic lifts but don't you attempt Olympic lifts unless you are taught the correct technique by a **BWLA** qualified coach. For runners: weights for upper body only: use ankle weights and resistance running for the legs.

Use the multi-joint exercises illustrated in preference to single joint exercises if you are pressed for time.



Begin with 1Kg ankle weights (any more and you'll be training for something else, any less and you won't build up the strength). Do each drill once only and for NO more than 10m. Build up over many weeks until you can do each drill for 30m. Do not actually RUN in a/wts. Do the drills every running session you do throughout the year- don't use the a/wts in a week before competition. Persons who weigh less than 50kg would probably be better off using ½ Kg wts.



Tyre dragging – no more than 12Kg, even for big strong people.

Start with only a minute of skipping on the first day you try it- and increase the amount by one minute increments as the days go by- otherwise you'll damage your calf muscles and Achilles tendons- and they take a LONG time to heal! Teach yourself lots of different rhythms, speeds, steps and tricks- even if it takes you months to learn.

Please note that there are literally hundreds more Suppleness, Skill and Strength exercises- far more than I can include in this article. I therefore suggest that you read

reat Britain and Northern Ireland secured a famous victory at Ashford, in at the annual Interland challenge.

Maurice Doogan this year enjoyed a favourable response and assembled a strong team that included two Commonwealth Games Medalists in the squad.

The men's team dominated the sprints with Darren Scott winning both. Britain filled the first four places in the 100 metres and the first three in the 200.

The French and Belgians had the upper hand in the men's middle distance races, with a Marc Turner getting very close in the 800 and Peter Barker securing a fine second at 1500.

The hurdles gave France victories, whilst World Record Pentathlon holder Andy Lewis, and Claude Peter Thomas came in second and third. In at the 400 hurdles Glenn Gray, Neil Tunstall and Jon Tilt finished in positions second to fourth.

In the throws Great Britain won four of the five events. Mark Wiseman winning the Discus with 51.80, and the Shot with 15.19. The Midland Counties Hammer champion John Pearson was a winner in the weight with 17.80, and Simon Bennett did likewise with 64.79 in the javelin.

Andy Lewis was our only winner in the jumps with a windy

6.78 in the long jump.

Then came the icing on the cake with the British winning both relays, in the shorter relay the British squad of the Darren Scott, Mark Dunwell, Jim Tipper & Tony Leigh set a new world record of 42.51 seconds, beating the time set by the United States of America.

With the men winning their match by 10 points the women had to do better, and indeed they did.

Kay Reynolds was a winner in the 100 metres and the 100 metres Hurdles.

Nina Anderson won both the 400 and 800 metres, with Brits in second and third in both races.

Birchfield's Debbie Walters secured good wins at 1500 and 3000 metres, and Nicki Nealon ran third at 5000.

Michelle Thomas who won a silver at the Kuala Lumpar Commonwealth Games (1st Leg 4x400 Metres), continues her winning form this season with a win over 400 Hurdles and also anchored in the relay squad.

The Throws victors came from across the Channel, but great second places were achieved by Janet Smith (WT). Jo Davidson (HT) and Linda Rawlins (JT).





he outdoor Pentathlon was revived this year using the Horspath Stadium at Oxford which is rapidly becoming the home of BMAF Combined Events.



Despite the weather the atmosphere between athletes and officials was as always in combined events something special.




