ATHLETICS MATTERS!

here seems to be a concerted effort by those who organise athletics meetings throughout the world to make the sport more 'user friendly'! Dwindling crowds and falling television audiences throughout the

world, outside of global championships, has put our sport under pressure to satisfy spectators' lust for instant gratification! 20/20 cricket has done it to a certain extent in a sport where traditions are long. But can the 20/20 mentality transfer to track and field athletics?

The recent European Team Championships was a curate's egg with some very bad bits in it. One false start, 'devil take the hindmost' in distance races, 4 attempts in throws and horizontal jumps with a 'showcase' of the final round with only four athletes from the original field of twelve and a maximum of four failures in the vertical jumps. The jury is still out the success and failures of the two day meeting but from a spectator point of view I would guess that there were some pretty unhappy customers in Portugal.

But is this the way our sport has to go if spectators need a 'quick fix'? Do we need to cut down the length of an athletics meeting in order to create a product which is sustainable in the face of other sports that are competing for sponsors and television airtime? Maybe it is time we put some serious thought to this predicament in relation to Masters' track and field. I think we have to accept that outside of the Championships athletics is a hard sell to television and the general public so the question is how to we market ourselves to a wider audience?

I noticed at the recent USA Championships that they had a number of Masters events on the programme alongside all of their mainstream athletes who were trying to qualify for the World Championships. This initiative brought the 'wonders' of Masters performers to a much wider audience at the stadium and on national television. Superb! UKA and their event organisers Fast track would I am sure lend a friendly ear to <u>any</u> initiatives which will make our sport more watchable and marketable.


On a more mundane note I am back in training! As my 60th birthday beckons so do the lighter hammer and discus. This is an incentive if ever there was! It has been a steep learning curve once more but one which I have enjoyed immensely. My closest friends are all (former!) athletes. Men I met in my teens and we have been competing against each other periodically for over 45 years now! These are men with more spare parts than Halfords! Knees, backs, shoulders, cartilage and even a bit of a bulls bone in the neck for one of the guys! I jest not!

A number of important lessons have been given to me in the process of my rehabilitation into competitive athletics. Firstly and possibly most importantly it is fun. I smile a lot and the physical process of training is a real stress buster! I certainly do not think about work or who is suing who! We have a nice group of throwers who train down at the magnificent Thames Valley Track at Eton including Masters Champion Chris Melluish and believe me it really gets the juices flowing when a training session turns into a competition! Fantastic.

The second lesson is just as important. How I train. There is no point in trying to do what I did thirty years ago so I am gentle with myself. I have identified my weaknesses and am trying to put them right through a methodical regime of conditioning training. It works especially now that I fully understand that I am not indestructible! Two of my fellow throwers, one with a new artificial hip the other with a new knee are gleeful at the process of training again, re-learning the event, pushing the body to limits which have a real benefit not just for chucking a hammer but for life itself!

I now look forward to my next training session even to the point of thinking about it immediately I wake up! I do not think I have had so much fun in the last fifteen years or so due to a sense of getting off my behind and doing something I fell in love with in 1964. Prior to this even visits to the gym did not have the same uplifting experience of body and soul. I did feel as though 'my get up and go, had got up and gone'. I have Masters Athletics to thank for this!

nce again it was a successful year for BMAF members in competitions at home and abroad, the "credit" crunch though has hit us with the overall entries in competitions slightly falling and particularly competitions abroad, where expenses are a lot higher due to the exchange rate in the Eurozone.

The 2008 AGM produced a proposal for an independent BMAF "National Anti-Doping Organisation". This was discussed by the B.M.A.F Executive and Council, and a sub committee was formed to look at what had been proposed, Following the resignation of Maurice Doogan the Vice Chairman was to co-ordinate this with Dr Stephen Peters and so far nothing has transpired, and as you can see from the correspondence of U.K.A and U.K. Sport it is not possible for B.M.A.F to form its own Anti-Doping Organisation, I enclose parts of the responses from U.K.A. and U.K. Sport which outlines the position of masters anti-doping:

"Since receiving your email I have had the opportunity to speak to UKS about this and they were surprised at the suggestion that UKS had agreed to set up a committee for the management of TUEs for Masters. In the past

UKS has made it clear to me that they are responsible for TUEs of athletes in the NRTP and Masters' TUEs do not fall within this remit.

In fact the Masters TUEs which need to be authorized are those for athletes who compete internationally in Masters Championships. For these athletes the WMA has made it clear that TUEs need to be authorized by them in order to be valid for this purpose. Given this WMA requirement it seems that any domestic TUE committee looking at Masters' TUE would be irrelevant as those athletes who are preparing for World or European Champs would need to also apply to WMA in order for them to comply with the requirements of WMA. Has there been any progress with this matter since you emailed me? What is the next action which needs to be taken? In the meantime we shall continue to submit Masters' TUEs to the WMA".

This is an internal British Masters issue so it is not something which is on my radar. As discussed previously, British Masters is not recognised as part of the National Anti-Doping Program which means that the issue at British Masters falls outside of the remit of UK Sport.

I hope this clarifies my position on this.

This outlines the position of Anti-Doping and T.U.E. in the UK; I have not included all of the emails from U.K.A. and U.K. Sport as there are several pages, but suffice to show that. It is not possible for B.M.A.F to form its own Anti-Doping Organisation.

BMAF once again are the Affiliated body to W.M.A. for "Masters Athletics "under the umbrella of U.K.A, and have to follow the Rules of W.M.A., who follow the rules of I.A.A.F with any recommended modification, I.A.A.F Rules and WMA Rules state that there can be only be one Affiliated body in any one country, and the I.A.A.F. National Body controlling Anti-Doping matters is our Affiliated body U.K.A. W.M.A. have now completed their Anti-Doping Rules and these will be fully incorporated following approval by the affiliates at the General Assembly in August. These are on the B.M.A.F/W.M.A. websites for those interested.

On the domestic scene overall competition has been good but there has been an overall drop in entries, and this in part comes from the state of the financial market.

There has been an overall drop in membership in clubs; this is also a fact in all realms of athletics. The influx of M35's is still rising, so both at B.M.A.F. and Club level we have to look at ways of stopping this decline in membership. This needs to be taken seriously by all concerned. There is a complacency in members and officials as to what is happening in the various clubs, and this has a big overall effect on the Masters movement, I am sure that many complain about what goes on at your clubs, but how many actually try to give a helping hand..

Following many complaints from members , non communication, no responses to emails, from our travel agent W.G.T, the B.M.A.F Council and Executive (Nov, Jan, March meetings) decided that we would cancel the contract with W.G.T. which ran till the end of June, and seek a new Travel Agent. The contract with WGT was cancelled in May and a new travel agent has been appointed.

Corporate & Sporting Events Management Limited. They will be in particular looking at: providing B.M.A.F. members with quality accommodation at moderate prices, preferably using a common hotel for the majority of bookings. They will provide accommodation and flight packages and accommodation only packages, so we look forward to a new challenge on the travel front, the new company will be advertising on the B.M.A.F website and in "Masters Athletics".

Since the resignation of Maurice Doogan as Track and Field secretary, duties were shared by members of the B.M.A.F. In January a majority the B.M.A.F. Executive decided to let Maurice continue with the organisation of the coming events until the A.G.M.

Overall the championships have gone well with an overall drop in entries, except for the Outdoor track and field where we have had an increase from 2008. We had a large loss in income from the 2008 Outdoor championships and the 2009 Indoor championships due mainly to the reduced numbers of entries, as well as other organisational costs. This has been discussed by the B.M.A.F. Executive and they will be looking at possible savings for in the future...

BMAF have on going talks with U.K.A. and have a reasonable relationship, and the new council will continue this, with the possibility of support in looking for sponsors. Once again they will continue to look after our Ant-Doping matters.

The International calendar has so far been reasonable for BMAF with 196 entries in the E.V.A.A. Indoor Championships in Ancona, 69 entries in Non Stadia

Championships, Arhus, and 269 in the W.M.A. Stadia championships in Lahti in July. In 2010 the W.M.A. Indoor championships will be in Kamloops, Canada and the European Championships in Nyiregyhaza, Hungary.

Following the reported cancellation of the Interland in December which was partly due to costs, we were asked in March by France and Belgium to continue for 2009 as the arrangements for the 3 teams had been made, this was formerly put to B.M.A.F. Council and agreed as long as it was not at a cost to B.M.A.F. We struggled to get a full team at short notice but went to Compiegne, France and finished 3rd but had a good time, good team spirit, good performances and an overall good weekend. Well done and thanks to all the team, who with the other teams wish to continue the Interland. (A matter for the BMAF Council)

Finally, I have mentioned several time in reports the lack of B.M.A.F. officials on the various masters bodies, we have within W.M.A myself, and on the I.A.A.F. Masters Committee Bridget Cushen.

As one of the major affiliates in Europe it is important that we look to have representation on these bodies, this is where many decisions are made on master's issues, and we need to be there to help shape these decisions.

The E.V.A.A. have made several changes that have not been recommended by its affiliates and have no regard for the athletes, W.M.A. have also in their competitions set up irregular changes with the LOC in mind and not the athletes.


For the coming W.M.A. General Assembly we have/had no members from B.M.A.F. qualified to run for posts, and this could be the same for the E.V.A.A. Council in 2012.

We need to have officers coming through who are interested in making a difference for the future of masters internationally, so starting from club level lets see a few more new faces, if you want to make a difference.

For me I have spent the past 21 years working for Masters home and abroad and I feel I have made a difference to the movement worldwide, and for B.M.A.F. as Chairman following on from previous chair persons I think there has been a continuation of dialogue with various bodies and a more open link with U.K.A., this needs to be maintained.

I wish the New Chair all the success in the future, and to you the members the usual, good health, fitness and success in your competitions.

Jack Fitzgerald although mentioned in the European Indoor results in the 5k Road Walk, also won a second Bronze in the Indoor 3,000 metres Walk his time 30:45.22.



The President, Executive Officers, Club Secretaries and over 60 members attended a briefer than anticipated AGM meeting held in the Alexander Stadium on the first evening of the Track & Field Championships despite the humidity and the final events still in progress in the arena. Amongst the apologies for absence was one from Keith Whitaker, Life Vice President, the first he has missed since the formation of the BMAF in 1975.

In his opening address, the President congratulated all members for what they have achieved over the past year. He thanked the Committee and all the Clubs for their efforts. He found being President very interesting although he does get some very peculiar emails! He came into athletics purely for enjoyment, but has noticed that there is some animosity creeping into our sport. Masters athletics is all about enjoyment; that is why we all do it, he added, (applause). He would not like to see the "Devil take the hindmost" or other changes come into masters' athletics.

The Chairman's Report gave rise to some lively exchanges from the floor - Jeremy Tigar, SCVAC, on anti doping, who complained that for the third year he has been prevented from raising a full discussion on this issue. Abi Onatade, also SCVAC, on the selection procedure for nomination of candidates for WMA or EVAA Council. Other questions included accessibility of the Constitution to all members and why Any Other Business was not an AGM Agenda item.

The Treasurer said that for the first time in five years he had to report a financial loss. A £6,055 Championships deficit on the year up to 31 May, mainly on the Track & Field, the Interland (which we hosted), the 2009 Indoors and the 2008 Multi Events. Other Championships made smaller or no profit. Membership dropped by 100 and Bank interest is £200 down. Total expenditure was down, but he warned the meeting that following the decision taken at the AGM last year to hold not less than four Executive meetings per year, expenditure is certain to increase. Advertising revenue from Masters Athletics fell by £1,800, donations by £387 and income from the 300

Club is £200 less. He paid tribute to the Editor Brian Owen and to Danny Mullane for their efforts, but the drop in income is outside their control. The Treasurer urged those present to continue to buy shares in the 300 Club. He proposed a 50p increase in the Affiliation Fee from £4 to £4.50 effective from 1 June 2010. The proposal was carried unanimously.

The Chairman, Winston Thomas, announced that he was not seeking re-election and Arthur Kimber now takes on this role. Kevin Dillon, NVAC, travelled down from Manchester especially for the AGM, and is now the Vice Chairman, Policy & International Affairs. Addressing the Meeting, he said he would be adopting an "open and friendly approach." The vacant Track & Field Secretary's post saw Maurice Doogan returned to the Executive after Mike Hanson told the meeting he had no desire to oppose Maurice and he was withdrawing his nomination, he had only offered to help when this very important position was left vacant. John Hall, VAC, now takes over from Eric Horwill as Race Walking Secretary. All other Officers were re-elected unopposed.

There was a standing ovation for the outgoing Eric Horwill retiring after serving six years as the first Race Walking Secretary. Prior to 2003, Race Walking was part of the Non Stadia Secretary's remit. Winston Thomas's long association with the BMAF was applauded and appreciated, as a former Track & Field Secretary, organising fund raising raffles and his time as Chairman.

Secretary's Report

Multi Events to be dropped from the European Championships?

It has come to our notice that at a European Veterans Athletic Association Council meeting in January, the format of future Track & Field Championships was discussed. Apparently it was decided to reduce the Championships from 11 to 10 days and that the Heptathlon and Decathlon is to be cancelled. The Pentathlon therefore will be the only multi event available to the hundreds of dedicated all-rounder's. Furthermore, the introduction of medal standards, fees for the relay teams and a "project of pre-veterans" was on the agenda.

If these major structural changes were implemented without prior consultation with EVAA Affiliates, not only does it go against the very ethos and concept of masters athletics, but it brings into question whether the elected Council members are infringing the EVAA Constitution at 2 **Purpose** 4 "Ratification of the IAAF and WMA regulations as well as all directives" WMA Regions follow WMA Rules. At this stage we have only seen extracts from the January meeting and we do not know the reasoning behind it. I emailed the EVAA President and Secretary in May for clarification and confirmation, no reply has yet been received. WMA Regions meet at World Championships, in Lahti EVAA is scheduled to meet at 09.00 on 31 July in the Lahti Congress Centre. Please check on the BMAF Notice Board in Lahti for update or talk to one of the five Delegates – Kevin Dillon, Maurice Doogan, John Hall, Arthur Kimber or myself. I have no doubt our bifurcated members will be strongly opposed.

A ary Webb, long standing Cardiff club member and athletics fanatic, passed away peacefully two days ago after finally succumbing to the cancer that she had contracted three years ago. Her final athletics honour was to receive Welsh Athletics' Meritorious Award for services to athletics in Wales which was taken to her by club chairman and Welsh Athletics Vice-President John Penny. Mary had been involved in athletics since competing as a schoolgirl and joined Cardiff AAC in 1973 when she brought daughter Sue to the club. She and her family (husband

Brian and subsequently son in law Rob Hooper) have been members ever since and have all made important contributions to club life.



Mary never stopped competing and regarded athletics as one of the most important elements in her life. Her last competition was only two years ago when, aged 71, she took part in an indoor Masters competition at UWIC. She was very successful as an athlete in the Masters category and her proudest moment was when she took the 200m gold medal in the European Masters Indoor Championships (60-64 age group) in Birmingham. Alongside the gold medal

she also took the bronze in the 60m in the same championships. She was an ever present competitor in Masters Competitions and gathered an impressive collection of medals, including many British championship gold medals. She even took up race walking at one stage. Not content with training and competing, Mary was a great organiser, taking up the reins of the Welsh Masters Association where, for more than 10 years, she organised the track league and championships. This role will stay in the family as daughter Sue is to carry on the work. Within the club, Mary did a stint as Welsh League team manager and was also a grade 2 field official. Mary spent her last days at Holme Towers, Penarth and Sue, Brian and Rob cannot praise too highly the care she received there as well as the skill of the doctors at Velindre Hospital.

Oldest British Olympian turns 100

Britain's oldest Olympian Godfrey Rampling, who won medals at the 1932 and 1936 Games in Los Angeles and Berlin, has reached his 100th birthday.

Rampling first competed for Great Britain in 1932 and anchored the 4x400m relay team to silver behind the US.



Four years later he ran a superb second leg to overtake his American rivals and help secure gold for his team.

He will celebrate the landmark with his family, including film actress daughter Charlotte, in Bushey, Hertfordshire. "How old did you say I am? A hundred next week? Really? Are you sure? Good Lord, I'm surprised anyone remembers. Rampling narrowly missed out on individual medals at both Games, but won in the 440 yards at the British Empire Games in 1934.

The British Olympic Association was among those offering its congratulations to Rampling on his century. "As our oldest living Olympic gold medallist his achievements both on the track, at the 1932 and 1936 Olympic Games, and off the track during his time in the Royal Artillery are much to be proud of," a spokeswoman said. He retired from the Royal Artillery as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1958 after 29 years' service.

We have received the news that Laurence Dordoy was killed in a Motorcycle accident near Romford in May. An obituary will be published in the next edition.


The British and Irish XC has now been relocated to Perry Barr, in Birmingham.

RACE WALKING by ERIC HORWILL

I joined MVAC 1973 initially as a competitor, but shortly after became an official and organiser. Walking was included at this time, and over the years gradually became a more integral part of Masters Athletics. Up to this time track walks were part of the track and field programme, but road walks came under the road running umbrella.



It was clear that there was a need for a separate Race Walking Secretary, and since my appointment we have now what is a full programme of race walking events.

The track 3k and 5k races are held with the main track and field championships, whilst the 10k championship is held with a suitable for event during the summer season. The 5k Road championship is held with the Horwich 5k and 10k, 20k & 30k Championships are held with suitable walks in the U.K as is the long distance Championship. In addition England Athletics Masters Association promotes a 3k International event once or twice a year.

Internationally we have a wonderful record in at both European and World championships, race walkers are regularly bringing in a good haul of Medals.

In 2004 the world Non Stadia event in New Zealand incurred a huge financial loss, since then there has been no 30k world level, which is regrettable.

With an increasing number of older athletes taking part it is essential that we stop age discrimination there have been too many examples of this in recent international championships.

An interesting development is the proposed bid for the 2O13 European Non Stadia in Swansea, although the planning is at an early stage it appears to be a very realistic project.

I have much enjoyed the experience of working with officials and delegates at the B.M.A.F. and I would like to thank them for their help and cooperation during the six years I have been involved as Secretary. Similarly I have enjoyed my duties as a member of the Management team. We are so lucky that the vast majority of our athletes appreciate our efforts.

I am sure that John Hall will prove a more than adequate replacement for me. He has been a considerable help in assisting over the last 12 months.

I am not intending to disappear completely and will give John any help I can and particularly in the next twelve

months. I hope everyone will give support to our hardworking officials and administrators.

Please remember we are all unpaid volunteers who make Masters Athletics, successful and enjoyable for all.



or the third year in succession the British Masters Championships were held at Alexander Stadium, Birmingham, and well received at the centrally placed venue. A lot of that was due to the Meeting Director Maurice Doogan, the new BMAF Track & Field Secretary and his team of officials. Regarding Maurice Doogan's large input Colin Simpson, a founder of the Midland Veterans in 1969, remarked:- " Maurice has been marvellous. I don't know how the hell he does it! He would be a hard act to follow"



The weather was good throughout the two days of the 39th Championships but the minus wind did not help the sprinters.

The revelation of the meeting was Angela Copson (62), who achieved a W60 British 1500m record on the Saturday. On the Sunday, before the clocks struck 10.o'clock and many athletes and spectators were away from the stadium, she broke the W60 5000 World record and, just to cap it all in the afternoon won the W60 800 in a Championship Best performance.

In the 5000 Copson battled all the way with experienced Janette Stevenson and W55 winner Susan Cooper. Copson pulled away from her rivals on entering the home

straight for the last time and wiped away the World Best time of 19:14.8 with a time of 19:04.3. Stevenson was also well inside the old record with 19:05.70. Angela said "I knew if I was going to get there I was going to have to work for it. I hung on like I did yesterday in the 1500. Being a longer distance I thought I would give myself a chance'

Coached recently by Ian Wilson, the English cross country Team Manger for 1989-95 she added "Track is something new to me because of training for "London" in the winter. I just need a little time to settle" She has already achieved a British age Marathon record as well as running in her county cross country team in the Inter-Counties and, she has only been running two and a half years!




Irie Hill, who was third in the Commonwealth Pole Vault in 2002, she achieved a World W40 Best of 3.65 in Melbourne on the 22nd of March this year, always looks physically the part with her preparation and execution. She achieved a height of 3.40 for a Championship Best Performance but added "I got a migraine and should not have jumped with a migraine but I was here and the weather was so nice."

Allan Williams improved on his M55 British pole vault record with 3.85. "I tried for 3.90 but it does get hard to do it again, although the record was an easy mark. That is the next stage in the game and you are on your own. This is a nice meeting to set the record as well. It's accepted straight away. It is in front of all our peers as well and nice conditions, some of the best we have had all year. It shows what is possible when it is conducive"

Neil Griffin, despite being a diabetic and taking a lot of prescription drugs has not lost any of his edge and has slimmed down to a more manageable weight. He won the M60 Shot Putt with 14.02, discus 50.15 and weight with 17.26.

Steve Whyte (M45), Michael Fenton (M50) and Mike Small (M55) all won several throwing events. Regarding the women there were two prolific performers Vilma Thompson (W55) won the shot/javelin/hammer and weight and Elizabeth Sissons (W60) shot/javelin and had several second places.

Spare a thought for the oldest lady of 88, Mary Wixey, who is still an enthusiastic competitor with 1.49 long jump, triple jump 3.17, Shot 3.40 and discus 7.75, She remarked about the difficulties you have to compete " I had to change my flat shoes from doing the discus to put on my spikes for the triple jump!"



Colin Brand (M65), who obtained three seconds in the field, had the distinction of being the Father of Darrel Brand who achieved a M45 British javelin record of 63.85 down at Norman Park in Division 2 of the British League on the Saturday. That was when the BMAF Championships were on also and Darrel, was made "Man of the Match" having done a good shot putt too.

Triple winners in the sprints included Doctor Stephen Peters M55 100/200/400..He is getting a lot of satisfaction from his work with the British Olympic Cycling teams and then there is Terry Bissett (M65), who powered himself to three victories in the sprints. He played football before taking up athletics at 60. The football included playing for Wimbledon reserves a couple of times, when they were a top team!

There were some interesting performers in the Women's sprints. Gia Skervin won the W35 100 in 13.15. She took up sprinting three years ago and has four children. Kay Reynolds of Radlet.A.C, who won the W40 100 in 13.3 and the 80 hurdles in 12.02, said she had run 11.6 for the British record, which was not ratified in the Oxfordshire Championships last year as it was a hand time.. The current record is 11.68. Reynolds has been an Olympic and Commonwealth trialist in the past.

Julie Money (W45) who ran 13.40 beat Kirsten King (13.57) and then went off the following day to do six

events for her club but Kirsten King stayed and won the 200m well in 27.59.

Helen Godsell (W55) won her 100 in 14.11 from two who won other events Joylyn Saunders Mullins and Caroline Powell however. Godsell said afterwards she did not feel satisfied with the result particularly and added

"In Ancona I ran the World 60m record of 8.46. I felt that was the most satisfying. That was my perfect race. I don't think I can better that".


Always an interesting man to talk to is Tony Wells, who appears only train very little, as his job is being a busy Headmaster with Farnborough School of Technology. He feels he is always racing between injuries these days. He ran 3rd in the M60 400 and was first in his age group M60 in the 100 and 300 hurdles.

Flight Lieutenant, Greg Dunson was incredible last year with his M40 110 high hurdles time of 14.7 in the Championships and this year he did 15.53 as an M45. He has been coached over the years by 'Super Vet' Conrad Phillips, and Dunson, has won the R.A.F. high hurdles Championships at least seventeen times.



David Bedwell has won a lot of British Masters middle distance races over the years and looked good doing 2:12.17 for 800m as an M55. Also coming away in the straight in his M70 event was Arthur Kimber, the newly elected BMAF Chairman. The most exciting middle distance race was the M50 1500 won by John Thompson (4:33.74). The Scotsman really had to work hard to beat Mark Eustace, Alex Rowe and Bill Foster who stuck in the leading group most of the way. Thompson remarked

"I knew I wanted to play it tactically as I was never in a good position and, had to chop about a bit till half way down the straight.' He added "My Highland Games running is my favourite running". That latter fact also applies to George Smith (62) who won the M60 800 in 2:24.01. After his British win last year he went straight on to win the handicap races at Jedburgh and Langholm over 800m.



Mark Williams (M40) was first in the 3k and 5k walks and hoped to do well in the UK Championships. Diane Bradley, who won the W45 walk in a British record of 26:32.57, said she had done 26.04 at Tonbridge. She started walking 3½ years ago following running injuries. That was something her coach Pete Selby suggested.

To some people 35-40 is too young for men to be Masters and certainly that has applied in many cases but, those coming into veteran competition like Paul Freary, who won a Masters half marathon. Also David Morwood from Northern Ireland, who won the last Home International cross country and now at 38 have, possibly, given the age group more credibility. Morwood ran a personal best of 15.03 for 5k, at Alexander Stadium which was a respectable time for that age as a Master **but** unfortunately due to some track infringements he was disqualified.

Several 400 hurdlers impressed, Neil Tunstall's run of 58.73, ahead of 400m flat winner Jonathan Tilt (59.34). That was in the M45 bracket which was good. To prove the point about competing as Masters Joe Lloyd, who

won the M35 at 36 years of age in 55.43.talked about the 35-40 age group and his personal opinion says something:- "I ran the 400 at the time British record holder Iwan Thomas and Jamie Baulch were running but then, in my mid 30's I was tempted to give up, as I was not quite good enough any longer to make the AAA's but, as I enjoy running, I looked at the Masters to carry on as it is brilliant stuff"



MASTERS dominated the leading positions in the women's race with not only Irina Mikitenko retaining her title but also with fellow W35 Mara Yamauchi setting a new British W35 best ever performance of 2:23:12 in second overall. "I finally got under 2:25. I knew I had made a big improvement in my training in the last year," said the 35-year-old, adding of the last few miles: "It felt like an arena on the way home because all I could hear was 'Come on Mara'. Now, I'm going to celebrate and have a rest."


The Olympic Marathon sixth placer was joined in the record breaking stakes by both Vicki Perry, who posted a new over 50 mark of 2:53:15 and 61-year-old Angela Copson who bettered the W60 mark with 3:14:51, as both

retained their London titles and in faster times than in 2008. Darran Bilton, in 25th overall, notched up his third consecutive veteran victory in 2:23:32, one of the few British men to excel irrespective of age. The 42-year- old finished



some 90 seconds clear of Dallam's Eddie Simpson and was tenth Brit overall. Bilton ran the opening 5km split in 16:23, half a minute clear of the rest of the veterans, then past the 10km marker in 33:10 before hitting the half-marathon mark in 71:11 after

a succession of 5km splits around 17:15.



In the second half of the race, covered in 72:21, Bilton maintained a steady pace then putting in a 17:06 split to the 40km point, before sprinting home. However, the Leeds

City man was ill before the event after a good outing in the 12-stage relay at Sutton Park. "My London build up went perfectly up until the Wednesday before, and then I came down with a bad cold and was prepared on Friday not to run. But it has been my focus for so many weeks I had to risk it and though I know I was capable of a faster time, it all came good in the end," said the 42-year-old. "To get the 'first M40' trophy for the third year in a row is a delight. Now its back to training for Edinburgh in five weeks time," added Bilton.

Former M40 winner Nicky Martin moved up to the over-45 group and headed all but two of the M40s when taking his new age group 2:28:41 from Ian Crampton and Dave Buzza. M50 top runner Gavin Stevens had more than six minutes to spare on 2007 over-50 winner Gary Payne as he won in 2:32:06.

Whilst Yamauchi improved her own British W35 mark of 2:25:03, set in Tokyo in the autumn by nearly two minutes the W40 winner, Lyudmila Petrova was also well up and in tenth spot in the women's elite race. She also took the veteran prize money with 2:27:42, to go with her open winnings.

The mass start saw most of the women competing and British interest was set up by Sarah Gee, who took the W45 class by ten minutes from Deborah Steer in 2:45:35, but there were more records behind.



Perry took the Women's over-45 medal in 2007 and was the W50 winner last year but improved, by more than two minutes this time, to break Ann Roden's previous British best of 2:54:21, from Boston in 2000.

"This was my third attempt at the record having failed last year in London and then again in Berlin. This year my objective was to enjoy the race and not to worry about the record. The strategy worked as I didn't have any bad patches. I came through 13.1 in 1.26.14 so knew that I just had to keep that pace going. Somehow I managed to stop my own stopwatch accidentally before the 19 mile marker and didn't know that I was going to break the record until I was running down The Mall and I could see the clock showing 2.52. I am still in a state of shock!"

New W50 Claire Donald had hopes of taking the age group but was injured just two weeks before the event. W55 winner Sally Musson has been injured on and off for the last few years but despite this and her husband's serious illness managed to put some training together to take the age group from Pamela White in 3:11:39. "I think I did as well as could be expected given that I had not trained for it. I was aiming at under 3.15.It was not a good time by my standards but good given the circumstances," said Musson.

Copson, the odds on W60 favourite, expressed herself disappointed with her time. Coach Ian Wilson had told the Rugby and Northampton runner that a faster time was possible, so Copson was a little down in the dumps after the race: "Although it was a P.B. for me today, I can't help feeling a little disappointed. I wanted to get nearer to 3:10 but it wasn't for me today. I enjoyed the run and felt good, so there was no excuse."

There was however considerable satisfaction for the multi-distance British record holder as she added: " I get to keep my position as first over-60 and my time makes me an elite runner, if only by nine seconds so I don't feel too bad."

In the older men's age groups Peter Newton came out on top of the M65s, in 3:08:09, despite troubles throughout the race: "I was not particularly pleased with my time and I did not start with the 'good for age' but in the pack at the Blue Start," said the Portsmouth runner. "This was probably a mistake, as the first three miles were spent weaving between slower runners and triggered a knee problem I had been nursing for a few weeks. None the less I set off aiming for the three hour mark but laboured from about 18 miles as the knee became more painful and I blistered through running awkwardly. The conditions, although a little too warm, did not trouble me," added Newton. Newton has never done specific marathon training but relied on conventional distance work that yielded the BMAF cross-country title at Ruthin in March. ""It was my 31st marathon and the first outside three hours. I intended it to be my last but the poor time may just cause me to reconsider," said Newton. I was ranked UK No2 as an Over 55 (ironically to Martin Ford, who finished 2nd today but beat me in the BMAF Cross Country) and ranked No 1 as an M60.

Ever-present Pat Dobbs was once again in winning ways after taking M55, M60 and M65 top medals in earlier years. This year his 3:31:03 was top M70.

Both Colin Steptoe (M55) and Carole Spong W65) were narrowly beaten by overseas opposition.



N ever Too Old To Set a P B. It was just before Christmas that I received a phone call from Tom Morris of Midland Masters to advise me that one of the Lucky winners of the draw for a London Marathon Place had withdrawn due to injury and the place was mine if I wanted it, so that is how I came to find myself with an entry for the London Marathon this year.

Training had to start in earnest; I decided to follow the Runners World 16 week programme based on the 3hr 30min. and the 3hr 15min. schedules. Not wanting to train 6 days a week I left out the short slow runs and had rest days instead. The long runs I did were from the 3hr 15min schedule, the speed sessions from the 3hr 30min schedule.



I was generally able to follow the programmes for the 16 weeks although I did miss out the warm up races having decided to run the Guernsey Easter Challenge, 4 races in 4 days which included a 10k and a Half Marathon.

Weekly Mileages were as below Wk1: 30.3; Wk 2: 17.5; Wk3: 37.1; Wk 4: 32.1; Wk 5: 27.2; Wk 6: 30.8; Wk 7: 49.1; Wk 8: 19.0 (on holiday); Wk 9: 34.0; Wk 10: 62.8(2 long runs this week as I missed last week) Wk 11: 25.5; Wk 12: 38.8; Wk 13: 60.1 (2 long runs this week as I missed last week); Wk 14: 23.6 (Raced In Guernsey 10k R., 4-6m CC., 2m CC.,) Wk 15: 38.5(Raced in Guernsey Half marathon); Wk 16: 39.1 London Marathon

The day of the run started with lovely weather, the only problem the queues for the toilets for which you had to stand for about 45 minutes.

So to the start line with minutes to spare, the run started and I was off, my legs feeling very heavy probably from standing so long in the toilet queue!! My aim was to run consistent mile time with a target of finishing around 3hr 25min, first mile completed in 8min 13.

The half came up in 1hr 39m 05s, an average of 7m 32 s faster than my original plan but happy and feeling fine the support from the crowds was absolutely fantastic.

Now to the second half when will I hit the wall? Mile 18 the pace drops to 8min per mile, muscles start to seize, mind over matter is required managed to increase pace slightly to just under 7min 50 s then drop back to just over 8 for the last 2 miles to finish in 3 hr 22m 38s an average of pace of 7m 42s The last half had been covered in 1hr 43m 33s an average pace of 7m 53s.

So at the end a new PB not bad to improve by 1m 30s on my previous PB this was set 17 years ago at London in 1992.

Overall a fantastic day, lovely weather, tremendous crowd support, great organisation (other than the quantity of toilets at the start, this needs to be addressed.)


And to cap it all a new Personal Best at 65 years of age, will I do it again? No never... but maybe next year who knows????

BMAF NATIONAL OPEN MASTERS ROAD RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS, 16th May, Sutton Park, Birmingham

The most popular B.M.A.F. championship of the year saw Herne Hill Harriers come out on top in the M40 8-stage event while, for the first time an M35 squad showed the way to their elders



Martin Cox led Salford Harriers into the lead in stage one, which they held until the finish in the four-stage M35 race and the 39-year-old was the fastest on the day overall and, after his run, in the day's fastest time of 14:40, looked forward to being an M40 for the 2010 event. "Next year will be better," he said. It was the first time in the four years that the M35s have been allowed into this race that a foursome from this group have been ahead of the leading M40 squad, when they completed their stint and they were all Under-40, unlike the winning teams in this group previously.

"I broke away after the turn but the wind was all over the place," said Cox, after they had won by two-and-a-half-minutes from Preston.

Herne Hill soon hit the front in the main M40 race as Francis Marsh, matched the 15:29 of their opening runner, Kofi Agyei, to assume the lead on the second stage. Salford's M40 John Brown took control of the third leg from Vic Maughn, before Roger Alsop, with a third 15:29 gave Herne Hill a fourth stage lead that they kept to the end. Earlier, Cox was chased home, on the first leg, by Telford's Paul Ward, whose 14:49 was to be the third best M40 time of the day

The second stage saw Julian Emery run 14:47 for Clevedon, gaining 37 places in the process to snatch the fastest overall time of the M40 race. "I put myself on the second and did the same time as last year when I was in the 35s," said Emery, who now will seek selection for the Masters cross-country International, which will be held at the Alexander Stadium in November. Brown has done little on the road in recent years but gave Salford the lead at the end of stage three with 14:53: "I just turned 40 three months ago but I've not really run much on the roads as I'm running on the hills more now," said Brown.



Herne Hill, second to Bristol in both 2006 & 2007, went into a narrow lead over Craig McBurney's Morpeth, through Alsop at the half-distance, as Martin Hula gained a lot for Bristol to third. "I saw Craig gaining but we did all right," said the Herne Hill man, who was suffering from a cold. McBurney added: "he seemed to get a second wind." Keith Newton then opened out a near minute lead for the eventual winners as Leicester had new signing Gordon Lee trying to close the gap. "15:22 was a good solid run solo and that's pleasing," said Newton while all Lee's 14:48 could do was keep his squad in contention. "I joined from Owls in December," was Lee's explanation of his presence in the blue vest. Fastest last year was Brian Rushworth and his 14:54 this time gained Sunderland nine places to fifth but, despite challenging, they were unable to make the final frame.

challenging, they were unable to make the final frame. Veteran hurdler Dennis Field reported that his son, Tim, ran but felt he was the weak link in an otherwise strong Sunderland team. He had good reason, he had pneumonia twice this winter following an accident and was hospitalised, he also became a father and got promoted at work and had to take on a heavy workload.


Then it was Ian Lockett's turn for Herne Hill and a 15:00 split yielded a lead of more than two minutes: "I felt all right," was Lockett's verdict and it should have been all over, but Leicester had more new signings still to come. Gareth Deacon pulled back more than a minute on Dave Adam, who answered a call to make the trip down from Dundee, via Inverness, Bristol and Birmingham. "I'm glad

I came down," said Adam. A long time Herne Hill member, the RAF Afghanistan veteran did enough to send Dave Robinson away on the final leg as Leicester threw in Simon Cotton.


The experienced Robinson, like Adam was nursing an injury, but did enough to secure Herne Hill's first victory in this event. "At the turn I saw him and that got me going again," said the 45-year-old. "I didn't train for a week and I've had a cold for the last month," admitted Robinson. Cotton closed for Leicester, as did Mick O'Doherty for Bristol to seal the minor medals.

Oxford City took both the six stage M50 and three stage M60 races with solid runs. In the M50 race their victory was their seventh in the past 11 years, while their M60 gold was their second in three years.

After a steady start in the over-50 event back in 47th, they advanced to 20th, 9th and 3rd before Chris Sykes, their fastest and the third M50 best, with 16:20 finally hit the front on the penultimate stage before Brian Green finished things off ahead of Dave Wilcock's Barnet who were second for most of the race.




Earlier, Greg Wilson pulled back an early lead by Rowheath's Richard Gray to give 2007 winners Telford a leading start with the day's best M50 effort of 16:00. Later their Tony Power was to throw in a final leg 16:07 for second best. Oxford's M60 team saw Gareth Jones lead them off in fourth, before John Exley and Roy Treadwell, the age



groups' fastest, with 17:35 closed out. They saw off challenges from Altrincham and holders Elswick. Exley and Treadwell now have the unique distinction of having gold medals in M40, M50 and M60 age groups. "You just run for your life, but I just waited for the turn and could see them coming down as I was going up," said Treadwell. "Gareth got them all lined up for John Exley," he added. Others, such as your correspondent, have medals from three age groups, but not all gold.



The over-70s were also out and, running with the 50s, 60s and all of the women were involved in a pile up at the start when several runners fell. One of the worst sufferers was Exmouth's Ray Elston who crashed face first into road. Covered in blood he got up and worked his way through the back markers before Mick Allen also advanced the Devon club. Then John Perratt passed Bingley's Fred Gibbs to secure gold, with the M70 fastest of 20:43, a just reward for a bloodied Elston. "It was a good run after Ray's fall and I had to overtake Fred, but I think he had a tweak in his leg," said Perratt.




Reading Road Runners dominated the women's races as they not only notched up their third consecutive W45 title but also led all of the over-35s when they finished their own three legs. Sarah Jarvis had tried to put Bingley into contention on the third stage running 17:04 on what was the W35 penultimate leg before handing over to Sue Becconsall. She then secured Bingley's W35 victory over Redill and Windsor. "Why am I in the W35 team?" asked the exhausted 49-year-old as she finished. She was in good company as Windsor's third placed team had two 45s and 57-year-old Paula Fudge in their squad. Chanah Patton had led the first leg for Hallamshire with 17:13 and they were still ahead on the second leg before Jarvis took over: "I didn't know where we were," said a bemused Jarvis before handing over to Becconsall.

Best time in the W35 group went to 2007 fastest Debbie Walters, with 16:21 on the final lap but, after arriving late at the course due to a time mix up, said: "I would have done the first leg but I didn't get here, but I was really pleased with that."



Reading Road Runners for whom London Marathon W45 winner Sarah Gee stormed through to post the W45 fastest lap of 17:07 were convincing W45 winners, more than two minutes clear of Bristol and Norwich. Gee said: "I was a bit tired today because after the marathon I did the Bracknell half, because my employers Quintiles sponsored it. I want to get my speed back, but also get below my 2:45 and 76mins for the half." Reading's first leg runner Lesley Whiley said: "Sarah was flying again today." Their second leg runner Carol Bowker added of her 18:30: "That's quick for me as I've been injured."



Jane Clarke had led early on for Norwich with 17:31 and said: "it was a good solid run all of the way round." Last year Daphne Elmore took the fastest W55 lap for Wolds

Vets but they only had two runners. This time they made no mistake as Elmore again posted fastest with 18:29 on the first leg of their three stage race. However, they had to concede to Chris Kilkenny's Cannock on the final lap.

HORWICH 5k The British Masters Championships 2009 Report from Mel James

As in previous years the Horwich 5k, provided us with some exciting competitive road running. Unlike the extremely 2008 windy gale-force conditions, the weather was calmer. milder, but overcast. The conditions helped to produce three new women's course records.

Jane Clarke (City of Norwich AC) in the o/45 age group running 17m.44s June Johnson (Leamington C&AC) in the o/65 age group running 23m.21s Lola Small (Horwich RMI) in the o/75 running 32m.52s (by over 4mins)

In the women's o/50 Sue Becconsall (18m.32s) and o/55 Daphne Ellmore (18m.58s) produced performances many males in their age group would have been proud of.

The Women's team competition produced Gold in the o/35 for Hallamshire Harriers (Chaanah Patton - Joanna Seymour - Pippa White) with Ilkley Harriers taking Silver (Sally Morley - Jane Bryant -Jann Smith). In the o/45s Wolds Vets took Gold with (Daphne Ellmore -Carol Hall - Tracey Gibson).

Although no course records were broken in the Men's section, the age group racing was the most competitive. Closest was Martin Ford (Cheltenham H), o/65, missing the record by just one second, his time was 18m.33s

Andrew Ward (Clowne RR) o/35 was the overall race winner in 15m.21s, he was followed home by four o/40s with just 14secs covering them. Paul Ward (Telford AC) was the victor, followed by Neil Wilkinson (Morpeth H) and Gary Done (Thirsk & Sowerby H) taking Bronze. Gary Hope (Severn AC) was unlucky in finishing fourth by just 2 secs.

The o/45s had a similar battle with only 8 secs covering the first three, Simon Wright (Doncaster AC) taking Gold in 16m.03s, with Andy Gibbs (Vale Royal) 16m.08s and John Convery (Bingley H) taking Bronze with 16m.11s

In the o/50s the evergreen Mike Cadman (Bournville H) ran an amazing 16m.00s to finish 7th overall and win Gold in his age group. chasing Robert Atkinson (Barrow in Furness SAC) Silver, for Bronze were Alex Rowe (Wesham RR) and Malcolm Eustace (Tipton H), Alex taking the medal in 16m.33s by just 3secs.

The close finishes were not left to the younger age groups. In the o/70s David Spencer (Barrow in Furness) just pipped Edmond Simpson (Overton H) by 3 secs in 21m.41s. and in the o/75s Brian Campbell (Midland Vets) had only 2secs to spare over Brian Rogers (Northern Vets) in winning Gold in a time of 23m.35s. Oldest competitor was the amazing 80+ year old, Ron Franklin (Barnet & District AC). It was 51 years ago that Ron competed for Wales, at the 1958 Empire & Commonwealth Games in the Marathon, what an inspiration to us all.

In the Team competition, Askern District AC won the o/35 Gold (Christian Shaw – Andrew Goodair – Aden Ball - Paul Colingwood).

Altringham AC (David Southern -Dave Carrington – Michael Jones) took Gold in the o/50s ahead of Wolds Vets Ac (Peter Hutchinson -Gary Coulam - Steven Green) The o/70 section Gold went to Sale Harriers (Bryan Gane – Keith Briggs Mike Howe).

I would like to thank Lostock AC for hosting us and stepping in at a late date. It enabled us to continue the 5k at Horwich and we hope to continue with the event there next year.

Morrison said "I started running when I was 61, doing a couple of marathons which I hated doing but then turned to the 1500 which I love doing and I have always enjoyed 5k anyway. In the Winter I do 10k's for endurance"

Helen Godsell, who has been sprinting since she was eleven years old, won the W55 100/200 at Kingsmeadow and looked back on what she considers her most satisfying and best performance ever " Definitely recently in Ancona, Italy when I did a W55 World Best for 60metres of 8 46 indoors. Last year I said I had not run my perfect race I think that was my perfect race "

The M65 European Indoor 400 Champion.Terry Bissett, the British M60 100/200 Champion last year won the same double as an M65 at the SCVAC He looked back " Football was my love and I played senior league and twice for Wimbledon reserves but gave up at 39. I did road running for 10 years with a best in the London of 2:40.3 but, then went down with my daughter to the club for her to do sprinting which I started doing but she got ME and I carried on."

Allan Williams, who achieved an M55 British pole vault record of 3.82 earlier this year did 3.70 at Kingsmeadow and took Alf Woods' 1986 Championship best of 3.30 off the books. "I just missed the British record. I did 3.70 and did not clear at 3.85. I did 3.80 in the pouring rain in the British league match at Cardiff last week. I feel generally I have to say it is getting better."


enmark's second largest city, which had hosted the European Veterans Track and Field Championships in 2004, was the venue for three days of very well organised competition. The weather was almost ideal, warm and sunny with light winds, although perhaps a bit too warm for the longer events on the last day.

The 10k races on Friday were over four laps of an almost flat and very spectator friendly course. The British athletes took three silver medals, M45 Ian Williamson in 33:43, M50 Bill Foster in 34:36 and W70 Pam Jones in 51:20. Alex Rowe just missed out on a bronze in the M50 only nine seconds behind Bill. Lynn Tanner won bronze in the W55 race in 43:35, closely followed by Ros Tabor only 15 seconds behind.




Team awards were made in ten year age groups and the women were the stars with two golds and a bronze. The W55/60 squad of Lynn Tanner, Ros Tabor and Sue James and the W65/70 trio of June Johnson, Sandra Poole and Pam Jones took the golds and the bronze went to Lynne Marr, Barbara Rusling and Diane Farmer in the W45/50 race. There were two team awards for the men, M45/50 silver for Ian Williamson, Bill Foster and Alex Rowe and M55/60 bronze for Archie Jenkins, Terry Eakin and Michael Mann.

On Saturday the cross country relay course in the undulating Mindeparken (Memorial Park) consisted of three legs of 4k for the younger men up to M55 and three 2k legs for the over 60 men and the women. Teams were formed in five year age groups rather than the ten in the road races. Three British teams won medals, gold for theW45 trio of Barbara Rusling(8:31), Lynne Marr(8:45)



and Fiona Bishop(9:33), silvers for M50 Mike Bradford(15:44), Alex Rowe(14:01) and Colin Laidlaw(16:14), Alex running the fastest M50 leg overall, and M75 Derek Howarth(10:14), Arthur Walsham(14:40) and Tom Davidson(12:13).

The half marathon was held in the far south west of the city, from the stadium at Viby, on the warmest day of the championships. The women took three individual medals, gold for W70 Pam Jones in 1:54:47 to add to her silver in the 10k, silver for W55 Ros Tabor in 1:38:08 and bronze for W35 Sarah Vick, 1:39:32. June Johnson, W65, narrowly missed out on a medal taking another fourth place in 1:47:00, but had the compensation of a W65/70 team silver with Sandra Poole, 1:56:53, and Pam Jones, Pam's fourth medal.



Michael Mann took the only British Men's individual medal, a bronze with a time of 1:29:08 in the M60, while Alex Rowe, again, as in the 10k, just missed a medal in fourth place with 1;17:38.

The Walkers were very successful with two Golds from Estle Viljoen , Diane Bradley and Arthur Thomson. Golds from John Payn , Ron Penfold and the Women's Team 45.

Two Silver Medals were won by Eric Horwill , and individual Silvers from John Hall and Susan Rey and the Men's 65 Team.

Bronze medals came from Susan Rey, Maureen Noel Mark Wall, John Hall and John May won a brace in the two events.

Team Manager Eric Horwill was delighted with the teams efforts, and declared the Championships well run with an excellent course.


