

INDEPENDENT PANEL ISSUES TWO-YEAR
SUSPENSION TO U.S. TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE,
BARNWELL, FOR DOPING OFFENCE Colorado
Springs, Colo. (March 3, 2010) -


U.S.A.D.A announced that Val Barnwell, a Masters track and field athlete, has received a sanction for testing positive for a banned substance at the 2009 Masters World Championships in Lahti, Finland.

Barnwell, 52, of Brooklyn, N.Y., tested positive for testosterone prohormones in a sample collected from him on August 3, 2009, after winning a gold medal in the 200 meter event at the Masters World Championships. Testosterone prohormones are prohibited as Anabolic Agents on the World Anti-Doping Agency Prohibited List, which has been adopted by the U.S.A.D.A Protocol for Olympic Movement Testing and the International Association of Athletics Federations ("I.A.A.F") Anti-Doping Rules.



avelin thrower Roald Bradstock is targeting a remarkable comeback for the London Olympics in 2012 - when he will be 50 years old.

Born in 1962, Bradstock twice competed for Great Britain at the 1984 and 1988 Olympics, but believes he still has the ability to throw world-class distances.

A throw of 72.49 metres last year was the fifth best by a British athlete for 2009.



"I grew up in Lea Valley and it would be a fitting end to compete in London as a 50-year-old,"

Although he still trains every day, Bradstock admitted his training schedule has changed significantly since his early days as an athlete.

"On Mondays and Fridays I train twice a day, a couple of hours a session and nine in total a week," he said.

"It's still a lot but nowhere near as much as I used to train.

"I train very differently. Now it's about fitness, I still do throwing, Bounding and plyometrics, but I really minimise how much I do.



n her twelfth appearance at the European Cross Country Championships, Hayley Yelling (Windsor Slough, Eton & Hounslow) won individual gold in the senior women's race a year after announcing her retirement. Emulating the sprint like pace she maintained throughout the trials in Liverpool, she controlled the race from gun to tape with a 25 yard lead all the way for an outstanding seven second victory.

35 year old Yelling said: "I can't believe it, I feel great. I'm in shock, but I said that after Liverpool as well. I just wanted to go out hard, because I know that's how I race better, to just go out and hang on for as long as possible. I expected them to all come past me, but luckily they didn't.

"I was running scared I think, I thought with two medium laps to go that they would come back but I didn't know where they were or how far behind. I thought they might have a quick last lap.

"I had no expectation at all; I just wanted to enjoy it. I was thinking about the team really. I've been back doing training sessions for about a month. I might do a few more races and see how I'm doing but I'm not looking as far as the World Cross or anything.

"I think it's just from all the years of training, recently I have been ticking over running about 40 minutes a day. What was all that 100 miles a week about!? I'm enjoying it so much; I want to get out of the door and run."

#### **New Year Honours**

thletics was well represented in the recent New Year's Honours lists with several key officials receiving recognition for their work following nomination by UKA.

Chris Cohen – U.K.M.C member and high level official received a C.B.E for services to sport, whist David Littlewood and Jean Pickering received M.B.Es for voluntary services and services to athletics respectively.

The honour marked a double success story for Jean Pickering who has seen the Ron Pickering Memorial Fund finalise the financial grant awards made for 2010 in recent weeks and reach a major milestone of its own. The £51,000 awarded to the recipients for this year means the fund has given away more than £1,000,000 to deserving young athletes since it was started following the death Ron Pickering in 1991. Having set a goal of reaching the £1million target by London 2012, the trustees are delighted to have been able to achieve this ahead of schedule.



The 36-year-old, using the event as preparation for the London Marathon on 25 April, beat American Deena Kastor by 26 seconds.


Mexican Madai Perez was a further two seconds behind in third.


Dear Brian,

At the recent Welsh Masters' Annual Awards Dinner, Bill Kingsbury M.B.E announced that he would be retiring from competition, and taking a much less active participation in the sport. Because of his wealth of sometimes hilarious but always instructive anecdotes, Bill is one of the Award evening's constant and eagerly awaited compere, and it has to be said that this declaration of retirement from Bill is also an annual event which is normally greeted with howls of derisive mirth! However, on this occasion Bill made it clear that for a number

of reasons, not the least some serious health issues over the summer, he really was bringing his illustrious participation in his beloved sport of Athletics to a close.

His personal legacy to Welsh Athletics is almost rivaled by his family's legacy to the sport, a legacy of course nurtured by the man himself. Once again they were in attendance in force, as they are either as competitors or officials at all levels of competition throughout Wales. However, as Bill always readily admits the star of the show as far as he is concerned, the one who in the quiet and strongly supportive background made it all possible, was his beloved wife Mick.

Each year Bill has awarded an annual shield to someone within Welsh Masters Athletics whom he felt displayed many of the kinds of attributes and principles dear to him and that I have tried to describe here, whether they were athletes, administrators or officials. Typically, he captured the reigning mood this year when he awarded it to the recently deceased Mary Webb, who for many years had organised the Awards Evening, and who was a stalwart athlete and tireless organiser within our sport. Her husband Brian gratefully received it on her behalf. The Webb's, Mary, Brian, Susan and her husband Rob, are another family at the heart of Welsh Masters Athletics.



There was another set of awards, the priceless and highly treasured Bill Kingsbury Lollypop awards for outstanding performances/memories from the previous 12 months. This is an award that is highly sought after, and holds a special place in the heart (sometimes the stomach!) of those fortunate enough to be a recipient – I certainly still have mine in pride of place in my own home.

Bill Kingsbury is often described as a legend amongst those within the Welsh Masters fraternity, and within Welsh Athletics generally. This is a description which Bill himself has indicated to me was inappropriate, he said he was more interested in the successes of those around him. Well, I have tried here, probably inadequately, to indicate the depth of respect and fondness that those in the sport in Wales have for Bill, and if I have in any way managed to get close to what we all feel for the man, then I'm afraid Bill, I think most would say that the description, 'a legend in his own time', is one that few would

disagree with. Whilst this is a personal letter, I'm sure that all within Welsh Masters Athletics would want to wish Bill a wonderful 'semi-retirement' from the sport of Athletics, and hope that Mick doesn't have to pull him into line too often when in the pouring Valleys rain he attempts to stray once more towards some muddy throwing area in order to bestow his wisdom on his ever-present disciples. You behave yourself now Bill!

# IRIE HILL by Alastair Aitken PICTURE BACK INSIDE COVER

**IRIE** set a new W40 Pole Vault record with 3.75 on March 20<sup>th</sup> 2010, in Melbourne ,Australia.

She was a bronze medallist in the Commonwealth Games of 2002 in Manchester, won the Pole Vault at the British Masters Track and Field Championships on the last July in a Championship best performance of 3:40. Her husband Warren, who coaches her was very short on training but popped over the bar to win the M40 with 2.80.

She also came second in the high jump the day before with 1.45. She explained about her basic problem when she vaulted in the event in Alexander Stadium"I got a migraine and should not have vaulted. I was here and the weather was so nice but I won't do that again with a migraine because it is difficult then to judge your run up'.

However she pointed out that the" ESSX" Pole she used felt very good. Hill was really impressive to watch as she is tall, with long blond hair and her preparation and execution was so good in the event.

What did she feel were her most satisfying performances over the years? "Lots of things", obviously a new World record was fantastic. Commonwealth Games was fantastic. Even just jumping in a nice environment with the people you know is

great."

Irie was born near Munich and her Father Pfiler was a high jumper before he had a family accident. She has been living in Melbourne, Australia for the last ten years and there is a good vaulting set up for 13 to 60 plus at the University where her husband Warren coaches.


Regarding her training she points out "I do a lot of different things, speed, gymnastics, and upper body strength. If I can't do a handstand then I would have trouble supporting myself! That is what keeps it interesting really." As a young woman she was working very hard in America before starting pole vaulting late at 27. In her first five years doing the event, she found Coaches were not very interested in helping Women vault. Therefore she had to learn a lot by herself, before it became an acceptable event for women to do.

Irie takes up the story further "I was in the Stock Exchange, before pole vaulting, as a Commodity Trading Adviser but I got overworked there, which is easy to do in that market. You make a lot of money, its' very exciting when everybody is doing well.

Then I came back to Europe I started to develop Asthma. Because I was still young I thought, as I have not done sports since I was 14 at school, I would start jogging to alleviate the problem. I thought that was a bit boring and I thought, as I always wanted to try the pole Vault I started that age of 27".

NB: Irie set a new indoor World Record of 3.65 at Sindelfingen on the 29<sup>th</sup> January. Also breaking her own W40 outdoors with 3.75 in Melbourne on the 20<sup>th</sup> March. Lifetime best 4.20 in 2000 and 2006.

She holds the British Masters W35 record 4.20 set in 2006, and British Masters Indoor W35 3.80 set in 2004.



Jaroslav told Alastair Aitken exclusively for Masters Athletics:-

" At the second half of 2006 my back deteriorated and Both doctor and physio advised me to retire from athletics. They

said that otherwise I will end up in a wheelchair. At that time I was invited to compete in the South American Masters Championships in Rio de Janeiro. I wanted to go there and I promised both of them that I would retire after competing in Rio.

(Alastair wrote an article in AW 7th December 2006 about Jarosiav retiring from athletics)."I kept my promise and retired.I was thinking for next 3 months what next.I was almost 77 years old and just sitting in an easy chair and doing nothing didn't look very good". "So, I asked my GP Dr.Shah if he would send me to physio in our local hospital". He did and I was introduced to new exercises "Pilates". I was quite sceptical at the beginning. After about 3 sessions I realised that my back was improving. I started athletics again and since then I am doing those Pilates exercises twice a day." It is now 3 years I am in a new age group (M 80) and I was invited by Chairman of the Swedish Masters Athletics Federation Ivar Soderlind to compete in their Indoor Championship in Bollnas on 13 & 14th February. I went there and competed in shot put and weight throw. Both were new British records. Shot put was 8.78m and Weight throw was 10.49m. One bronze and one gold medal. I am looking forward to my 16th athletics season this year."

I was competing in S.E.C.T.A (club) on the 27th February, in Weight Pentathlon in Ewell.

I set a new British record in Weight Pentathlon with 2.825 points. I also set another two British records: In the Shot put 8, 49 m, and the Hammer with 27,31 m.



## A note from the new 200 metre Indoor Record Holder DARREN SCOTT

Darren always loved athletics, and was the best sprinter in school from the age of 10.

He was never guided into athletics when he was at school, so he played football, on the wing. One day a guy said to him you are fast, why don't you try running, so he decided he would love to sprint again.

Frodsham Harriers was his first club which he joined in the winter of 1990, he was 21. His first 100m race was in Bebbington on the Wirral in 1991, against his good friend and current Masters rival Tony Lee, who won the race in 11.1 Darren was 2nd in 11.3, Tony was then Cheshire Champion,

Darren had only 4 races in his first season, setting pb's at 100m 11.3 and 200m 22.6. In 1994 he met his current coach, Morris Condon (father of GB International Allyn Condon). and that's when he really started to improve, getting his 100m and 200m bests down from 11.0 and 22.3 to 10.5 and 21.0, based on training just three times a week.

Morris maintained Darren would never reach his full potentional, because of being in full time work as a Painter and Decorator. In 1998 he gained his first international call up, for Scotland, and to every ones amazement he won the 200m defeating Christian Malcolm. who that year came 2nd in the

Commonwealth Games. Another thing which was special to him was guiding partially sighted Adekunle Adesoji from Nigeria to a 100m gold and new World Record (10.76) at the 2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester.

Due to injuries he lost his drive to carry on in Athletics, deciding to stop at the age of 33, he then changed his line of work and became a personal trainer, and then he heard a rumour that the age for masters was dropping down to 35.

Darren always remembered reading about the Masters G.B. Star Steve Peters, so he went back into training and ran his first World Masters Champs in San Sebastian, 2005 finishing 5th 100m and 4th 200m and being so unhappy, because he was carrying a injury and knowing he could of done so much better, but he loved the Championship, and went away thinking, train smart and if he stayed injury free he would come back and win.

From that day Darren has never lost another Masters 200m since 2005.winning the British, European and World championships both Indoor and Outdoor.

2008 was a great year, at the age of 39 running 21.62 indoors and a windy 200m pb of 21.15. Then he was called up again to represent Scotland at the Celtic cup, just. 2009 was an injury plagued year with just six races.

But 2010 was his best ever Indoor Season not just for breaking the world indoor 200m record as a M40, but to get a Silver in the Northern Senior champs, Silver at the Birmingham Games, and finishing 4th at the UK World Indoor Trials.

Darren's Men 40 World Record of 21.71 is strong enough to rank him 11<sup>th</sup> best on the British Senior rankings, and now Darren plans to break records when the outdoor season starts.

Darren did not make the journey to Kamloops, due to the concern that the flat track could cause damage to him due to the sharp curves.

He thanks all who have supported him this year, and cheered his achievements; he was delighted to be interviewed by Chanel 4 after his fourth place in Sheffield.

He is also delighted to be on the front cover of "Masters Athletics".



It is with sadness we have to advise you of the death of Denis Withers.

Denis together with his wife Yvonne competed with distinction throughout the World in Race Walks.

For many years he was responsible for taking the entries for the BMAF Road Relays, and additionally was a regular and valued contributor to M.M.A.C Committee Meetings.

Our thoughts go to Yvonne and the family, and esteem in which he was held was confirmed by the large numbers who attended his funeral.

It is with much regret and sadness that we have to announce the passing of Jimmy Bell, one of the country's leading Master athletes at the age of 62. Jimmy bravely fought a battle against cancer for four years. His determination to continue with his athletics career in spite of his illness was a credit to him and became an inspiration to many athletes in his club, Elswick Harriers and throughout the North East regional athletics fraternity.

Jimmy proudly wore the Elswick vest for 21 years and was rated as one of the best Veteran middle and long distance road and cross country runners in Britain. Probably his best distance was the Marathon. He competed in over 50 Marathons both in Britain and abroad. Jimmy twice won a silver medal in the London Marathon including a time of 2 hours 47 minutes at the age of 59 in 2007. Jimmy featured in the Newcastle club's successful veteran team over many years gaining medals in the B.M.A.F championships including the 10 mile road race, cross country and road relays. Prior to his illness, Jimmy was ranked second fastest in the U.K Half Marathon rankings for the 55 to 59 age group with a time of 76 minutes 18 seconds.

Jimmy was a regular member of the England Masters cross country team. He always featured in the team medals and just three years ago, he gained an individual medal in the annual international cross country.

Part of Jimmy's legacy will be the impact he had on so many people involved in athletics. Both fellow athletes and officials regarded him as a very gentle and caring man who always had a kind word to say when in their company.

An example of Jimmy's bravery and sheer determination to continue with his sport was his participation in a 5000 metres track race in Loughborough last September, when he was in the latter stages of his illness and treatment and still managed to produce a time of 18minutes 25 seconds which saw him ranked second in the British Masters track rankings for 2009.

Jimmy will be sadly missed by his friends in Elswick Harriers, those across the region and indeed throughout Masters athletics.
Our thoughts are with his devoted wife Anne and all his family.

## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT Arthur Kimber

Executive committee members have been very busy in the last three months at a series of meetings. In December Irene Nicholls and I met Andy Day, Head of Competition at England Athletics, to discuss funding for two 2010 fixtures, the Inter Area Track and Field at Solihull and the Home International Cross Country in Dublin. England Athletics are paying most of the Inter Area expenses as they did last year and making a substantial contribution for Dublin. Andy has also circulated our proposed 2011 fixtures to the England Athletics regions to try to avoid clashes.

In early January Maurice Doogan, Lesley Richardson and I met E.V.A.A vice-president Vesa Lappalainen and Esa Salmineen from Finnish Masters Athletics to discuss possible changes to the governance of E.V.A.A, and our proposed bids for European and World international championships, and they were very supportive of our plans. Later in the month Maurice, Mel James, John Hall and I met Ed Warner and Cherry Alexander from U.K Athletics for a further discussion on our proposed international bids. Ed strongly supports our plans for the European Non-Stadia Championships in Swansea in 2013, but the future of the Olympic stadium after 2012 is still not resolved. Ed pointed out that Seb Coe is keen to bring the I.A.A.F World championships to London in 2015 and that West Ham Football Club are interested in occupying the stadium after 2012. Since our meeting, according to press reports, Olympics minister Tessa Jowell has invited West Ham to put in a formal bid to the Olympic Park Legacy Company, but Margaret Ford, chair of the O.P.L.C, has warned West Ham that they are not 'the only show in town' when it comes to finding a tenant for the stadium and that the club would have to accommodate an athletics track. She told the House of Commons Culture, Media and Sport Select Committee that a decision on the future of the stadium must be finalised this year.

At the beginning of March Bridget Cushen, Maurice and I met Simon Hainsworth, managing director of Corporate and Sporting Events, to finalise their contract with B.M.A.F. We discussed changes to the original contract to benefit our athletes; early distribution of brochures, smaller deposits, later final payments, choices between hotels of different standards, good choice of airports and all-in flights/accommodation packages or accommodation only. Simon accepted all our requests and we are awaiting copies of the contract for signature.

My attempt to arrange free or discounted travel insurance with AVIVA for our athletes for international competitions has moved very slowly, but I now have the appropriate contact person in Danny Nobbs, who is acting on it and hoping to get back to me during the summer. We are also awaiting our promised meeting with Nigel Jones from Swansea Council to discuss further the European Non-Stadia 2013 bid.

Recent competition has included our indoor pentathlon championships, cross country championships in Belfast and the World Indoor Championships in Kamloops, Canada, where a small team of less than 60 British athletes won 23 gold medals and 71 in total, with five double gold medal winners, and the outstanding M40 Mark Wiseman taking three in shot, discus and hammer. A week later a group of our athletes travelled to Gent, Belgium, to compete as guests in the Belgian Masters Championships, producing many good performances and able to experience the superb new stadium that will be the venue for the 2011 European Veterans Championships.

Don't forget closing dates, particularly the one for the European Championships in Nyiregyhaza, now changed so that British entries must be received by Peter Duhig by May 17<sup>th</sup>

I wish you all a successful and injury free 2010.

## Secretary's Report, Bridget Cushen

#### **BMAF Annual General Meeting**

All members are welcome to attend the above to be held at 18.00 on Saturday, 3 July at the Track & Field Championships. We look forward to seeing as many members as possible there as it is your only opportunity to meeting the full B.M.A.F Council.

We have been advised of two positive anti doping tests at the World Masters Track & Field Championships in Lahti. The silver medallist in the M45 shot, Pekka Viippo, Finland, tested positive for Testosterone, Norondrosterone and a diuretic. The former Finnish boxer admitted the offence, returned his medal and has received a two year suspension. There were no British entries in this age group event. Val Barnwell of the USA won four gold medals in the M50 100/200, 4 x 100m and 4 x 400m. He tested positive for Testosterone prohormones and has received a two year suspension effective from last December. He has been stripped of his individual medals and the U.S.A of their relay titles. British sprinters who are directly affected are Jeff Battista; the Derbyshire sprinter now gets his four Gold medals - individual in the 100m (11.87) and the 200m (23.94) and both relays. In the 100m, Paul Chenois of Belgium and Gerhard Zorn, Germany get silver and bronze. Peter Hickey moves up to  $\mathbf{5}^{\text{th}}$ .

Barnwell is probably the highest profile Masters athlete to get caught and it is to World Masters Athletics' credit that they are doing everything they can to ensure a level playing field for all. Barnwell set a World M50 Indoor 60m record (7.18) in the WMA Championships two years ago, Kevin Burgess was 4<sup>th</sup> and Tom Phillips 8<sup>th</sup> on that occasion.

#### **England Athletic Masters Association**

The association held its 16<sup>th</sup> A.G.M on 20 March. Six out of the seven England affiliated clubs were represented.

It was reported that the Partnership with England Athletics continues to develop. They provided financial help with Officials expenses, allowed E.A.M.A to use their offices for meetings and supply all the England teams in the International crosscountry with new vests and shorts from Puma, England Athletics official clothing supplier. Despite this generous sponsorship and a £500 donation from the Midland Masters AC, the Treasurer Danny Mullane, reported a loss of over £3,700. The financial burden to the host country of this immensely popular annual international event was discussed. The success of the weekend in Birmingham last November was due to the sterling work put in by EAMA Chair, Irene Nicholls, the MMAC and Birchfield Harriers. Congratulations to all teams who again excelled despite the atrocious weather. It was a great weekend and a vote of thanks to everyone involved. After many years in this key role, Philip Lee did not seek reelection as Cross Country Secretary. Harry Matthews, VAA-NE now takes over and I am sure many of you will wish to thank Philip for his work in building this event up.

Support for the Inter Area Track & Field Challenge also continues with England Athletics supplying Polo Shirts for the Officials. Arthur Kimber reported that this year it will be on Sunday 8 August in Solihull, W60 and M70 events to be included.

Eric Horwill reported that 2009 was a very special year for Race Walking, the highlight being the Capt. Barclay Bicentenary meeting on 11-12 July in Newmarket. It marked the climax of the jockey, Richard Dunwoody's completion of his 1,000 miles in 1,000 hours challenge. There were other events, 38 finished in the E.A.M.A 3-miles and Sandra Brown won the 100 miles Open event. Eric paid tribute to Ron Wallwork and his team on the organisation of this unique weekend. The regular match with Ireland took place in London in May.

It was noted that at the A.G.M of the Race Walking Association, one of their most prestigious Awards, the Edgar Horton Cup, went to a Masters athlete, Sandra Brown. E.A.M.A congratulates her, husband Richard and their daughter Victoria.

The Election of Officers sees some new faces on the Council in addition to Harry Matthews. The Road Racing Secretary's job has been taken on by prolific racer Alex Rowe, NVAC. He is planning to enhance the annual Inter-Area 5 and 10km challenge. Let's hope that the same enthusiasm and club rivalry that the track equivalent now engenders will permeate through to the road.

#### 6k Race 1 all Women and Men 70+





#### 8K Race 3 M35 - 49

As more runners are moving into the M35 age group the standard is getting higher and this race was no exception. Previous winner, David Morwood, was able to defend his title on home soil, one of the advantages in moving the championship around the clubs. He set off closely followed by a several runners including David Evans, Jamie Reid, Alan Murchison (M35), Steve Cairns M40 and Brian Rusworth M45. On lap two Morwood increased his lead and an equally quick lap from Rusworth moved him into second place overall. This was how it was to continue with Rushworth keeping in close touch until Lap four when Morwood put in the fastest lap of the day to draw ahead. Further back a gallant effort by Cairns was not quick enough to overhaul Rushworth.

It was another excellent run from **Rushworth**, who is two age groups older than **Norwood**, as he continued his run of Championship wins.

In the race for the medals **Evans** and **Reid** matched strides till the last lap when **Evans** forged ahead.

WMA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS
KAMLOOPS, BRITISH COLUMBIA

– 1<sup>ST</sup> to 6<sup>TH</sup> MARCH

never heard of Kamloops until learning two years ago that it was to be the venue for the 4th World Masters' Indoor championships. Where is it? In a straight line, about 125 miles north-east of Vancouver. It is on the Trans-Canada Highway and main rail route across Canada and stands at the confluence of the North and South Thompson rivers.


Kamloops calls itself Canada's "Tournament Capital". The indoor facility is pretty good, although the 200m track is permanently flat – not something to endear it to sprinters! There is an excellent 400m outdoor track for warming-up but no provision for coping with bad weather. The throwing areas are better than many in Europe.



The Canadian people were unfailingly friendly and helpful so that any problems were dealt with cheerfully. There were said to be 1,000 volunteers helping, so we were never far away from someone willing to guide or help. The officials were excellent, leading some of our athletes to say that they were the best they had encountered in any championship. One experienced GB athlete said she normally comes back from a championship with a list of things that frustrated her, but this time had no complaints, only praise.

The number of competitors, at around 1,400, was well down on what could be expected in Europe. The economic situation and

remoteness of the venue must have been major factors in this. Not surprisingly it meant the overall standard of performance was on the low side for a world championship. There was still some great competition, with a sprinkling of very good performances.



Inevitably the host nation fielded the biggest contingent, with neighbours the USA not far behind. These two headed the medal table with our great rivals the Germans next and GB trailing a bit in 4<sup>th</sup> place. Considering the small size of our team this was an excellent result.

Just 58 GB Masters Athletes turned up but two of those were then unable to compete because of injury flare-ups. The athletes were supported by a small group of family and friends. We had four residents of North America in our team - three from the U.S.A and one from Vancouver. Three of these four were newcomers to international Masters Competition and two of them picked up individual medals. Of these, Simon Martin, resident of Boulder, Colorado, performed well above his declared performances, which had been achieved at altitude. He won the M55 cross-country in one of the highlights of the week for the GB team, three Britons battling it out all the way with one Norwegian. No prizes for guessing which team won that age-group! Simon's team-mates, David Oxland (who did much of the leading until the closing stages) and Archie Jenkins, had an inkling something special was afoot when Simon in mid-race said "OK, which of us is Coe and who's Ovett and who's Cram?" Cheeky, but he delivered

We had one athlete, Sonia Armitage, who was born at nearby Merritt and who spent her first four years in Kamloops before her family decamped back to Scotland. Sonia's brilliant 800/1500 double wasn't done the easy way – she went right to

the front and opened a gap, making herself a target for the rest of the field. Sure enough they gathered themselves and charged after her in the closing stages, but Sonia had done just enough to prevent them catching her.

A tally of 71 medals (23 Gold, 27 Silver and 21 Bronze) from such a small team was a tremendous return. There were some outstanding individual efforts. It was wonderful to see Bill Gentleman back in action after a stroke, winning two gold medals, including an impressive effort in the M70 hammer (all 5 legal throws over 45 metres, with the best 47.33m). Other great throws performances came from Mark Wiseman (M40 treble gold), Camilla Thrush (W40) and Carol Derrien (W70).

It was nice to see Susie Tawney's efforts rewarded with double gold on the track, in hard-fought races, plus cross-country team and relay silvers; and a hurdles gold and pentathlon silver for Hazel Barker, together with relay silver. Simon Anderson struck double gold as well, by a clear margin in the cross-country and by a narrower margin in the 1500 metres with a great finish, which was a fitting reward after the devastating disappointment of his dramatic fall in the world outdoors in Lahti, Finland, last summer while in a comfortable 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Simon also picked up silvers in the 3,000 metres and cross-country team, plus bronze in the relay, for a total of five medals.

There was double gold in the walks for Colin Turner, who is proving such a consistent performer in international indoor championships. Colin doesn't do the summer international championships because he concentrates on officiating at many meetings. Yours truly had the galling experience of picking up an injury after 7k of the 10k road walk while leading my big Austrian rival and so lost the chance of avenging my indoor defeat! Here's looking forward to the European championships in Hungary in July!

Steve Hallas exemplified the determination in the team by picking himself up from his sick bed to run 3,000 metres on Wednesday evening and then win his age-group in the half marathon on Saturday, followed by a creditable 1500 metres final the same day!

There were some very good team efforts. All four cross-country teams we were able to field won medals, two of them gold; and five more medals came from the nine scratch relay teams that were made up from almost anyone still standing on the last day.

The general feeling among our athletes was that the championships were a great success. The small team helped to engender really good team spirit. Those of experience expressed the view that these were the friendliest championships they had been to. The tone was set by the opening ceremony, which was the best I have experienced. My grateful thanks to all of the team and supporters, and to the Canadian people, for their wonderful spirit and friendliness.







### BMAF Indoor Pentathion -Lee Valley - 24/01/10

Given the really hard winter we have had and the early date for the competition, I felt that the turnout and the standard of performance was excellent. Many of the athletes would only have had access to outdoor training facilities and would not have had the opportunity to practice the high jump and the sprint hurdles so congratulations to all. The men's competition not only contained the outstanding results we come to expect from seasoned competitors like John Charlton, Brian Slaughter and Ian Reeve but also threw up some interesting new champions such as Pete Stepney in M45.


In several age groups medal positions were very highly competitive. In M45 Mark Thomas lost out to Alan Easey's silver medal by the tiny margin of 6 points and in M65 the gold went to Mike Dixon by 71 points from David Haines. Mike's determination was shown by running the 1000m heavily turbaned after splitting his head open in the HJ.



My benchmark for excellence in Pentathlon is a score of 3000 plus points and it was therefore good to see that nine men and three ladies topped this mark. Even better was the fact that four of them exceeded 3500 points which would almost certainly guarantee them medals at the major international events. A healthy picture then for Combined Events in GB.

Outstanding performances in the mens section came from Brian Slaughter with 3835 points in M50, John Charlton 3695 points in M60 and a new British Record for Colin Shafto with 3568 points in M75. Not content with one record Colin also broke the British Indoor H J record along the way with 1m27.

Turning to the ladies we saw Hazel Barker win W50 with an excellent 3568 points which contained a hurdles performance of 10.3 sec. which converted to 987 points, the highest points awarded for a single event all day.



There were also other excellent 3000 plus scores from Christine Clements W55 with 3124 points and Sally Hine with 3052 points. Lesley Willis in W45 ran an exceptional 800m at the end of a very long day in 2min. 46.11sec.

As an official it was great to be a part of the atmosphere that the athletes had created.

As an aside I was also instructed by the ladies to comment in my report that they all looked great (which they did) and that none of them looked their age (which they don't!!) All in all an excellent day.


# BRITISH MASTERS INDOOR T&F CHAMPIONSHIPS & OUTDOOR WINTER THROWS MEETING

host of British and a smattering of World records were set as the two day event saw more than 500 Masters from age 35 upwards gather for their annual championships.

Former Commonwealth Games high jumper Julia Machin (nee Bennett) was beaten by Debbie Brill of Canada back then but responded by wresting the W40 world record from her at a new height of 1.78m by way of a belated revenge. After celebrating her 40th birthday the previous day Machin then added the long jump title with 5:46.

1970 Commonwealth discus champion Rosemary Chrimes, now in the W75 age group also set a new high jump mark, at 1.16m before adding a second world mark in the shot putt at 9.12m. There was also a W75 60 metres record of 10.86. Elsewhere in the high jump, Steve Linsell set a new M45 British record of 1.85m.



Matt Johnson was challenging the roof rafters of the sports centre as he set his second and third M45 British pole vault records of the year. The 45-year-old initially improved on his 4:35, set in the World Trials, with 4.40 before setting a new mark at 4.50. "I was hoping for 4.40 so to get 4.50 was a real bonus," said the Enfield and Haringey vaulter. Johnson will now go to the European outdoor championships in Hungary this summer and there go for 4.60 and a new outdoor mark.

Three time World champion, from Kamloops earlier this year, Mark Wiseman, was again on form with a handful of M40 victories. There was a 47.59 hammer and 47.37 discus and 14.25 shot, as well as a weight, however he regretted the absence of stiffer competition. "I was hoping John Nicholls was throwing today but he was injured," said Wiseman.

Elsewhere, Steve Whyte was just one cm shy of his M45 British shot record set earlier this year, with 14.45. "I'm going to Hungary to try to add to my M40 World record for the weight pentathlon," added the Thames Valley Harriers thrower who still competes in the British league. He later added the weight at 16.53m.

Jaroslav Hanus was also in record breaking form with new British bests of 28.01 in the M80 hammer and 8.83 in the shot, also adding a discus victory. Other UK bests came from Ian Miller and Les D'Arcy in the M75 and M85 events. While M60 shot winner Neil Griffin narrowly failed to improve his British Mark

On the track over two laps there were a series of British records as Terry Bissett ran 61.99 (61.34 in Ghent) to take the 400 metres M65 gold, as Alan Mellett set a new mark of 78.77 in the M75 group and Tom Clowry 82.41 for an M80 best.


Sharon Trusch with a 27.20 and 60.09 200/400 W35 double was disappointed with her times: "I wanted 26.8 and 58, but I was by myself as the entry was very disappointing" said the 38-year-old. M40 60m sprint winner Mark Dunwell ran a useful 7.12 while Viv Oliver had a couple of narrow M55 sprint wins.

Kamloops W50 winner Susie Tawney won again, over 1500, as Kathleen Stewart set a new Mark at 6:47.59 for the W70 age group before returning on the second day to post a double by adding the 800 in 3:20.8 and another British best. Clare Elms just did enough to win a couple of W45 races sandwiching a nippy 10km road run at Eastleigh on the Sunday morning.

Denise Morley looked impressive in adding W40 800 gold in 2:18.27: "that's good for this time of year," she said. For the men, Simon Anderson's 4:10.18 in the M45 group stood out.

Over the hurdles, Greg Dunson defeated former European champion Glen Reddington to post a new 60m mark of 8.67 in the M45s.

In the 3000M walk, Arthur Thompson continued with his M70 clean sweep over four years, while Maureen Spellman improved the W70 record to 22:24.72.




