he sad passing of former Scottish Cross Country international Bobby Calderwood earlier this week brings to mind a unique team of which he was very much part. A team from Victoria Park A.A.C who trained out of Scotstoun Showground's, Whiteinch Baths Mountblow and the Milngavie Laundry who then crossed the border and took the English Cross Country Championship out of England. Besides Bobby this team also included an Empire Games silver medallist Andy Forbes, Scotland's" Zatopek" Ian Binnie and a young miler from Govan who went on the be an American Olympian and serve with the US Marines in Vietnam Alex Breckenridge. In 1952 this team travelled to Birmingham and took on the best clubs of England like South London Harriers, Belgrave, Birchfield and Bolton Utd on their own turf and beat them, something that had never happened before and has only happened once since when Shettleston Harriers emulated them in 1971.

He was a stalwart of Dartford Harriers for over 50 years, a long standing member of S.C.V.A.C and a talented hurdler, who won many international medals. Born on December 18, 1932 in Joge Town, Hioshima, he was a Graduate of Waseda University in Tokyo


A Japanese Federation Head Coach for many years and a Vice President of his association from 1995 to 2005. He became Vice President of the Japanese Olympic Committee(1999~2003), and was also I.A.A.F Veterans' Committee Member(1995~2007)

As a Triple Jumper, he participated in the Melbourne Olympics in 1956 finishing in 8th place.

Before the Games at his National Championships he achieved a World Record at low altitude with 16.48 metres, Although Adhemar Ferreira da Silva(BRA) recorded 16.56 at the Pan American Games in Mexico City in 1955.

In 2005 he was awarded "the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Neck Ribbon" at a ceremony held at the Imperial Palace.

The "Wake" was conducted on the May 13, 2010 and The Funeral at 10:00 a.m. on May the 14th both at "Aoyama Sogisho (Aoyama Ceremony Hall)" in Tokyo.

The W.M.A acknowledges the information recently received from the Irish Sports Council that Ms Geraldine Finegan, a Master Athlete from Ireland, was found guilty of a doping offence and sanctioned with a 2-month period of ineligibility (from April 27 to June 26, 2010).

The analysis of Ms Finegan's urine sample collected on the 5th March 2010 at the WMA World Master Indoor Championships in Kamloops (Canada), revealed the presence of a prohibited stimulant (ephedrine). Her results achieved at the World Indoor Championships, 60mH (1st place) and 400m(3rd place), will be disqualified accordingly.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT Arthur Kimber

We have been continuing our work on the bids for international championships. Swansea as host city for the European Non-Stadia event in 2013 looked very promising earlier this year, but there has been some delay. Fortunately Kurt Kaschke, EVAA Secretary, has assured us that although a bid would normally be made at the E.V.A.A General Assembly in July, it will be possible to bid later this year for Swansea or possibly another venue.

A new kit contract was agreed when Maurice Doogan, Bridget Cushen, Danny Herman and I met Andrew Bourne , who will provide a wider range of kit, including a redesigned tracksuit.

Following the European championships in Nyiregyhaza, late summer and early autumn will be a busy time for Masters, in track and field the Inter Area Challenge at Solihull in August and our Decathlon and Heptathlon championships at Oxford in September, three road running championships at 10k,10 miles and Half-Marathon, the 30k race walking championships and the Cross Country relays. The final international event of the year, the British and Irish Masters Cross Country takes place in Dublin in November, where I'm sure we hope for better weather than last year at Birmingham.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

BRIDGET CUSHEN.

ur Annual General Meeting was held at 18.00 on Saturday 3 July during the 2-day Track & Field Championships and overlapped with some competitions, resulting in a very small attendance as, understandably, many of our members choose to head back immediately to their hotel for dinner and recuperation after a long competitive day. However, the Executive faced some poignant questions from the floor on subjects ranging from clashing of dates with South of England Championships; lack of support from the National and Regional Governing Bodies, Anti Doping and should there be some refund to those members who entered the European Championships on our quoted £1=€1 rate when the entry form was on our website in November and the rate we obtained when we transferred the total entries in June.

In his Opening Address President Paul Dickenson said it would be remiss of him not to say what a superb job all the Officers have done. In his 3rd year as President he has come to appreciate just how much work there is to do. Masters athletics is about enjoyment; he is now in his 47th year of athletics and enjoying it more. Every competition is so invigorating, bringing enjoyment back to us all. His only criticism is the start time for his hammer competition at 09.30 on a Sunday morning when every normal citizen should still be in bed (laughter). He added that we should all actively go out there and publicise our sport, the stadium is a wonderful place. He is a little bit concerned about drug testing in this country and when you go to overseas competition. For the preservation of health we have to protect those who need medication. We are an exceptional group of people, thank you to all the Officers and Officials for doing such a good job we could not run our sport with them (applause).

The Chairman, Arthur Kimber, referred to the wide variety of competitions our athletes have taken part in since last year's AGM, including three major international meetings. We finished fourth in the medals table behind Finland, U.S.A and Germany at the W.M.A Track and Field Championships in Finland and 4th in the World Indoor Championships in Canada. A small group of athletes went to Gent, Belgium as guests in the Belgian Masters Indoor Championships giving them an opportunity to experience the superb new stadium to be used for the E.V.A.A Indoor Championships in 2011. He congratulated all medallists, especially those who set World, European and British records during the year. He referred to meetings with UK Athletics wherein they recognise the B.M.A.F as an autonomous organisation with its own governance and they will assist us in any way they can. A meeting was held with England Athletics; we were assured that the financial support that we received in 2009 for the Inter Area Track & Field Match and the British and Irish Masters Cross Country International will continue for 2010. Two important contracts have been finalised. First with the Travel Agent, Corporate Sporting, and with clothing supplier Bourne Sports who will in future provide a wider range of B.M.A.F kit, including a redesigned track suit. He reported that we have been working on three bids for international championships. Swansea as host city for the European Non-Stadia Championships in 2013 looked very promising earlier this year, but there has been some recent delay. Bids for the W.M.A Indoor Championships in 2014 and the W.M.A Track and Field Championships in the Olympic Stadium in London in 2015 are still under consideration following meetings with UKA, the London Development Agency and Visit London.

The Hon. Secretary Bridget Cushen referred to the 17 Championships held during the year covering every discipline of our sport at venues as far apart as Portland in Dorset to Lochaber in the North of Scotland to Belfast; as diverse as the 60m Indoor to the World Record shattering 100 miles Walk in just 19hrs.57.24 by the magnificent W60 Sandra Brown in atrocious weather on Newmarket Heath on 11/12 July. She

thanked our smallest club, the Isle of Man, who had offered to host the International Cross Country last November but travelling there proved difficult and expensive and it was the Midland Masters AC who again stepped in and hosted an excellent weekend. She also paid tribute to the Event Secretaries Maurice Doogan, John Hall, Mel James and Philip Lee who ensure that our wide and varied programme of events is carried out satisfactorily, and to our Statisticians and Ranking Officers who provide a prompt and efficient service. On publicity, a Press Release is sent to the National media before Major events and Face book, Twitter etc. will be used to advertise our activities.

Missing the A.G.M for only the second time in his long service as Treasurer, Danny Herman feared his wife's threat to shoot him (!) if he again missed a family celebration and his upbeat report was read to the meeting. Reporting a small increase in membership and although we incurred a loss of £945.00 it was considerably less than last year. Total losses of £2315 this year is a vast improvement on last year's results, being less by about £5660. Highlighting the main differences as firstly the Outdoor Track and Field produced a £2000 smaller loss, secondly the absence of the Interland saved us £2350 and thirdly we converted last year's loss of £714 on the Indoors into a profit this year of £380. Losses were incurred on the Masters Athletics magazine through a fall in advertising and on the 300+ Club because of fewer members. He made an appeal for new members. "I am sure most of us here this evening are already members so that if each of us were to recruit one new member and urge our friends to do the same we would receive valuable boost to our income. You will find full details of how to join in the magazine." After deducting administrative Fees and costs we realised a surplus of about £3,000. When we aggregate this with the losses on General Account and the Magazine and 300+ Club we still record an overall net loss of £1,113 as against the previous year's loss of £9,374. Thanks to Alan Cohen for his work on the Accounts, to Peter Duhig for his work as Overseas Entries Coordinator and to Danny Mullane for looking after the 300+ Club.

The Treasurer's proposal to return to members travelling to the European Championships 10% of their original outlay by way of either a discount on future foreign Entry Fees or by way of a cheque refund, was discussed at length and referred back to the Executive. [Please check on our website post Hungary]. The Treasurer drew attention to an important matter concerning the current Championships which does have a bearing on the rate of exchange surplus. Unfortunately we are going to incur a considerable loss this year as the entries are approx 150 less than last year with a resulting drop in total receipts of £3600. I have to consider our financial affairs as a whole and to use an old cliché "Some you win, some you lose". Some of our events make us money, others do not, so looking at the overall picture and offsetting one against the other we aim to achieve a small profit or at least to break even. In view of the anticipated loss on these Championships and because the average refund per person will amount to less than £7 may I please appeal to you "Hungarian travellers" to forego your refunds or discounts and allow BMAF to benefit from the surplus to the extent of an extra £1740 which will help to reduce our loss this year but it will certainly not wipe it out completely.

Commenting on the Treasurer's report, the irrepressible Martin Duff congratulated the Eastern V.A.C on their large increase in membership, but pointed out that when we had just one Championships Secretary (Mike Wrenn) who covered all events, we had big entries and all Championships made a profit, the losses on Championships now are significant. Responding, Track & Field Secretary Maurice Doogan, said the increase in the E.V.A.C membership is partly due to them holding an Indoor championship in conjunction with our Indoor

Pentathlon as they had no local facilities. Our Weight Pentathlon at Milton Keynes had a record entry and does not run at a loss; we now need four times the amount of Officials. We have fewer entries here partly due to the recession and many members did not wish to travel to Cardiff and then Hungary. Our Championships are open and we have quite a few overseas competitors here. Mel James added that entry fees to our road races are comparatively very low.

Road Running Secretary, Mel James, reported that most events went smoothly, the half marathon was most troublesome and we had a very successful season. The organising and medals costs, etc, on the three shorter distance events have equalled the cost of putting on the lesser attended, longer distances. This has kept us in the black financially for the past year's events. Notable British Bests were achieved by W60 Angela Copson - 31.39s for 5 miles, 39.34sec for 10k, 68.01s over the testing Portland 10 miles course and 3.15.18 in the London marathon. W55 Daphne Ellmore recorded 38.09sec for 10k and W80 Eileen Quinton recorded 2.29.52 for the half marathon. He thanked all the hosts and organisers of our Championships.

Philip Lee's comprehensive report covered the 2009 British & Irish Masters International Cross Country and its move to Birmingham because of travel problems for some countries to get to the Isle of Man. He reported that England won 18 out of a possible 30 medals. However they did not have it all their own way and in several age categories, particularly in the men's teams, they had to settle for second and even third place as Wales and the Republic of Ireland put up a very strong challenge. Perhaps, in the future, we may see England's dominance overturned as the "Celtic" countries become stronger. Individually there were some strong performances as several runners maintained their dominance over the opposition. Debbie Walters Eng W40, Niamh O'Sullivan ROI W45, Angela Copson Eng W60, David Morwood NI M35, Tim Hartley Eng M40, Mike Hager Eng M55, Martin Ford Eng M65 and Fred Gibbs Eng M70 all retained their first places from their previous runs. He thanked Birmingham for putting on the event at such short notice and in particular the Midland Masters, Birchfield Harriers and England Athletics Masters Association for their work in organising this event. A special thank you must go to Irene Nicholls who, as part of E.A.M.A and M.M, did much of the organisation which made the event such a success. The 2009 Cross Country Relays were held again at Berry Hill Park, Mansfield on an undulating course. Unfortunately it does not get the support that the Road Relays receive in terms of numbers but it does produce some interesting racing. A big thank you to Mansfield Harriers & AC who do such a great job of organising the event on behalf of BMAF. The 2010 Cross Country Championships were held in the grounds of Stormont Castle Park, Belfast, the venue produced another interesting but different course to the International. Numbers unfortunately were down, perhaps due to the economic situation which wasn't predicted when the venue was decided or that there was a clashing event in the south of England. However this did not detract from the standard of racing and those who won medals certainly had to earn them. As expected there was a big turnout from runners in Northern Ireland as well as some runners who came from the Republic of Ireland. While there were many fine performances, he made a special mention of Des Michael who resisted the easy option of running at the local event in the south of England to travel all the way to Belfast to compete as a M60, only a few days after turning that age. Philip also thanked all runners who crossed the water to compete in this event when it may have been easier to have run at home. I salute your dedication to BMAF. My thanks and appreciation go to Northern Ireland Masters Athletics Association for all their hard work in putting on the Championships in what must be one of the most picturesque settings he has seen. Philip raised the

M35 issue. While he can understand the reluctance to change the team age groupings for the Road Relays due to records, I find it very frustrating not to be able to do it in Cross Country. At present we have M35, M40-49, M50-59, M60-69 and M70+ teams. This means that any M70 down ageing to a M60-69 team has to run in Race 2 and do 8K instead of 6K. If the teams were grouped as the women into M35-44, M45-54, M55-64, M65-74 and M75+ then all the older runners would be able to compete over the 6K distance, even if they down aged, which is what they run in the International and World XC events. He feels that we must give thought as to how we want the cross country team age groups to be organised in the future so that our members are not disadvantaged when they run for their clubs. Philip thanked all those who have assisted in the organisation of all the events over the past year.

Race Walking Secretary, John Hall reported on his first year having the daunting task of taking over the reins from Eric Horwill at the 2009 AGM and moving rapidly on to the Long Distance Championship, held in conjunction with the hundred mile race at Newmarket on 11th/12th July. This commenced the day after Richard Dunwoody completed his re-enactment of Captain Barclay's 1,000 mile walk in 1,000 hours, two hundred years earlier. The outright winner of the Hundred was Sandra Brown (W60), in the very fine time of 19 hours and 57 minutes. 24 seconds. Her husband, Richard, was 15 minutes behind in 2nd place. There was also a very good effort from new Centurion Mark Wall (M50), who completed the distance in 21:08:39. This was no easy outing for the competitors John added, as apart from the obvious problems presented by the distance there were several hours of heavy rain to contend with in the night. The BMAF 30k was again held with the Midland event at Coventry in August. Paul Evenett (M40), the overall race winner, produced the best performance of the day with 2 hours 46 minutes and 21 seconds. Maureen Noel (W45) produced the best women's performance in 3:25:10. September saw the 10k take place in Leicester's Abbey Park. Paul Evenett again produced one of the best men's performances with 47:35 but Ian Richards' (M60) effort of 52:05 was also a contender. In the women's race Diane Bradley (W45) continued her excellent form with a 54:58 clocking.

Moving into 2010, we have held a 10,000m track walk at Oxford (May), 5k road at Horwich (20th June) and 20k road in Northampton (26th June). In the 20k it was good to see former Portuguese international Francisco Reis (M45), a long-time UK resident, continuing his impressive comeback from athletic retirement. Francisco stopped the clock at 106min58sec. Arthur Thomson (M70, but now at the top of the age-group) put in a performance that gives his international rivals very little hope of stopping his all-conquering championship record. His time of 115:54 as usual left some very much younger people trailing a long way behind! Away from B.M.A.F championships Ian Richards (M60) has continued to blaze an astounding trail of performances. Two international events held since last year's A.G.M: the W.M.A outdoor championships in Lahti, Finland and the indoor championships in Kamloops, Canada, in March this year. In Lahti the very small British walking team of just 6 people collected 8 individual medals and 2 team medals. Outstanding, as expected, was Arthur Thomson, with 3 individual golds from his 3 races. John Hall also collected 3 medals (a silver and 2 bronze) and Diane Bradley 2 bronze from 2 races. Diane also led the women's W45 team to two medals. The World Indoors in Kamloops saw Colin Turner achieve yet another doublegold performance. Colin specialises with indoors because of his busy summer schedule as an official.

Judging of the straight leg (or bent knee) in walking remains controversial. In Lahti in the women's 20k 32 disqualification cards were issued - all for perceived failure to straighten legs according to the international definition of race walking. No woman over 70 was allowed to finish the race! Great Britain put a proposal to the W.M.A congress in Lahti to drop the knee rule. This was defeated but the Congress did pass a resolution authorising the setting up of a panel of "Masters friendly" judges i.e. judges who understand the difficulty that older walkers have in straightening legs in military fashion. It is to be hoped that this initiative works to the benefit of competitors who are doing their physical best and not attempting to cheat.

Overseas Entries Co-Coordinator, Peter Duhig reported that his first full year in the post has gone relatively well. No major problems. He would like to point out the importance of using emails once again as it does not cost money, is quick and easy and save an awful lot of time. He dealt with just 2 Championships this year, World Indoors at Kamloops, Canada, 64 Entries plus 10 accompanying persons and the E.V.A.A Championships in Nyiregyhaza, Hungary, 274 entries. Please note you do not need to give him your U.K.A registration number, the name and membership number of your B.M.A.F Club is important to him when you enter. Entry forms will be available ASAP for 2011 overseas events.

Chris Jager, Keeper of the Web site reported that the number of visitors continues to grow, particularly when the results of major championships are posted. It is not just B.M.A.F members that are interested. There are visitors to the site from around the globe anxious to find out what performances are being posted. Placing entry forms on the Fixtures page is clearly popular, with many choosing to download them. He is pursuing the possibility of On Line entries with Peter Duhig.

Finally, Brian Owen Editor of this magazine, addressed the meeting stressing the hikes in postage, particularly to overseas members. His decision to go full colour and print full portrait of athletes was loudly applauded as was the overall quality of the magazine. All outgoing Officers were unanimously re-elected.


wo World Age Records were achieved on the first day. Cecilia Morrison, ran 6:05.59 for a W70 World age best, she ran 5:54.8 as a 69 year old in the Southern Counties Championships last year and said " I started running when I was 61, doing a couple of marathons which I hated doing but then turned to the 1500 which she loved doing. I have always enjoyed the 5k anyway. In the Winter I do 10'ks for endurance"



For me one person who has been amazing, through all the age groups and a 'Frontiers Woman' for 'older people's athletics' is **Rosemary Chrimes** who, back in 1970 (as Rosemary Payne) won the Commonwealth title in Edinburgh with 54.46.

A slimmer, in some ways more athletic looking Rosemary, was on show at Cardiff. She set a W75 World Best in the Shot of 10.35. However, at that stage of the day the High Jump was just about to start and she equalled the Championship Best with 1.15 and then, **ran** to the start of the 100, just making it in time and did a time of 18.83 for a British W75 record. Previously in the day she had won the 'W75' Hammer with 28.02

She remarked "I really enjoy it. Though I am always by myself.' She added 'You have to go for it! All you can go for are figures. You don't compete against people. It is a lovely feeling as long as you can keep going"



Someone who raises the standards of competition and gives Masters Athletics a lot of credibility was 48 year old, Roald Bradstock, an accomplished artist. He still competes at international level. He was an Olympian in 1984-88 and threw a massive 90.48 metres for the Javelin in Oslo in 1985. As an M45, every throw that he did at Cardiff was well over the Championship Best of 57.47. (Series- 60.59, 60.31, 63.78, 64.92, 63. 92, 61.62). He intends going to his eighth Olympic Trials in 2012 and, to smash the M50 Masters Javelin record of 71.01 metres. At Cardiff he was experimenting with the strong winds and his angle of throwing "As it is an aerodynamic implement you have got to know where the wind is. The changes and directions of angles to throw at."


Talking of the winds, the sprinters had to contend with strong winds against, effecting their times radically. Jean Fail was lucky the winds had dropped to 0.7 when she did her W60 Hurdles British record of 14.46. The other British records were

by Janet Smith in the W45 Weight with 13.95, George Eccles in the M70 Javelin with 40.36 and Maureen Spelman in the W75 3k walk in 21:43.01. In the walk Diane Bradley was first past the post, an M45 in 15:35.52. She had finished a creditable 5th in the U.K. European Trials shortly before that.

It is worth mentioning some of the names of people who have been supporting the Masters movement since they came into the Masters ranks, at 35 for women and 40 for men and, were still winning events at older age groups at Cardiff.

Neil Griffin (M60) and Jarovslav Hanus (M80) in the throws. Hurdlers Barry Ferguson (M65), Tony Wells (M60) and Colin Shafto (75). Vilma Thompson (W55) and Liz Sissons (65) in the throws and Kermit Bentham M50 (400). He has been running 400's for 34 years.

One to watch for longevity in the future, I think, will be Wendy Laing who was a prolific winner in the W45 age group. Wendy Dunsford who won the Women's 50 Hammer with 32.56 was a popular winner. She trained with the famous British thrower Judy Oakes and her Mother Barbara Dunsford was a pioneer of Masters travel arrangements abroad.



Both Caroline Powell (W55), comfortable winner of the 400 final and Terry Bissett (M60) winner of 100/200, have been recently injured but were impressive at Cardiff.

Mary Axtell (W65), when winning her 100m race, has now won 3 consecutive W 65 sprint titles outdoors and indoors. Averil McClelland (W50) looked well again winning the W50 Final. Steve Peters was with the rest of the field at half way in the M55' 100m Final then, blasted away from the rest in the second half of the race. He had been extra cautious because of his recent asthma problems. Vivian Bonner was back sprinting with a win in the W60' 100 in 14.57.

Mark Johnson chose the British Masters rather than his British League Premier meeting with Enfield & Haringey to compete in the Pole Vault and, won well with 4.40. He did 4.50 to win the B.M.A.F indoor title this year. John Bradley and John Howe were first and second in the M65 Vault and they always have a good battle. Bradley winning that time with 3.00m.

Clare Elms (TP)

Clare Elms has been setting W45 records this year with some regularity. She had little trouble winning the W45' 1500 in a Championships best of 4:44.58

Jonathan Tilt, coached by Howard Moscrop, came 2nd to Neil Tunstall (57.34) when doing 57.88 in the 400 hurdles in the morning then, won the 'M45' 400 in 52.65 in the afternoon. He said "My Dad died last week and the funeral was yesterday. When my Dad was 15 he won the Devon Schools in 52.6, the same time as I did today!" That was uncanny.


Joe Lloyd (Born April 1973) ran 54.77 to win the M35' 400 hurdles, a Championship Best. "This year I have run faster than last year. I have run 54.02 at an Open Meeting. I think I can get down to 53.3 for the European's. The weather made at least a second difference today".


He added "I am loving athletics again as a Master. I think all the serious athletes like Merlene Ottey and Linford Christie would like to do it and even younger ones like Jamie Baulch too. They still want do it but think it is silly to do it as a Master, which is sad ".

SUNDAY:

Paul Dickenson, said he was not happy about his event starting at 9:30am, however the former British International Hammer thrower was a winner with 50.07, also setting a new Championship best in the Weight with 18.06.

Cecilia Morrison triumphed with her second WorLd record of the weekend setting a new World Record of 22:19.99, for the 5,000 metres. Cecilia who had her 70th Birthday the previous weekend, now goes to Nyíregyhaz□, with the obvious advantage of having set World records for the 1,500 and 5,000 metres.





Amongst the many double sprint successes it was great to talk with Steve Peters, enjoying a weekend away from the Sky Cycling Team where Steve is Head of Medical. Steve said all was in place for the Tour de France, so he could indulge is his great love of Sprinting which he did with a 100 /200 double.

Most of the races were held over the weekend into a terrific head wind, so in the main times were much effected by this factor. However, good doubles were achieved by Dalton Powell, John Wright, Geoffrey Kitchener, John Evans, Kirsty Taylor, Kay Reynolds, Lolita Byfield-Moore., Averil McClelland, Viv Bonner and Dorothy Fraser.

Terry Bissett was in superior form earning a treble over 100/200 and 400 distances. Whilst Caroline Powell managed a double over 200 and 400 metres.

Maureen Spelman was in terrific form in the Walks adding a second British record to the Saturdays 3000 metres. With 37:24.30 for the 5000 metres.



Dave Morwood set a new Championship best in the M35 5000 with 15:37.60, Dave broke away with a lap to go, and the win must have felt good after last year's disqualification in Birmingham.

Colin Shafto increased his British Record to 1.31, in the High Jump, and Margaret Coombe cleared 1.81 in the W65 Vault.

B.M.A.F. RELAYS Sutton Park15th May

Ron Hill Cambuslang took two of the younger men's age group titles but it was Herne Hill Harriers who retained their eight stage men's M40 title, one that the Scots had won in 1999, 2003 and 2004, with many of their members then returning to lift the M50s this time. They also won the four stage M35 race and were home ahead of the leading M40 squad after those four legs.




Martin Cox, however, put many of the senior runners, who struggled to break 15 minutes for their three mile lap here the previous month in the shade, with a stunning new masters record of 14:11, to add to his fastest (albeit slower) M35 best last year. After his fifth leg run he said: "I just went out fast and as soon as I got to the hill I hammered it and passed them all. I wasn't in good shape last year but this year I've been working as a chef in Switzerland at 1600 metres altitude for four months, so knew I was fit."

Cox took 12 seconds from Nigel Gates' 1995 record to give Salford a momentary lead on stage five of the M40 race but Herne Hill and Bristol had both back loaded their teams and came through strongly over the last three legs. On the leg six lan Lockett opened out 11 seconds for Herne Hill and they then held on despite course record holders Bristol & West closing up. Roger Alsop and David Robinson kept Herne Hill in front, but Bristol closed the margin to just 13 seconds, with Salford a minute down in third.

The Herne Hill boys all had something to say after their run: Lockett said: "I'm not in shape as I've had a winter nightmare with a virus every couple of weeks. I finally had three weeks off completely in January, so I wasn't expected to take the lead Alsop offered "I did my best but I always get a cold for this race," and finally Robinson, who famously held off Nick Rose in

the cross-country relay at Newport a few years back did the same in holding off an albeit partially injured Rob Whalley: "It's hard to be in front for three miles and I wasn't feeling as healthy out there as I should, so I was not looking forward to that last hill."



Earlier, Gordon Lee had blasted the first leg, in 14:36, for Leicester Coritanian, but they flattered to deceive. "I'm pleased with that and I took the lead after the first mile but then the wind was against going out," said Lee

Then, on stage two, recent signing Haggai Chepkwony ran 14:47 to lift Bristol & West up. By the half-distance, Ben Reynolds had moved Thames Hare & Hounds up for their turn in front and they later held on for fourth M40 team.


In the M35 race, none of the Cambuslang squad broke the important 15 minute barrier. Kerry-Liam Wilson was their fastest on the third stage with 15:08 before Jamie Reid brought them home ahead.

The M50 race saw Bob Atkinson post the fastest M50 split of 15:40 for Barrow-in-Furness on the opening leg before Cambuslang had two of the fastest three M50 runners overall help secure their victory.

Firstly, Frankie Barton, a member of the earlier M40 winning teams, made up ground on the second stage with 15:49 to go from 18th into a lead. Iain Campbell then took them well clear again on the fifth stage with the third best M50 effort of 15:59, before Frank Hurley rounded things off for victory over Clayton-le-Moors and South London.

Des Michael ran 17:18 on the opening M60 leg and this stood up as the best of the race from Rotherham's Keith Williams.

I'm pleased with that as I was training all last year for this and we came here hoping to win, but thought that we would have stiffer competition," said Michael after his Barnet team mate's cemented victory.



Fred Gibbs added the M70 course record to his M60 one as he led Bingley Harriers to the M70 title with a 19:55. Pete Covey had given them a first stage lead by a minute and they eventually prevailed by over three in a new record 62:29. "We had a good lead and we maintained it," said Gibbs.

Women


There were no records in the women's age groups, just close contests as Dulwich Runners took the youngest group (the four stage W35 race), Windsor, Slough, Eton & Hounslow the W45s and Wolds the W55s.

Both Dulwich and Windsor drafted older runners into the younger age groups to make up the numbers and prove the adage that balanced squads make for relay champions.

Clare Elms did this for Dulwich in the W35 group and former I.A.A.F world 5000 metre record holder Paula Fudge for Windsor in the W45s.

Elms 'won' the opening stage in a 17:06 time that was to be the third best of the day but had she opted for the W45 race, would have won the fastest lap medal there! "I pushed on from the top of the hill but felt I was running all by myself," said the 46-year-old, who wondered where the other good W35s were on the stage. Behind, 50-year-old Jane Clarke, posted 17:40 for City of Norwich and that stayed as the official best W45 best. Former senior international and former World junior 5000 metres record holder Jenny Clague took Liverpool into the lead

on the second lap with the fastest time of 16:51 after starting off in 14th spot overall. She said: "I was a bit shocked as I've not been doing much, only training about 40 miles a week, and four or five times."




Andrea Pickup took Dulwich back ahead on the third lap but Bingley's Sarah Jarvis finished close in her wake and her 16:57 was second best W35 time of the day. "We won last year," said Jarvis, who admitted that she was affected by the wind on the top of the course, "but I was faster than last year." Teresa Gaillard de Laubenque, whose last run for Dulwich this was (she is moving to Serpentine) held on over the final leg as Telford's Claire Martin was closing up. "I got away after the hill on the dog-leg then I could see her. I was under pressure but thought I can't give up now," said de Laubenque.

Windsor's W45 victory was also helped by former International Marina Stedman (nee Sammy), who is also an International Masters cross-country winner. "I ran as hard as I could and went too fast up the hill at the beginning but it's my first race since the Southern Road relay (in March)," said Stedman.

Fudge was also making a rare recent racing appearance: "I didn't think we stood a chance and I had keyhole surgery under the kneecap and started back in December," said the former London Marathon fifth place, with 2:32:45 in 1986. Clarke said of her City of Norwich squad: "we've got a decent team" as they held on to finish a close second to Windsor. Altrincham took third in the W45s, with London Marathon W50 winner Vicky Perry making only her second appearance since taking the same title in 2009.

Wolds vets regained the W55 title they last won in 2007 and that was without Daphne Elmore, who has been fastest in each of the past two years. The new W60 10km record holder was

delayed on her way to the race when coach Mick Hall, with whom she was travelling, was taken ill.



Jane Moody ran their first leg but that was behind Gail Duckworth whose 18:32 on that leg was not backed up by a full team but was easily the best W55 effort. "I was hoping for 18and-a-half," said the Leighton Buzzard runner. Whether her run without ever the chance of any team mates backing her up was legitimate remains to be seen. Some veterans relay races, most notably the South of England championships, have a rule that ensures that runners without a full team backing them up are not eligible for fastest lap medals.

There was yet another request to clubs to offer an opinion on whether the men's age groups should change and there were some heated discussions on the subject with those opting for the status quo, which preserves the times and record history of the race, the most vociferous. There were one or two clubs who voted for change for purely selfish interests as they had squads that would benefit in the short term from such a move.

BMAF 5k HORWICH WORDS MEL LEWIS

his is the eighth consecutive year that the British Masters have held their 5k road running championships at Horwich. Being in the middle of an unusually (for the UK) long spell of dry weather, the race conditions this year, were ideal.

Although this year, we did not obtain any British bests, (most of them are now exceptionally difficult to surpass anyway), the racing still produced a very high standard. Notably in the overall race, the third finishing positions were by men and women in the o/50 age group.

Overall winner and first o/35 was John Parker (CLC Striders) in a time of 15.37s, closely followed just 2secs later by an o/40

Jason Dunkerley (East Cheshire H) with the o/50 George Thompson (Border Harriers) just 3secs behind in 15.42s.

In the women's race, first over the line was Sarah Cumber (Halifax H) o/35, stopping the clock at 18.35s with Sally Morley (Ilkley H) just 7secs behind and the o/50 Jill Harrison (Honiton H) clocking 18.48s.

The age group categories were very competitive. In the o/40 section Silver and Bronze medals were decided by just 2secs.with R Palmer (Luton H) losing out to J Herbert (Werrington J). The o/45 Gold was secured by A Woods (Bristol & W) with a 2 second gap from R Alsop (Herne H.H) in a time of 15.57s. Martin Ford (Cheltenham H) was closest to a o/65 British best, missing out by 17secs, behind him just 3secs separated the 3 athletes vying for the two remaining places, with P Hall (Barrow Striders) being the most unluckiest athlete in the race, missing the Bronze by 1 sec. P Giles (Hercules W) took Silver in 19.11s with G Howard (Ilkley H) 19.12s.

In the Male Team Competition, Gold medals went to Bingley Harriers in the o/35 section. In the o/40 age group they had to settle for Silver, as Salford pipped them by just four seconds on aggregate for Gold, with Wilmslow taking Bronze. Bristol & West AC took Gold in the 0/50, with Salford the Silver and Long Eaton, (Bronze). The o/60 team winners were Oxford City, followed by Clydesdale Harriers, (Silver) and local club Horwich RMI, (Bronze). The o/70 Gold team medals were taken home by Sale Harriers.

The Women's team competition was sparsely contested with only Altringham o/45 Ladies taking home their deserved Gold Medals.

Finally I would like to thank Horwich Town Council for hosting the race, plus all the officials, marshals etc. involved with the event and yourselves the athletes, for travelling and competing.

I have to offer my apology for the delay of the presentation on the day, we encountered some problems with the results and I am working hard to eliminate these gremlins for next year. I will insist that the problems are ironed out, before we confirm our venue for next year.

We still have Burnham Beeches (Half Marathon), Goodrich 10k and the 10 mile at Oldbury to contest for medals this year. details are on our website and in our magazine.

ally Musson was the only Masters record breaker in the Virgin London Marathon on April 25th but Darran Bilton's fourth successive placing as first Master in the event was also a record of its own, writes Martin Duff of Athletics Weekly.

Bilton however had to fight hard for his victory and it came just a week after the Leeds 43-year-old had to run a long leg in his club's 12-stage relay team at Sutton Park. It was Nicholas Cope who went well ahead at the half-distance in a fast 70:33, as Bilton was nearly a minute in arrears.



The gap was gradually closed before a winning margin of 70 seconds was opened out, as Cope a promising middle distance runner in his youth but returning to the sport, could not maintain the momentum.

Bilton said: "to win the Masters Trophy for a record 4th time is unbelievable, at half-way I was lying in second place but my experience and tenacity came through and I reckon my four years in a row record will remain untouched for some time," added the Leeds runner.

Musson won her W55 age group last year but was not then fully fit after getting back to running after injuries and illness of her husband, Roger, but was able to not only retain her title but also knock more than two minutes from Sue Carriss' 2005 British record time of 3:08:00. Musson, who had set herself a three hour personal best target, said: "the race went very well for me and was enjoyable but I was just not able to keep the pace going in the later stages. I felt good throughout really and did not go through any identifiable bad patches".

Mara Yamauchi took more than six days to reach the U.K from her training base in Mexico thanks to the airline flight ban following the Icelandic Volcano Explosion and felt that her 2:26:16, comfortably ahead of Deena Castor was down to the travelling. Speaking before the race, Yamauchi said of her build-up: "I had a good training stint in Alberquerque but last week I didn't have time to do any training."

Jo Wilkinson and Sue Harrison were also under 2:40 but, as W35s, these women were not recorded as Masters as the Virgin London Marathon classes it's masters as being over 40 for both men and women. Constantina Dita had a torrid time in the Elite race but still took the W40 medal but her time was bettered by Sarah Gee who almost reached her target of breaking 2:40 after placing first woman in the mass start. The 46-year-old who started 45 minutes after the Romanian, was slower over the first half but held her pace better.

Gee said: "I am delighted but seven seconds quicker would have been better as I did 2.40.06. I have also been dutifully informed that I was 8th Brit woman, including the elites. It was an age grading of 94.8 per cent which would equate to a 2.22.35 if I was a senior, however I am not sure that makes me feel any better."

Gee improved her personal best by over five minutes and said: "the race went to plan, although the temptation to go off too fast with the championship men is enormous. I aimed to run 6.05 minute miles and, more or less, did that. I did back off the pace at 15 to 19 miles as I knew I was well ahead and had a bad patch but wanted to stay in front. I was a little cautious about my last 6 miles but picked up mentally in the last five."

Like Yamauchi, 2009 W50 winner Vicky Perry had trouble with getting to the start but retained her W50 title, for the second time, with 2:53:46 in her first race since last year's London and has now won five age group titles in a row, having previously won the W45s in 2006 & 2007.

"I am absolutely amazed as we were stuck in Iceland until Wednesday," said the 52-year-old. "I was not focused and I had written it off. I got to half-way (85:54) and was feeling comfortable at 6:35 pace and felt fine but, from 19 miles, my left quad tightened up slightly," added Perry.

"I don't really like the pressure of racing but I do like London as it is well organised," she added.



lan Crampton (M45, 2:30:02) and Andy Clements (M50, 2:33:14) had solid victories as Ros Tabor won an age group for the first time by taking the over-60s in 3:24:05 before saying this could be her last marathon.

Chris Finill, the South of England M50 masters cross-country champion, was 17th in the M50 section but was fastest of the 'ever present' runners. Speaking before the start he told the BBC, with other 'ever-presents' around him: "I have been

quickest in recent years but we are all here to get through the race together."


