CHAIRMAN'S REPORT-ARTHUR KIMBER

Since the last issue of "Masters Athletics" athletes have had plenty of opportunity for competition, at the BMAF Indoor Pentathlon and Indoor Championships, both at Lee Valley in February, the BMAF Cross Country Championships in Birmingham and the European Masters Indoor Championships in Ghent, Belgium in

The BMAF will unfortunately not be hosting the European Non-Stadia Championships in 2013. After the delays in our attempts to make arrangements with possible host cities Swansea and Cardiff, the EVAA decided that it could not delay a decision any longer and that the championships will be held in Upice, Czech Republic. For the World Masters Championships in the Olympic Stadium in 2015 one problem has now disappeared; UK Athletics has withdrawn its bid to stage the IAAF World Championships. Resolution of the second problem is still uncertain, as there are still doubts as to whether football and athletics can coexist well when West Ham move in for the 2014-15 season. Two other problems remain, one, we need to raise the necessary funding, and two, we expect to face competition from Perth, Australia, Bydgoszcz and Torun, Poland and Lyon, France.

In February Bridget Cushen and I met Alan Waddington, Stewart Rioch and Claire Macintyre, all managers with Staysure, over 50 insurance specialists, who may be able to provide our athletes, and not just over 50s, with competitive travel insurance and other types of insurance. We also discussed sponsorship of the BMAF and Staysure seemed very interested in exploring further the possibility with us.

Summer is at last approaching and I hope you all have a good outdoor season.


INTER AREA CBP's

Sarah Gee announces retirement from athletics

After narrowly failing to gain a place in the England Commonwealth Games team last autumn, Sarah Gee lost a lot of motivation to continue with her all too brief but high quality athletics career, writes Martin Duff



However, it was the decision of the Virgin London Marathon organisers not to grant her an elite start position for the third year in a row that finally sealed the 46-year-old's disillusionment with the sport.

"I must say that many factors contributed to it but one of the most devastating blows that made me have little faith in England Athletics was Glen Laimter's reply that I could not, for the third year running, go off the elite line," said Gee, who was 14 seconds outside qualifying time, for the London Elite start.

"Having run for my country and been top performer and winner of Edinburgh, he said he would not devalue the elite start. He is more than prepared to give those with no marathon experience but fast half to go off that start," added Gee who was very supportive of the help and support that this writer has given her.

"I'm also grateful to Ian Ladbroke for selecting me for Toronto, he didn't have to and I think he might have received some flak for putting me in a 'developmental' team. That is just my hunch, with no evidence," said Gee.

"I've totally moved on and want to exit with aplomb. I don't want to be an age grouper, I did the real thing and I want to go out from there. I did a 74 half and would really be unhappy to be running slower than 76, so I would stop enjoying running once I started

to slow up, which would happen with age and less training," added the Reading Roadrunner.

Gee also has two very talented young daughters and she said: "the girls are more demanding and they deserve my attention. I took time out to achieve a goal and would have loved the Commonwealth, but you helped me achieve Toronto and, for that, I am so grateful and happy."

Gee had also announced her intention of adding to the quality of the field in Tim Hutchings' Brighton Marathon but she has been forced to advise them that she will not after all grace the start line. Gee's absence from the sport will be a great loss.

PERTH WESTERN AUSTRALIA BIDS FOR 2015 WMA CHAMPIONSHIPS

In partnership with the State Government, Western Australia's athletics community is making a combined effort to bring the world's masters/masters athletes to Perth in October 2015. Perth athletes now enjoy competing at the brand new WA Athletics Stadium and proudly claim their track is probably the fastest in the country to assist sprinters. All previous athletics meets in the west were at Perry Lakes Stadium, built for the 1962 Commonwealth Games. It has finally been replaced by a truly magnificent new stadium with excellent facilities and state-of-the art information technology.

Following on from the very successful Australian Masters Athletics Championships and the 88th Australian Athletics National Championships in April 2010, an Expression of Interest for the 2015 WMA Championships has been lodged with the WMA Council and a formal presentation will be made to the WMA General Assembly in Sacramento next July.

A committee has been set up comprising representatives of Eventscorp from the WA State Government, the CEO of Athletics WA and four local Masters Athletics members representing the local WA masters club, Australian Masters Athletics and Oceania Association of Masters Athletes. The committee is meeting regularly to ensure all criteria for hosting the championships is addressed prior to an inspection visit early in 2011 by the three WMA Vice Presidents in charge of championship organisation.

Perth's credentials as host city

In addition to the main venue, a secondary track and a warm-up track will be located in the adjacent UWA Sports Park with a third track easily accessible to the east of the city. The cross country and walks venues will also be located close to the main stadium and the marathon will be run along the river edge. With a history of hosting large-scale national and international events, Perth can an offer a full range of accommodation options

to suit all budgets and transport will be provided between the CBD and the venues.

For overseas and interstate visitors, Perth provides a friendly, welcoming environment, being the only capital city in Australia which offers the opportunity to explore a world-class wine region, picnic in one of Australia's oldest conservation areas or watch the sunset over the ocean, all within 30 minutes from the city. A visit to Kings Park and Botanic Gardens is a must for visitors to enjoy the breathtaking views over the city skyline and Swan River. A short ferry ride provides an opportunity to visit the quaint holiday island of Rottnest, home to WA's famous quokkas. So there is plenty to do on noncompetition days.

And after the championships, tourism opportunities abound with the South West offering world class food and wine, beautiful beaches, and forests of tall trees. The Golden Outback is where you'll find historic townships and gold rush history. The Coral Coast is home to awesome marine life, endless white sand beaches and the warm turquoise waters of the Indian Ocean. The Kimberley region in the North West is one of the world's last true wilderness areas.

The Oceania region has hosted three previous WMA championships – 1981 in Christchurch, 1987 in Melbourne and 2001 in Brisbane. Fourteen years on, Perth would be another great event location and the partnership between the WA Government and Australian Masters Athletics Inc would ensure a quality, well-organised and technically correct championships.

Who are Perth's competitors?

Two other cities are bidding for the 2015 WMA Championships – Bydgoszcz/Torun (Poland), and Lyon (France). The decision on who will host the event will be decided by the Affiliates at the General Assembly in Sacramento.

SEAA INTER COUNTIES & MASTERS CROSS
COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS ON 11th OF DECEMBER

BEN POCHEE, who ran the fastest over 40 time in the Southern Road relays, showed his class as a master by winning the Southern M40 cross Country championships reports Alastair Aitken

The race over an ideal, lightly undulating cross-country course, which was over a good surface in unusually mild conditions for December. (73 completed).

After the start, Ben Reynolds, the M45 2009 World 5k Champion, was leading a large group that included Tony Jackson, David Benton, Pochee, Robert Palmer, Chris Dettmar, Spencer Dempster and Ian Harkness.

It was on the second of the three laps that Pochee took the lead, because he wanted to run at his own tempo. He gently moved to the front of the field with only Tony Jackson attempting to get on terms but Jackson, had to give way in the last lap with David Benton securing the third spot.

The amazing fact is that Pochee was told by doctors he would never run again after severe leg injuries and an operation that had never been successful for someone wanting to run again and, despite having bolts in his knee and ankle he has been able to train for the last 12 months and was just pleased to be running again. (He snapped his knee ligament in 2004. Snapped his tibia posterior and had five months in a cast) He admits it is all for the Highgate Harriers team that motivates him again and, they won the Southern Masters Championships for the first time ever. First 6 out of 73 finishers were 1 Ben Pochee (Highgate) 32:06, 2 Anthony Jackson (Shaftesbury Barnet) 32:33, 3 David Benton (Brighton & Hove) 32:53, 4 Robert Palmer (Luton AC) 32:57, 5 Chris Dettmar (Headington Road Runners) 33:05, 6 Ben Reynolds (Thames Hare & Hounds, M45) 33:18.

It was worth noting that Julian Critchlow, despite sinus trouble in the week, on antic-biotic came 7th in 33.29. He will be 50 on December the 28th this year so will be a tremendous force in the M50 group.

lain Campbell had a dominant run in the M50 race. (1 lain Campbell 33.50-Met Police; 2 Chris Finill (Harrow) 35.02, 3 Tom Munt (Reading AC) 35.06, 4 Michael Bridgeland (Chelmsford) 35:13, 5 Richard Holland (Woodford Green& Essex Ladies) 36:17, 6 Paul Stoodley (Winchester & District) 36:24. The First over 55 was Andy Miles of Hillingdon in 38:04.

Campbell, a Policeman on the Beat in Islington, Mike Bridgeland and Tom Munt were together in the first lap before Campbell, who was sixth in the Home Masters International, tore away to a gigantic lead but 'Ultra man' Chris Finill moved from fourth after one lap to finish second.

Chris Finhill explains "I was defending Champion but here I am defending it ten months later. I will be one of the two Champions in 2010 but I was very pleased to win it last time. I came here today expecting to come in the first six but not really sure after that. Second is good. It's not like I was just beaten. He was way, way, in front of me. No hard feelings there either!"

Norman Morrison of Herts Phoenix was the first over 60 in 14th place out of 85 finishers

He said "I have been running since I was 12 and my best runs include a National cross-country seven years ago when I felt very good as I beat loads of rivals in that race at Parliament Hill Fields. I won my age category in this race several times and I was 3rd 'Over 55' in the British Masters when I was 57. He added:-" Cross Country is my best surface by far as I can't seem to run on the road now because of the impact. I train on the country and I really like that."

lain Campbell gave his philosophy on running at 51 and looks back on his career "There is a big difference between 40 and 50, if you have been running all your life. Can't stand masters that started at 35'

'I have never done mileage. 40 minutes a day that is all I do and quality. That's the thing I do, core stability for your hips for longevity. If I don't stretch after a session I don't feel I have done a proper session. Most runners go and jog 25 minutes after a session and stuff. It is a waste of time when you are my age. In training now I do stationery bicycle, horrible stuff as well. If you do 45 minutes of that, properly, it is harder than running. You are still getting away from the pounding.' Iain Campbell ran in the World Junior Cross Country Championships for Scotland and finished 10th but he said he unfortunately blew up in the later stages of the race when he

was holding third position but were there other events he did well in as a young man?

"I also ran at Crystal Palace and Gateshead in the international races as a senior. I had some 'Great' runs in America but not many in the UK. Looking back now to the time I trained far too hard but I have done 64 minutes for a half marathon on 40 minutes a day! It was 7 or 8 miles maximum in training for me. I almost broke 14 minutes for 5000 and did 29's for the 10k' 'My days of running are over. I do gym work, Polatis, aerobic swimming. The secret is, when you get older and the muscles start going from days and days of running, you have got to do something for strength. Your knees are going. You have got to keep the hips flexible."

Clare Elms an outstanding master and now 47 ran in the SEAAA Inter-Counties race and was 2nd Kent runner in 7th place out of 50 so, she did not contest the Southern Women's Masters this year but, it was still a good race.

Lisa Elmore won out of a large field of 127 finishers. Elmore 40, who ran much of the way with Julie Minter before she went ahead in the last lap. Elmore was 1991 British students cross country Champion and she said about her recent form

" I sprained my ankle in September so only raced once since then in the Fraternity Cup last week, where I came third but I was being very cautious with it but ran much better today where the course and conditions were good.'

'I have been running since I was 14 and have run 2:51 for a marathon. I do 40 miles a week and did not do more than 40 to 50 for the marathon. I find 40 the best amount for me to train at. Less than 40 is not enough and doing more than 40 I would get injured.

The 6th of February provided the satisfactory conclusion of an idea forged by Darren Scott, to deprive Italy of the World 4x200 metres set in Clermont-Ferrand in 2008.

Darren looked for a fitting stage to mount a challenge for the record, and aided helpfully by Midland Counties Trevor Marsay, who was able to get the record attempt included in the "Birmingham Games" at the ultra fast National Indoor Arena track.



It was hoped that the team would include Birmingham Games record holder Allyn Condon. However, the former European Indoor Championship finalist who is now 35 picked up an injury in the Saturday's 60 metres, and had to drop out.

So the revised team was Mark Dunwell, Jim Tipper, Bernard Ward and Darren Scott Who were matched against Birmingham University senior relay squad and the GB M45 team.

A quick calculation established that an average of under 22.6 per leg would be necessary, and Mark Dunwell recorded 22.9 from his crouch start first leg.

Jim Tipper recorded 22.5, and Bernard Ward 23.0, and we knew that M40 World Record holder Darren Scott could produce the necessary final lap which he did in 21.6.

The official time was as shown in David Griffith's picture above, and mission was accomplished.

300 club organiser Danny Mullane, received a note from Jack Braughton of Sidcup, Kent. Saying that he will be 90 on the 22nd February, and he has told the timekeepers to get out their calendars', as he is thinking of making a comeback this March.

Jack goes on to say he competed since 1935, as a member of both Grimsby and Cleethorpes Harriers until he was called into the Army in 1942. During the War he won the Army Three miles title, and represented the Army in the same team as the great Sidney Wooderson who ran the Mile.

After the war he won the Surrey Championships for five years, until Gordon Pirie replaced him as champion. In 1948 he was selected and ran for Great Britain in the LONDON Olympics, which must have been a wonderful experience.

He competed in the Master ranks until he was 70, and we are glad to hear from him and hope he is able to retire from retirement.


EVACI 2011 GHENT 16-20 MARCH.

lotting over 3,500 competitors, who had entered on average 21/2 events each, into a 5-day Championships with a full Indoor schedule, outdoor throws, a 5km road walk and a cross-country, is a daunting task for any Meeting Director, but our Belgian neighbours successfully managed such a feat with just 200 volunteers and 150 Officials. Yes, there were a few hiccups - the scheduling of the heats of the W45 800m for a 23.25 start; the energy sapping 11-hour ordeal in some age group pentathlons and the high jumpers having to vie for space between incessant hurdles races. There were problems also sorting out the team results for the cross-country on Saturday and the road walks on Sunday. But overall the record 348-strong British contingent returned home yet again with a barrow load of medals, only the much larger German team were ahead of us, and with some happy memories of a lovely historic city, reasonable weather and excellent competition.

It was encouraging to see 72 men enter the 40-44 age category sprints and 60 in the M35 60m, including a first ever from Monaco, and with the introduction of a 90-95 category, the future of our sport does indeed look rosy. The throws, held in the adjacent outdoor stadium, attracted between 5 and 21 in each age group with 33 entering the M60 discus.



Day 1 started off at 08.00 with the men's Pentathlon and 200m heats. Sue Yeomans collected the first of the 57-plus gold medals that were to come our way for her 2.70m clearance in the W55 pole vault, and Peter Lee's silver for his 57.80m M40 javelin throw behind the Dutchman Lommen, who reached out to 59.95m at 08.30 on a sunny Wednesday morning! Sue Lawrence missed out on gold in the W40 weight by just .01cm but she later returned to get her second silver in the discus. Back indoors it was noted that up to three British men were

Also peaking at the right time was Ros Tabor, on the victory rostrum for her W60 wins in the 3000m, cross-country, 2nd in the 800m, a bronze in the 1500m plus a team medal. Pat Gallagher notched up double gold plus silver in the 800m in a British Record 2.59.16sec. Evergreen Rosemary Crimes was already on her way to re-writing the W75 shot/discus record book and a handful of other medals. With over 40 entered in some of the men's 3000m age groups, Medals were hard to come by. The M35 category was won by



Cuadrillero of Spain in 8.26.64. but the former BMAF crosscountry winner, David Moorwood, did well to snatch a bronze medal behind Van Diepen of Holland in the M40 race. There were bronze medals also for M45 Simon Anderson, M65 Peter Giles and M75 Richard Pitcairn-Knowles

who still feels that he had to run an extra lap at the BMAF indoor. David Oxland's M55 silver medal time was faster than he ran at the BMAF indoor.


It was an early start again on Day 2, overcast and with a drop in temperature for the men's Weights and women's Discus outside, but nonetheless a fruitful day for Bill Gentleman and Mark Wiseman. Carole Derrien is in the same age group as the fabulous Russian Olympian, Tamara Danilova, who was to go on to win the W70 shot and discus. Indoors, there were fewer DQ's, in the walks. A new M45 World Record was set by the Spaniard, Prieto Angel, in 12.14.77sec as he led all the way covering the opening lap in 45sec, and there was a British M55 record (14.01.61) for Nick Silvester, the M35 race was won by the favourite Steffen Borsch of Germany. Ian Richards finished


second in a M60 British record (14.29.63) behind the WR setting (13.37.96) Italian Morotti with Team Manager, John Hall, 4th. M65 Colin Turner and M75 Arthur Thomson were both 3rd in their category. Anne Wheeler, Maureen Spelman and John May all walked to silver medals.




With the 200m semis and the finals scheduled for the evening and with most of our top sprinters on show, the seats were full – and didn't they deliver! Darren Scott, Macgee, Dalton Powell, Wally Franklyn, Stephen Peters winning the M55 in a European Record, Averil McClelland and Caroline Powell etc. Charlie Williams belied his 80-years as he whizzed round the 200m circuit in 33.05sec for another British Record and Tony



Bowman rushed from his M75 200m victory to the hurdles to collect his second gold in a slightly slower time than his 10.77sec European record set at Picketts Lock. Welshman, Glyn Sutton, was delighted with his first ever European medals, a gold in the M65 60m and 2nd in the 200. Another happy athlete was Joanne Binks as she finished the W35 pentathlon well out of the medals but she explains: "I had a stress fracture in my foot and osteo-arthritis has set it. Osteo-arthritis at my age she lamented?" She hopes to be able to continue and of course our sport is full of people who have been told they would never run again! The men's 800m semis and the women's heats were the last events. Our Team Managers are to be thanked for ensuring that our athletes were able to board either a shuttle or late night bus and some obliging drivers did drop off some female competitors at their hotels well after the midnight bells had chimed.



It was an early start on Friday morning for M35 Baba Tindogo who entered the 400/800m double. His 400m heat was scheduled for 08.30 after running his 800m semi at 22.45 the previous evening. He was on course for a fantastic double on Saturday after crossing the line first in the 400m final in what would have been a British 49.02sec record, only to be disqualified for an infringement. Friday p.m. was the only wet day making conditions miserable for the men's discus, whilst inside in the heated arena spectators watched some nail biting pole vaulting as they sipped their coffee on the 1st Floor balcony. M35 Chris Mills had to settle for 2nd although he cleared the same height (4.50) as the German, Funke, and Glyn Price, in the last four attempting at 4.20 in the M45 group. narrowly failed and tied for 3rd. The appearance of Wolfgang Ritte in the M55 competition attracted extra attention as the German has raised the standard in this age category to unbelievable heights, Alan Williams finished runner up. Alan Bradbury cleared 3.10m to claim the M65 title. Holding the men's long jump competition parallel to the run-up at the same time was questionable as concentration was difficult. The women's 800m finals saw the Surrey athlete, Sally Read-Cayton, race herself to a new W45 British Record as Denise Morley took silver in the W40 group. Nancy Hitchmough cruised to a clear W60 win.



Three high jump pits operated simultaneously on Saturday morning and the British shot putters must have felt they were in clover competing in a spacious heated hall adjacent. After their successes in the Pentathlon, W50 Gayle Clarke and W55



Carole Filer were back getting more medals in the high jump whilst on the track the men's 400m semis were underway with most of our athletes getting through. The M45 yearold Italian, Saracini, with winning times of 23.54 and 51.98 in the 200/400 gave our sprinters value for their money.

Greg Dunson set a British record in the M45 60mH and Tony Wells ensured his victory in the M60 race by dipping as his Belgian opponent glanced to his left. Donald Brown and Rohan Samuel made it a 1, 2 in the M45 60m sprint, David Elderfield set European M55 records in the 60m/400m. British M55 sprinters now top the European Indoors record table for 60, 200 and 400m. What other section of British athletics can claim such a feat?

The 5km cross-country was held on a flat dry adjacent course and turned out to be Continental cross-country at its best with such strong teams from Spain, the host nation, Ireland and France. We did not get a look in in the younger men's age categories, but David Oxland got an individual M55 medal. The distaff side fared better with team and individual medals. The 1500m had to be fitted in on the final day and run as seeded finals. With large fields and the fastest races run first, there were some impressive performances. Despite this, Pat Gallagher, Nancy Hitchmough and M50 Steve Smith all raced to victory and Belgian's two top women athletes, W40 World and European champion, Nathalie Loubele, and W45 Corinne Debaets delighted the home supporters with decisive wins. It was a frosty early morning start for the road walks, up and down a traffic free road by the canal with virtually all the younger 3000m track age group winners coming through again. lan Richards is still awaiting confirmation on his M60 race as we go to print and there was quite a delay for the medal presentations. Out on the track, the M40 hammer competition was won by the Belgian, Walter Wyngaert, with a throw of 63.28m and the M45 title went to the Estonian, Aivar Rani with 57.28m. The relays brought the Championships to an exciting and successful conclusion. The city of Leon is bidding for the 2015 World outdoor championships. Congratulations to our two athletes who won a bottle of Fine Wine in their promotional Lucky Dip - they did not get a medal, but sitting with their feet up sipping a glass of French Fine wine surely is so much easier!!









Ian Reeve won M55 but was pushed hard by the ever improving Clem Leon.

John Charlton won M60 whilst David Haines was an easy winner of M65.

To complete the picture M70 was won by Roger Bruck and M75 by Colin Shafto.

The ladies also turned out in good numbers and were the only group to produce a British Record. This came from Gaye Clarke in W50 clearly benefitting from the winter training organised for the ladies group by Charmaine Johnson. Her score of 3663 bettered the previous record by the narrow margin of 19 points!

Amanda Wale made an excellent start to her new age group in winning W40 by a clear margin.

Lesley Willis also excelled in winning W45 but was closely followed by Monica Brown. Fiona Argent won W55 and Sally Hine put together a good combination to win M60. It was also good to welcome newcomer Maria Henry to the M35 ranks.




BRITISH MASTERS ATHLETIC FEDERATION **INDOORCHAMPIONSHIPS &** WINTER THROWS FEBRUARY 26/27TH LEE VALLEY. **Words: Martin Duff. Pictures: Tom Phillips**

British Masters warmed up for the European indoor championships, in Ghent, with a handful of world and many more British age group records as the entry, at about 560, was higher than in recent years.



Former Commonwealth Games Discus champion Rosemary Chrimes was one of several new World record holders but the women's 3000 metres saw two World and one British best.

Chrimes' record came indoors in the W75 shot put at 9.15m but the 1970 champion also added the 60 metres and high jump to her weekends tally...





The 3000m saw two new World marks as Angela Copson and Anne Martin came good. Coached by Ian Wilson, Copson ran 11:29.52, a week before improving her own W60 half-marathon British best to 87:57 in Bath. She said: "I've no problems indoors today," a reference to the fact that her runs out the previous day had been her first ever indoor outing.

Martin ran 15:43.40 for her new world W75 record, but she also won several field events: "I do everything, I'm a Jack of all Trades and a Master of none," said, the Wymondham runner.

The 3000m also saw Gail Duckworth set a British W55 record of 11:04.85 before confessing: "that was brilliant but it was hard, as you need concentration on your own."

The older groups continued to set British records in the 800 metres where 1956 Olympic Games 3000m steeplechase finalist Eric Shirley (M80) ran 3:35.99 and Kathleen Stewart W70) added records of 3:17.47 and 6:43.54 in the middle distance races.

Steve Peters was nursing a sore Achilles tendon but warmed up for Ghent with an M55 sprint treble. "I want to save it for the Europeans," said the 57-year-old, adding: "training is going well and I hear the track at Ghent is fast."

Averill McClelland added her own treble in advance of the European event and, said: "I'm in fine form."

Mark Dunwell won a close M40 event in 7.03 from Jason Carty, as Anthony Noel took M45 gold in 7.29 from Rohan Samuel. Elsewhere, George Cheetham set a new over-80 British record at 9.86.

British records were set in the 60m hurdles by W60 Jean Fail at 10.69 and M75 Tony Bowman in 10.77. "I broke the European record in Kelvin Hall two weeks ago in 10.85 and improved," said Bowman..


Back in the middle distance races, William Davies (M80) ran 6:54.67 for 1500, then 88.04 for 400m. There were some good M35 performances, which made a pleasant change, as this age group usually vote with their feet and give Masters Championships a miss. Baba Tindogo ran 400m in 50.31, before returning on Sunday to win the 800m in 2:00.10.

Dave Morwood won the M40 1500 in 4:08.57 and 3,000m (8:47.75), *en route* to Ghent. Clare Elms added the W45 1500m in 4:40.58, falling just short of a record, after a slow first lap, before having a trip out over the half-marathon in the Roding Valley event on the Sunday.

"I have been focussing on endurance more than speed and haven't raced on the track since September so wasn't sure exactly what was possible," said Elms, who is planning her marathon debut in London.

There were also records in the jumps as Carole Filer set a new W55 British long jump mark with 4.46m and equalled a second in the high jump at 1.36m. Jean Fail (W60) with 4.02 and Tony Crocker (M75, 4.03m) also set long jump bests.

The outdoor winter throws saw Mark Wiseman win the M40 discus in 50.23 before venturing indoors on day two to win the shot with 14.79m. Trevor Ratcliffe won the M45 javelin with 53.44m. BMAF President and BBC commentator Paul Dickenson won his M60 hammer event, with 48.21m. He said: "training is one thing but competition is another. There are not many veterans' throws events in the course of a year." Dickenson then added the weight with 17.14m.



Andrea Jenkins set a new British W35 weight best of 16.47m while Anne Martin set three new W75 field records, in weight (10.09m), hammer (19.02m) and triple jump (5.98m).

Anne Wheeler improved her British W55 3000m walk record to 16:16.09. "I took another five seconds off, even though it was a bit crowded and I got one caution," she said. Maureen Spelman (W75) also set a new record at 21:15.03, while Arthur Thompson (M70) just kept on winning.







Martin Cox and Lucy Elliott were the individual winners and handed out defeats to younger runners who tried to challenge for honours. For the 2009 British & Irish Masters International this course was wet and boggy but the long dry spell had rendered it more like a stroll round the park. However the two winners did not have it all their own way as Mark Dalkins and Claire Martin gave Cox and Elliott trouble throughout.

The start of the first race saw all men under 65 running together for the first time. In previous years in this event, the men under-50 had run in one race and M50-69 in another. This year, however, the M65 group were shunted off to run the shorter 6km with the over-70 men and all of the women.

It was Cox and Dalkins who led the charge off down the first hill, with Gordon Lee following, on the first of four 2km laps. By the end of the first, back up the hill Dalkins had a lead of five metres on Cox and Lee, as Steve Male led Ben Reynolds in the M45 group.




The gap edged out to 10m on Cox over the second circuit as Lee was now being closed down by Paul Ward but Cox then began to close the lead down so that the two leaders were together at half-way.

The Salford man then went away on the third lap but was never safe as Dalkins and Ward maintained pressure to the end. "I was hammering it but I couldn't go with that pace," said the 41-year-old winner. "I'm doing Hastings next weekend, that's why I did this," he added. (He ran 70:33 for the half marathon there on a tough course).

Dalkins said he looks forward to an England vest in next winter's British & Irish Masters International match. Leading M45 Reynolds took his first BMAF championship victory over the country but was worried about how close Brian Rushworth was behind. "I looked around at a corner and I couldn't see him and thought he may have been just behind me," said the Thames runner. "It went very well but I didn't expect to beat Brian," said Reynolds In sixth overall, Rob Whalley led Bristol & West to the M35 team title but, significantly, they had no M35s in the four man squad. Rushworth's Sunderland were only a few seconds slower to take the M45 team title.

Another to win his first British Masters gold was Redhill's Andy Wetherill, who won the M50 age group leading all of the way from Julian Critchlow, who closed near the end.



Fell specialist Dave Neill, a former M45 champion, left it late to take the M55 group after Dave Butler led for three laps. "I could see him in the distance and it was fast at the start and I haven't done a lot of speed-work so the question was to use my strength," said Neill who was caught for pace early on.

Eventual M60 winner Des Michael, Norman Morrison and Griff Owens ran together for much of the race before Michael finally got away on the last lap for victory.

Somebody soon must question the viability of the M35 class, as there were just three in the top 20 and the best was a lowly ninth.

M65+

Malcolm Renyard notched up his fifth British vets crosscountry title after leading his M65 class for the whole race. "I said on the start line I think I am in the wrong race," admitted the Hardley runner as he ran with the women for the first time. "It all went to plan today," he added.

Fred Gibbs has had his own way in the M70s in recent years but new M70 John Batchelor put an end to that to take his first title. "I was in front all of the way but I normally get stronger as he race goes on," said Batchelor before adding: "last summer I had heart surgery with an atrial ablation (to widen the arteries)"

Women

Lucy Elliott, celebrated her 45th birthday, three days earlier, by winning the women's race. The Winchester runner was at the head of the field from the start with Claire Martin and Amy Chalk and these three soon broke away from the rest.






After the first 2km lap they were 50m clear, as leading W40 Lisa Elmore, followed with W50 Jane Clarke not far down. Martin tried to get away up the hill at the end of the second lap, but Elliott was taking a breather as the gap soon closed. The 45-year-old then hit the front before maintaining her narrow advantage to the end. "It was then a question of holding on but we were just running together. I let the younger girls do the work," said Elliott

who turned the tables on Martin after being narrowly headed in the Inter-Counties.

In third place, Chalk led Bristol to team wins in both W35 and W45 classes said: "I found it quite fast and furious and that is my first ever time in the Masters and my first outing at cross-country for many years.



Elmore said she was taken aback by the early pace: "I thought the starts of vets' races were steady but it was incredibly fast, then I settled into it and pushed it on the last lap."


Clarke was not far down and won W50 gold from seventh overall and said: "I had a bit of company on the second lap from Monica Williamson. She came up with me then I pulled away again going uphill into the third lap" said the Norwich runner.

Gail Duckworth easily won the W55 class after setting an indoor age group record at Lee Valley two weeks earlier W60 winner Angela Copson made it four golds in a row after setting a world age group record over 3000m and a British W60 half-marathon best at Bath six days earlier. "I ran the 6km on jelly legs after last Sunday. I haven't run at all since then," said Copson. W65 winner Dot Fellows was not that far down.

EDITORIAL:

A recent survey by SPORT ENGLAND has shown that Participation by 16-34 year old's is down to 26%, whilst the level for the 35-54 age groups have increased to 16.3%. The level for 55 and above has also dropped to 7.3%.

Whilst we have seen that the coalitions cuts are likely to have effects on the provision of Sporting facilities, but by virtue of the

fact that Local Authorities in the main provide those facilities and they at best are only able to offer standstill funding to sport.

It has also recently been reported that the Governments attitude would be that funding should be directed toward the elite competitors, and away from grassroots sport, this is a view most worrying to all of you.

Whilst the B.M.A.F. will do what it can, I feel we should contact our Members of Parliament, and acquaint them with the fact that Athletes have to grow from Grassroots, they do not bloom from the trees to be selected at random.

So therefore Parliament need to know this from people who still coach, administrate and compete at older ages.

Obituaries

JENNY WOOD ALLEN MBE November 1911-December 30th 2010 Based on an obituary by Gordon Casely 35339 55035

Jenny ran her first 29 years ago after being told by her doctor not to do so, typically the former Racing Cyclist ignored this advice and ran one anyway.

She set a new W70, World record in the Dundee event in 1985, in the fine time of four hours 21 minutes, she was honoured by the New York Runners Club for the fastest septuagenarian in the New York Marathon. She competed in 16 London Marathons, and appeared in the "Guinness Book of World Records".

For 20 years she inspired youngsters, and the middle aged to take up distance running, and ran in all major Scottish Marathons.

She ran in the 2002 London Marathon as the oldest Women to complete the Marathon distance at the age of 90.

She did utter the world "Retirement" at the age of 93 but continued to enter shorter races, which she walked.

Born Janet Wood Soutar on the 20th November 1911, but always known as Jenny, was one of six children won a scholarship to Harris Academy. Family circumstances denied her further education and she left school at 14 years of age to work in a shop.

She moved into the unrecognized sport of Women's cycle racing, and quickly became Scottish unofficial Champion.

Jenny married Roy Allen in 1938, she raised three sons, prior to training as a corsetiere. She felt the loss of not having had a University education, but despite this was

acknowledged as a first class public speaker, and became president of Scotland, Great Britain and International association's of Toastmistresses.

Jenny became a City Councillor, championing Women's rights and the creation of better education for Women, however, her Dundee East Conservative association deselected in 1988 as being too old. The 76 year old bounced back setting up "Running Sisters" a movement devoted to Women's health and fitness. She continued her work with disabled people, as well as being the longest serving JP on Tayside.

She was awarded an MBE in 2004, but despite the loss of her husband in 1991 and her son Graham in 1994, continued her activities raising some £40,000 for cancer charities.

She is survived by sons Kenneth and Alistair, six grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Dave, who died on 10 March, was an ex-President of the Veterans AC and a well-known road runner. The Cambridge Harrier ran a sub 2.30 marathon and competed in Masters athletics when he turned 40 here and in International Championships. He later was to make an enormous contribution as an Official to the sport. Our sympathies go to his wife Iris and his family.

Ken Fiddler

The Vale of Alyesbury member was a prolific road runner and organiser of the now defunct Rex Foulks road race for his club. He was a regular member of the large group who competed in the annual Brugge road races and will fondly be remembered as the joke teller of the pack. He was aged 76, his funeral took place on 23 March. We send our condolence to his family.

Lis Good

We are informed that Liz, wife of Arthur, has passed away. Taking up the sport late in the jogging boom, they were both regulars on the Brugge trip.

Geoff Harrold

Geoff was a former Editor of this magazine and a well-known contributor to other athletic publications. A regular competitor in Masters Athletics he is a former winner of the BMAF cross-country and a scoring team member at World and European road and cross-country. The Enfield Harrier suffered a major stroke last year. He passed away on 1 April and as we go to print, his funeral arrangements have not been confirmed.
