Pat Gallagher has copied me in on a letter she has sent to our Road Secretary:

I am writing to draw your attention to a grave inequality that currently exists within the Masters Road Relays, and in doing so hopefully gain your support to change the current structure for next season.

As it stands women can only enter teams up to the 55 year old age group. Those of us more senior must compete within this age group. However within the men's competition they can enter teams up to 75+ years of age.

There is no justification for such a blatant inequality. There are plenty of women competing beyond the age of 55. You may argue that the team competitions would lack depth but this would be no different from the older age groups within the men's race. All competitions have to begin somewhere.

It is not plausible to argue that increasing the age groups would impact on the logistics of the competition, as all the female age groups would still be able to run together, it would therefore not significantly increase the organisation of the relays or impact on the timetable of the day.

Failure to provide the women with equal opportunity will only prevent our sport from developing and growing. We have an obligation to provide all athletes irrespective of gender or age the opportunity to compete.

I would like your support to propose a change for next season. I propose that in 2012 the competition is open to women in the same age group categories as men.

Dear Sir

I am writing after another very successful T&F Championships weekend at Alexander Stadium. Great credit and thanks are due to the organisers of these championships, who have to cope with difficulties that most of us are not aware of, as well as what must appear to be grumpy old men and women who participate. We do appreciate their efforts!

However, I have one major criticism of B.M.A.F championships policy connected to the merit standards used for medal awards. I am a firm believer in the existence of standards, but I feel that there are problems with those used by B.M.A.F. The method of calculation, I am told, uses an accumulation of previous championship results over some 30 years; this narrow set of results excludes any performance outside the championships, resulting in insufficient data for the older age groups particularly in the less popular events. In order to produce standards for these events, B.M.A.F then extrapolates performances from the younger age groups up to the older ones, making a flat

mathematical adjustment for age. This is done even when the event occurs over a different distance and height (e.g. hurdles and steeplechase). Inevitably this causes anomalies and should ring warning bells about the systemic fallacies inherent in the assumptions used.

I have suggested to the compilers of these standards that a better system is to use age-graded tables devised for WMA, basing the merit standard on a fixed percentage of the midrange in each age group, not the lower range. Unfortunately this suggestion was not deemed worthy of consideration and rejected out of hand. I would be interested to know via your excellent magazine how other members of BMAF feel about this thorny issue. Perhaps if there is some agreement we can persuade the standards compilers to have a re-think.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT ARTHUR KIMBER

Since the last issue of Masters Athletics the main events have been the E.V.A.A Non-Stadia Championships in Thionville and Yutz in eastern France, which produced a wide range of British successes, followed by the BMAF road relays in Birmingham a week later. A busy June has a B.M.A.F competition every weekend, the Pentathlon and the national 10000m. at Oxford, the Throws Pentathlon in Milton Keynes, the 5k. run and 5k. walk at Horwich and the track and field championships at the Alexander Stadium in Birmingham.

On behalf of England Athletics Masters Association I am looking into the possibility of inaugurating an indoor track and field inter area challenge to complement the well established outdoor event, and I would welcome any comments on the idea.

On the international front the B.M.A.F delegates will go to WMA Championships in Sacramento unable to confirm our bid for the 2015 event in the London Olympic stadium. Future plans for the facility and lack of funding mean that we leave the field now to Perth, Australia, Bydgoszcz and Torun, Poland and Lyon, France. They will make their presentations in Sacramento and the assembled delegates will vote to decide the winning venue.

Good luck to all athletes going to Sacramento and for us all let's hope the warm spring weather continues right through to the end of the track and field season.

Secretary's Report, *Bridget Cushen* IAAF Rule 141 on the Agenda again

The ill-considered decision by a narrow majority at the I.A.A.F Congress in Berlin in 2009 to vote in favour of amending the above rule at the behest of two big city marathon organisers, to recognise athletes as Masters at aged 35 for Stadia events,

and at age 40 for Road and Cross-Country has, predictably, led to global confusion and misunderstanding. As a result a 35-39 year old athlete could enter the 5/10,000m on the track as a Master but not the 8km cross-country or win any Masters prize in road walks and 10k road races. The Congress also failed to consider the serious financial implications that this amendment would have on the non-funded volunteer-run World Masters Athletic Championships and the Regions. W.M.A and the Championships host city are now suffering an 11-15% loss of revenue. Furthermore, in countries where the Masters have no recognised official voice, entries are not accepted from this age category and most of them have not bothered to travel to major Championships if they were limited by their Federation to track and field events only.

Apart from the financial loss, the eroding of the very code and ethos of Masters Athletics – to foster international friendship. understanding and co-operation through veteran (Masters) athletics - is in jeopardy as the age rules are outside W.M.A's control. When the men's age was equalised at 35, there followed an exponential growth in entries in the M35-39 age category at World Masters Athletics and Regional Indoor and outdoor Championships; resounding proof of the worldwide demand from athletes who just love their sport, the competition, the feel good factor of a fit and healthy body and the social gathering of like-minded people across the whole social spectrum. Why should a 35 year old long jumper or hurdler, for instance, from any of the many countries that do not enjoy the excellent club structure that we have here with its local leagues etc., not be able to enter a competition, or the mother not be able to train in a stadium because she is unable to obtain the requisite licence as she has had a break to raise a family and, wishing to return to the sport at aged 40, is considered too big an insurance risk?

Jim Blair, the World renowned New Zealand Technical Official, argued strongly at the last meeting of the I.A.A.F Masters Committee for the retention of the starting age at 35 leaving the choice to the athlete whether or not to join, adding that he is here to represent the majority, not just the minority.

So Rule 141 goes back on the Agenda for the I.A.A.F Congress in Daegu in August. Will it be 35 or 40 for Masters irrespective of stadia or non-stadia? In Berlin much emphasis was put on the then performances of 35-year old athletes like Paula Radcliffe and Haile Gebreslaisse and how well they were running. They were; but do you remember a short while later both pulled up injured in a big city marathon. The late Prime Minister, Harold Wilson, famously said "a week is a long time in politics." That five years span from 35 to 40 is a long time for high mileage intensive training athletes most of whom have no interest in joining the Masters when their prize winning days limp to a close.

The demise of the cheque book

If you were not aware that making payments by cheque will no longer be possible by October 2018, then do not panic because according to the Payment Council's research, 55% of consumers did not know that that is the target date for closing the central cheque clearings. The Payment Council was set up in 2007 to ensure that UK payment systems and services meet the needs of users, payment service providers and the wider economy. They have embarked on an intensive programme of research and engagement to fully understand the needs of different groups of customers, particularly small businesses, charitable and voluntary sectors and older people, who can be highly dependent on cheques. 67 million cheques were sent to

Charities, Clubs and Associations in 2009. Cheque Guarantee Cards were withdrawn by the banks in June.

A very important item will be on the agenda of the General Assembly on July 14 (Hotel Holiday Inn Plaza in Sacramento): the switch of the year of W.M.A.C (World Masters Athletics Championship). It concerns the Stadia Championships (W.M.A.CS) and the Indoor Championships (W.M.A.C.I) as well.

The idea is to change the year (W.M.A.C.S) from the uneven years to the even numbered years and the year for the indoors (W.M.A.C.I) will be changed from the even to the un-even years.

This change is proposed for the first time in 2015/2016. The delegates will discuss and decide.

ROYSTON REGINALD ROGERS

1931-2011

We were sorry to hear of the death of Roy Rogers, who was a past President and life Vice President of the Midland Counties Athletic Association.

Roy has given many years of his life to his beloved Athletics, and when our paths first crossed at an early British Veterans Championships in the 1980's, Roy was that day an excellent Track Referee. At that time he was employed by the Royal Air Force rising from the ranks to warrant officer, but on retirement was able to spend even more time in Athletics, encouraged by his Chief Timekeeper wife Barbara.

Roy has supported many branches of Athletics, being involved in Olympic Games, World Championships, European Championships and Commonwealth Games as a Senior Track Judge.


He was continually busy at this time, being involved with the Midland Counties serving on many different Committee's, adding his great experience to any discussion in which he was involved. He was a Race Walking Judge and supported this sport at a National level, the Much Wenlock Olympian Society, and Shropshire County Association also played a major part in his life.

He was appointed meeting manager to British Athletics, and supervised most major Meetings in this Country for many years, clocking up colossal distances in his trusty Fiesta. Roy was a charismatic figure at these meetings striding along in the centre green making quick and accurate decisions that allow the televised meetings to flow smoothly.

Roy was elected President of the Midland Counties for a two year term, and was honoured by the association by being made a Life Vice President.

In the last few years Roy was troubled with declining eyesight, and was also diagnosed as having diabetes. These problems meant that reluctantly he had to withdraw from Judging, however, he continued his role on the various committees to which he belonged.




With the London Marathon organisers only recognizing Masters over-40, their leading prize money awards went overseas, so Jo Pavey's fine debut showing of 2:28:24 went unrewarded.

The winning M40 time of 2:19:57, by Mexican Odilon Cuahutle, was the fastest for many years and Norway's Kirsten Melkevik was top W40 overall in 2:39:16 but most home interest was on winners in the older age groups where pride of place went to Sally Musson who improved her own year-old W55 record by more than a minute to 3:04:13.

Reaching the half-distance just behind three time W50 winner Vicky Perry in 89:15, Musson lost ground in the second half as Perry went further ahead, before passing the Altrincham runner around the 37km mark. "I am sorry I did not make a sub-three but I honestly felt that was probably a bit optimistic although I was probably on track for that until nearly 20 miles," said the Tonbridge runner. "I had some problems in the second half of the race, which I won't go into the gory details of, but which made it a bit tougher than it should have been," added Musson who ran in memory of her late husband Roger who died shortly after last year's race.

"I felt pretty strong most of the way although I was slightly surprised at my half-way. I don't want to make excuses but my internal problems did not help me in the latter stages. The most important thing is raising money for Burrswood Christian Hospital in memory of Roger. I am pushing £5,000 at the moment." added Musson.



Perry eventually posted her fourth successive W50 title, despite suffering throughout with Achilles tendonitis. "I took pain killers before the start and then again at eight miles, then another at 15," said the 53-year-old. "I am

amazed that I still won given that I was struggling," added the Altrincham runner.

Bridget Coomber took the W45 award after firstly leading then conceding to Clare Elms before re-passing her injured rival in the closing stages in 2:54:52.

The M40 runner-up Hendrick Zietsmann, although a member of Serpentine, comes from South Africa and posted 2:25:41, while the fastest Brit among the Masters was third placed Julian Baker at 2:29:48, after a 73:01 clocking at the half-distance.

Darran Bilton had won the Masters section for the past four years but had to concede and only just won the M45 group as Ben Reynolds was a threat throughout. The Leeds man led in the early stages, going through 10km in 34:39 to Reynolds' 35:02, before the Thames runner was on the Bilton's shoulder at 15km. Reynolds then led at the halfdistance by eight seconds, in 74:46 before opening half-aminute by the 30km mark. Bilton then closed before going away for a victory in 2:31:06.

"I entered this year's marathon with a hamstring problem, so knew it would be a tall order to expect my vet category winning streak to continue," said the 45-year-old. "I ran a very conservative race and, more by luck than design, I pulled off yet another win albeit in the M45 class. So all in all, a great day out and here's to a fully fit attack at the distance in 2012," added Bilton.



Colin Rathbone retained the M65 title but this time without having to await news of his 'win' after a runner who missed the Isle of Dogs loop had been disqualified. He said: "this year there were no bad pennies." After throwing off a chest infection in the lead up, Rathbone was unsure of his form right up to race day and thought about pulling out. Talking about how his race went, the 67-year-old said: "I am pleased with my effort, despite my injury niggles during training. It's nice to know the over-65 title has been retained. I started to feel weary at around seven miles, but really started to feel the heat in the second half but stuck at it using every mental ploy I could enlist. I really was glad to finish and share a beer with my support crew, who had given me great help around the course. I couldn't let them down. I might now have a couple of weeks off training now to recover," added Rathbone.

77-year-old Geoff Oliver took the over-70 medal with 3:40:26, nearly five minutes clear of all of the M70 runners. The most notable of the event's Ever-Presents was Thurrock's Irishman Pat Dobbs who said: "my time for the London was 18:42 faster than last year. I was pleased to get around once again, to keep my sequence of runs intact." The popular Sue Lambert added to her own tally of age group wins by adding the W70 class in 4:03:46.

The three day event attracted a relatively small team of British athletes, but still produced a large haul of medals both in individual and team events. Fiona Matheson was the outstanding British athlete winning two individual gold medals, two team gold medals and one silver, and, with her very fast times, outclassing the other athletes in her races.



10k. Friday

Three races were held, all women, men over 55 and men 35-54, and took place in warm conditions, especially for the last race beginning at noon. 16 British women took part, winning six medals. Fiona Matheson won the W50 group in a very fast 35:57 and by a massive margin of nearly five minutes ahead of the silver medallist. Sarah Wilkinson took silver in the W40 category in 36:06, June Johnson W65 silver with 48:03 and Eileen Quinton the third silver with a 65:22 W80 clocking. The bronze medallists were W40 Arlene Bristow and W50 Kathryn Morton, 38:31 and 41:17 respectively. Three team golds and a silver rounded off a good medal haul, golds for Sarah, Arlene and Sarah Vick in the W40, Fiona, Kathryn and Barbara Rusling in the W50, and the W55 team. Lesley Hall, Ros Tabor and Alison White. June Johnson. Sandra Poole and Pauline Rich won the W65 silver medals.

The M35-54 race had a small British entry of only twelve and no British medals, but Neil Wilkinson ran a fast 32:31 for fourth place as an M40. The M55+ race had a much larger British entry of 27 and supplied three individual medallists and three sets of team medals. Michael Deegan was the first man home overall claiming gold in the M55 group with an impressive 34:23, while M65 Peter Giles and M70 John Batchelor took bronze medals in 40:59 and 41:09 respectively, John only 30 seconds behind the German winner Peter Lessing. Peter, John and Andrew Johnson took the M65 team silvers, with team bronzes going to M55s Michael Deegan, Gary Pendlebury and Colin Laidlaw and M60s Andrew McLinden, Michael Mann and Paul Williams.



Cross Country Relays Saturday


Three races were held in sunny but quite windy conditions in parkland in Yutz, 3x2k. for women, 3x2k. for men 60+ and 3x4k. for men 35-59. Fiona Matheson, Kathryn Morton and Barbara Rusling repeated their 10k. success with another set of team golds, Lynne Marr, Tracey Gibson and Maureen Noel took the W45 silvers, along with Lesley Hall, Caroline Boyd and Alison White, W55 silvers, while June Johnson, Pauline Rich and Sandra Poole, again following their 10k. success, finished as silver medallists in the W65 category. Bronze medals went to W40s Denise Johnson, Sarah Wilkinson and Sarah Vick.

In the M35-59 race Michael Deegan and Gary Pedlebury, this time supported by Archie Jenkins, won gold medals in the M55 group and there were two fourth placed teams. In the M60+ race Peter Giles and Andrew Johnson, this time with Dennis Williams, won the M65 gold medals and again there were two fourth placed teams.

Half Marathon Sunday

All age groups, men and women, ran together over the course starting and finishing in the centre of Thionville. Fortunately it was cooler than on Friday and Saturday and raining for part of the time. In the women's part of the race Fiona Matheson took her second Individual gold, again dominant, as in the 10k., winning in 1:20:45, over




The men were again better represented in the older age groups. Alex Rowe, although an M50, impressed by being the first Briton home in 1:16:23 for fifth place. The one British gold medallist was Geoff Newton, M65, 1:27:07, while Andrew McLinden won M60 silver with 1:20:45. Geoff, with Peter Giles and Tony Brackstone, took British team gold medals, and team bronze medals were won by M55s Gary Pendlebury, Colin Laidlaw and Andrew Murray, M60s Andrew McLinden, Michael Mann and Brian Davis and M65s Andrew Johnson, Derek Poole and John Heywood.

RACE WALKING

The GB race walkers had a very successful championship. 10 team medals (6 Gold, 4 Bronze) and 13 individual medals (8 Gold, 2 Silver and 3 Bronze) from 22 walkers is quite a tally. Even then another team medal may have got away because the local organisers stated adamantly at the initial team managers' meeting that M65/W65 would be the top age group for team purposes. Such discrimination against the older age-groups is something BMAF have fought to have corrected and it now clearly contravenes EVAA competition rules. So the organisers had to back-track on that before the end of the championships, but this late change was deemed to cancel the team gold that the GB M65 walkers had been announced as winning in the 10k. Not surprisingly we had a couple of unhappy athletes as a result: a pity considering the otherwise satisfactory organisation of the championships. Will future European championships at last be free of attempts to scupper our older age-group teams?



The 10k walk was held on a 2k out-and-back course in the neat town of Yutz, just across the broad Moselle river from Thionville. The course was well lined with enthusiastic spectators on a sunny, warm day. Just two days later the women's 20k and men's 30k were held concurrently, with all age-groups in one race, on a Tshaped, partly tree-lined course in the centre of Thionville. The weather was decidedly cool and rain showers were about. A sharp shower disrupted the warm-ups of most competitors but there was only a sprinkle of rain during the event. British support at both events was strong and vocal. It was heartening to see plenty of our runners out supporting the walkers.



British age records were achieved by Ann Wheeler (W55) in the 20k walk, eclipsing Mary Worth's 1988 record, and by Arthur Thomson (recently into the M75 age-group) in the 10k walk. Ann and Arthur both picked up 4 Golds at the championships, with 2 individual and 2 team wins. Ann was a convincing winner of both of her races while Arthur, despite performing some way below his usual very high standard was still far ahead of his opponents. Ann received very strong support in the two W55 team races from the resurgent Cath Duhig, who performed brilliantly to take two individual silver medals, and wonderful stylist Anne Belchambers. Arthur had support from Norbert Will of Northern Ireland in both of his gold medal teams, as well as from Dave Stevens in the 10k and Eric Horwill in the 30k.



There was a tremendous international championship debut from Noel Blatchford in winning the two W60 events. It seems no time at all since Noel first took up race walking; she was soon being complimented on her style and she has shown that good technique can quite quickly lead to success. Noel increased her medal haul to four by dropping age-groups to lead the W50's to team gold in the 10k walk and helping the W45's to a bronze in the 20k. She was well supported in the 10k gold team by Abingdon Ambler club-mate Judy Howard. also a championship debutant, and Fiona Bishop. W45 Scottish international Di Bradley led the 20k bronze medal team, taking an individual bronze herself and a team bronze in the 10k as well. Maureen Noel won two W45 team bronzes in the walks and managed to fit in a team bronze in the cross-country relay in the day between the two walks! Roz McKenzie, another Abingdon championship debutant, completed the W45 10k medal team.

The other double individual gold winner was M60 John Hall, BMAF walking secretary and team manager, who also picked up a team gold (M60 30k, with Dave Kates and Ken Bobbett) and bronze (with the M55s in the 10k). Ken Bobbett, yet another championship debutant, dropped an age-group for his team gold medal in the 30k while taking individual bronze in his M65 age-group. Steve Allen (the one from Barnet & District AC) and Andy Cox both took two team bronze medals in the M55 age-group, helped by a strong performance from Pete Ryan in the 30k.

The most senior individual GB medallist in the walks was John May, who won bronze in the M80 group at 10k.

Commiserations to Jo Miles, who dropped out with injury in her first race but, along with hubbie, played a full part in the team experience. A good effort from Trevor Jones in coming back from recent injury to finish both the 10k (in 10^{th} place) and 30k (in 7^{th}) in the M50 group.

Well done to all the walkers, who formed a great team bond with the help of their travelling supporters and enjoyed a convivial last-night meal. Super photos from Pete Duhig, who also performed a bit of crucial between-races massage for at least one weary but very grateful team member.

OXFORD 5th JUNE : BMAF PENTATHLONS & 10k TRACK& WALK Words Bruce Charles

There was a good male entry for the 2011 Outdoor Pentathlon at Oxford and whilst the weather was only `reasonable` a number of athletes produced some very good performances.

On the female side entries were down but it was pleasing to see two athletes exceed 3000 points. Amanda Wale achieved 3145 in winning W40 a score which included an excellent Hurdles in 12.80 sec and an 800 m in 2min 49.89.

Gaye Clarke managed an even better result with 3374 points in W50 in which she produced solid performances in all five events.

The outstanding male performances came from Brian Slaughter with 3319 points (M50), John Charlton 3153 points (M60) and David Burton 3228 points in M75. Although Matthew Allison was unable to finish his M35 event his Javelin throw of 53.32 metres was without doubt the best single event performance of the day.



THE 41st Open British Masters Track & Field Championships Alexander Stadium on 25th/26th of June Words: Alastair Aitken. Pictures: Tom Phillips.

The British Masters Championship was a great success at Alexander Stadium, Birmingham for Maurice Doogan and his band of Officials, despite the fact some people felt the on line entry system was a problem for them.

Brian Owen's informative announcing was as asset to the proceedings. The weather on the first day was mixed then; the very hot weather suddenly came in on the Sunday morning. There was only one real casualty in the high temperatures and that was David Butler (58) who had a sizeable lead in the in the 'M55' 5000 but wilted badly in the closing stages.

The most exciting 5000 was when M40's David Morwood, Andy Morgan-Lee and two 35's Huw Evans and Mike Aldridge stayed glued together till the final lap when Morwood, took off with a punishing last lap. Having run a superb 14.56 at Sports City on the 28th of May, he had the armoury to win but at Alexander Stadium the time was a modest 15.47.46. "I knew I had a good last lap in me with a 62. Racing in things like this, times are irrelevant. They only remember who won it." he said.



The most impressive middle distance runner in the younger age groups was Karrie Blake (W35), coached by Gerry North, the National cross country Champion of '62' and once the over 50 National Champion. Blake had runaway wins in the 400 / 58.50; 4.30.03 for the 1500, and 2.07.61 in the 800 metres.

The latter beat the CPB of 2:11.68. Considering she has only been training for six weeks, after an Achilles injury, she is quite likely to test the British O35 best.

Blake won the Inter-Counties last year and ran 2:03.96 in 2009, at a similar age that Christina Boxer ran at 35.

Obviously a World Record is something very special, even at Master's level so, prominence must go to those that achieved that. Anne Martin ran 11.47.3 for a new W75 World steeplechase record beating her own World Best of 12.03.04. She added "I felt very tired when clambering out of the final water jump but was alright in the final straight"

About her training "I do 20 to 25 miles a week. I can't afford to do much less at my age

"1956 Olympic steeplechase finalist Eric Shirley, now 82, said something after his M80 800 win, in a similar way " Anyone can make the time each day to run. The hardest

thing is putting your track suit on and going out the front door!"







Another competitor who is pushing forward the frontiers of what can be done as a master was Rosemary Chrimes, at 78, the 1970 Commonwealth discus gold medallist. "Although I am creaking and feeling ancient today' Rosemary remarked, 'It keeps me fit and everybody feels, including myself that I am a bit crazy. I have got to keep going till I am 80 as there are more records up there ready to be broken. If I live that long " quipped Rosemary with her great sense of humour. She won her W75 events for 100m (British Record) hammer, high jump, shot and discus in a championship best.

Paul Dickinson, President of B.M.A.F, a famous BBC commentator, put an M60 British weight record on the books of 18.93 (Previous 18.76) and also won the Hammer with at least a couple of throws exceeding the Championship best. "Training has been a little better though not in recent weeks. I was pleased with the medal and Championship record but not as well as I hoped for but isn't that the way of athletics!"

The first field event on the first day was the Women's hammer in drizzle at times. Janet Smith (W45) who has been competing for 20 years was the W45 winner ' To get up at five to travel for a couple of hours and then start at 9' '0'clock made it a bit difficult." Jennifer Ibbitson (W50) from Leeds is always a great competitor at that event plus the pole vault. She added " I do four turns with Hammer which makes it a bit faster." She has 4 children and 13 grandchildren!

Liz Sissons won the W65 but considers the one event that seems to be going very well for her recently is the

javelin. She won with 27'17. Those who won several events in the field were Robert Earl (M50, weight, hammer, shot and discus), Mike Hazelwood (M65) Vilma Thompson (W55) and Evaune Williams (W70). The later said "I am 74 this year and accounting for the weather, the arthritis in the knees, I could not have hoped for more.' (*33.66 CBP*) and Bill Gentleman did a CPB in the Men's 70' hammer with 57.60 as did Kevin Murch (M50) with javelin doing 55.54.

Prolific winners in the jumps were Trevor Wade (M55), Amanda Wale (W40), Pat Oakes (W65) and Tony Croker (M75). Croker, who coaches, did 1.33 in the high jump which bettered the listed 1.31 CPB outdoors and had two very close attempts at the 1.36.

42 year old Darren Scott made a nice transition from being in the 35's to being in the 40's. He ran 10.96 for the 100 as an M40 this year and looked good winning the 100/200 as he came home well "I wanted to retire at 33 but heard about the Masters but now at 40 I am nearly as quick as I was in my 20's"

The 40's and 45's were combined for the 110m hurdles which certainly made a race of it. As Joe Appiah, 40. won in 15.27 with 47 year old Greg Dunson coming in close behind in 15.68. Appiah was a semi-pro footballer till he was 29.

Another to impress was Jean Fail who set a new British record in the 80m hurdles in 14.39 and Jane Horder's 80m hurdles for the W50 was a CPB.

Successful ballroom dancer in recent times and ex-Powderhall sprint winner, Tony Bowman, was in fine form at the Championships. He won the M75 80 hurdles (BR), 300h (CBP), 100, 200, 400, and 800.Lolita Byfield-Moore was second to Kirstin King in the W45 100 but ran a storming 200. She said she was inspired by her daughter Mica coming 6th the day before in the England Under 20 100m Final, particularly as they originally started out together as runners. Lolita's withering sprint finish was on the Sunday in the 200 when she got home just in front of Kirstin King. (27.92 to 27.96).

Another fine sprinter was Ellena Ruddock (W35) who had been coached by Roy Humphries for 21 years. Ruddock had come 3rd in the Midland Counties 100 and 2nd in the 200 the previous weekend, and has appeared 13 times in A.A.A. and U.K finals. She did 12.35 for a CPB over the 100 on the Saturday.

There were some more good wins through the age groups. Dave Oxland took the M60 800/1500/and 5000; Colin Palmer (M40) won his fifth BMAF title in the 3000m steeplechase.

Virginia Mitchell, now coached by her husband Tony Mitchell was a clear winner in the W45 400 hurdles and came off the last bend well to win the 400 flat.

A good result was Nancy Hitchmough's (W.60) 800 European Record in 2:36.03 with Angela Copson second. Angela had already won the W60 5000 in the morning and 1500 on the first day. She had most of last





year out with injury and was on her way back at the end of the cross-country season. Pat Gallagher, who was a great winner, even back in her 40's in these Championships she did a time of 2:50.63 for a British W65 record and Kathleen Stewart ran 3:13.75 for a W70 British record. Caroline Powell, who won the W55 400, 2nd in the 100 had big battle to just beat Joylyn Saunders Mullin in the 200.

First past the post in the 5000 Walk was Anne Wheeler in a CBP of 28:5.25. She won this year's W55 titles for 10k and 20k in the Non Stadia Championships, and has the British record for 20k.

BRITISH MASTERS OPEN ROAD RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS Sutton Park, Birmingham May 21st

The Executive of the B.M.A.F made changes to the format of the men's age groups and, probably because they went against two separate polls of competing teams and the AGM of the federation, were rewarded with a much smaller entry than hitherto.

One side effect of the changes was that there was no four-stage event for the younger men's age groups and this meant that smaller clubs, who did not have eight Masters on their books, were unable to enter. Previously, like former M35 champions North Shields Poly, they could take part but are now denied. With many absentees, Les Croupiers were the only club to finish a team in all seven age groups.

Ron Hill Cambuslang were quick to point out that they retained their M35 title, albeit over 8-stage this year, rather than the four that they found was enough for victory in 2010. Their time, however, was the slowest 8stage win on this course in the history of the event. Cambuslang were well down in the early stages but went on to win by nearly two minutes from Salford. Paul Ward had 'won' the opening stage for Telford in 15:16 from

M40 holders Herne Hill's Simon Coombes. "There was a bit of wind out the back and we were together until down by the Pool," said Ward, whose team were soon eclipsed on the second stage as Jon James gained 15 places for Wells City and a comfortable race lead.



James ran 15:12 and would have been awarded the M45 medal had he been running in the older age-group race, but was denied. Wells kept ahead for the next three legs but fourth stage runner Alistair Lindsay said: "we've got a sixty-year-old in our team, so will drop back." This duly happened as Cambuslang ate into their advantage and finally took the lead through Kerry Liam-Wilson's 15:12 on the sixth leg. Ian Campbell and Jamie Reid then extended the lead.


Salford could never quite get on terms and final leg runner Martin Cox, who set a course record 14:11 last year said: "I needed a slightly smaller gap and a sight of the lead." This was not to be, so Cox just did enough to maintain his squad in second ahead of Morpeth, who had expected to challenge for victory themselves. However, on the third leg Chris Waugh got into breathing trouble losing more than 20 places. Hudspith said: "we thought we had a chance of winning but you are hanging around waiting." This really fired up the former international who then blasted out a new vets' record of 14:08, by way of consolation.



Leicester Coritanian took the lead on the second leg of the M45 6-stage event through Derek Guess and were never subsequently headed. "We have a lot who have turned 45," said final leg runner Steve Platts, who saw them home, after a 15:58. "That's the first time I've done the relay and it was nice not to do the starting loop," said the former Morpeth and OWLS runner in reference to the senior men's lap at Sutton Park.

Earlier Redhill's Alan Smith had notched up the fastest M45 race stage time of 15:41 on the fourth leg. "We came with a tilt for a medal but lost out on the last leg," said Smith.

Salford Harriers won the new four stage M55 event after Eric Williams took them into the lead on the third leg. Mike Deegan then sealed victory with a 16:17 split that was the M55 second best time. Deegan has got back into his running in recent years after the tragic death of his wife Angela: "it took me one year to lose weight and one to get fit," he said.



National Masters cross-country champion Dave Neal's then capped it with 16:15 to take the fastest lap award. "We were too far back (in the team) but you have got to give it your best shot," he said.

The oldest men's teams ran with the women and Clayton-le-Moors won after favourites Clydesdale had injury problems. Doncaster's Pete Rowland was fastest lap with 19:05 on the opening stage.


Women's winners Telford led throughout and also provided the top two times through Claire Martin and Kim Fawke and recorded the second best team time for the event. Fawke's 16:53 led the opening leg ahead of Bev Jenkins' Salford and then increased their advantage with every lap. Salford and then Bristol & West tried to get on terms, before Martin posted the fastest lap of the race for the winners, her 16:43 anchoring them home.

Fawke said of her team: "they got silver last year and we are hoping to go one better." Martin said of her lonely

front run: "It was strange as it was a bit like a time trial, but we got gold at last,"

Bristol & West went one better in the W45 team event as they relegated 2010 winners Windsor, Slough, Eton & Hounslow to third, but the holders had Marina Stedman take advantage of. Sian Davies' niggle on the first leg. "My calf went with half-a-mile-to go," said but Stedman noted that she ran her own pace and then thought she "might catch her on the hill at the end."

Former Masters cross-country winner Stedman, one of the International Samy twins, from the late 1970s, posted the fastest W45 lap time of 18:17 before handing over to twin sister Shireen Higgins, who stepped in at the last minute to make up the Windsor team. Bristol took the lead, through Nicky Bromhall, before Alison Hurford rounded off the victory.



Chris Naylor and Paual Fudge, W55s both saw Arena 80 and Windsor home for the other medals, with Naylor taking the third best W45 lap time of 19:12, while Fudge's 19:53 also bettered the leading time from the W55 race.

That went to her twin sister Ann Ford with 20:27, for Redhill Road Runners but Westbury Harriers who won the W55 team award. Pat Gallagher had finished behind behind Ford's Redhill, Zina Marchant's Team Bath and Ros Tabor's Dulwich Runners on the first stage, but none had complete squads. That left Westbury to go away for a narrow victory over Les Croupiers. 66-year-old Gallagher, who ran 21:34, was later campaigning for a women's 65 and over team category.

BMAF 5k, HORWICH, 19th JUNE Words by Mel James. retiring **Road Race Secretary. Picture: John Morton Tom Phillips.**

Dry and mild conditions awaited the competitors for this year's 5k championships.

Conditions were ideal for record attempts and five course records were achieved within the combined men's and women's race. Most notable was Fiona Matheson from the Falkirk club, her exceptional time of 17m-06s, not only comfortably trimmed over a minute off the existing record, but shaved a further 19 seconds off the British o/50 best.

The other four course records were obtained in the men's section, Greg Wilson from Telford AC ran a time of 16m-51secs to shave off 3secs from the o/55 record set in 2003 by Brian Hilton (Leeds City). Dave Oxland (Notts AC) in conversation with me the previous evening, stated that he was in good shape for an attempt at the o/60 course record (17m-44secs) set by the Welshman Gareth Jones in 2007. He was correct, as he reduced it by a further 41 seconds, running 17m-03secs. The great Steve James (Southport Waterloo) did not have a great day as far as records on paper were concerned, as both of his two course records were broken. Firstly, Martin Ford (Cheltenham H.) o/65 shaved just a second off his 2005 time of 18m-32 secs, and then in the o/70 age group John Batchelor (Ilford AC) reduced his 2008 o/70 record by 48 secs crossing the line in 19m-55s.

Besides the record breaking, there was some great racing within the age groups, with only 7 secs dividing the first three for the medals in the o/45 male age group, Robert Tudor (West Cheshire AC) taking the Gold medal in a time of 16m-10 secs. Following Fiona Matheson in the women's o/50 section, the four athletes behind were just separated by 10 seconds, Lynne Whitaker (Romsey AC) took the silver, with Julia Palmer (Benfleet RC) just edging out Kathryn Morton (Stroud & D) by 3 seconds and the unfortunate Jackie Mather (Long Eaton) finishing 5th just 2 seconds behind. The o/70 women showed that they were just as competitive as the younger element, with Brenda Jones (Bro Dysynni) battled out a win against Pam Jones (Ilford AC) by just 13 seconds.

The team competition still causes concern, where only six teams collected medals.

In the Women's section, Salford Harriers (Bev Jenkins, Julie Cook and Denise Wakefield) picked up the o/35 Gold Medals, with Derby AC (Tracey Greenaway, Steph Spencer and Paula Parkin) taking the Silver.

In the Men's section the o/35 Gold went to Salford Harriers, making it a club double, the scorers were Phil Leybourne, Paul Savage and James Williams. Sale Harriers took Gold in the o/45s with Frank Cordingley, James Lambe and Timothy Rainet scoring. The o/55s had two medallist teams with Bingley Harriers taking Gold (Peter Pyrah, Shaun Jordan and Gerry Bell. Blackburn Harriers finishing





in the Silver position with John Chaplin, Evan Cook and Graham Pomfrey scoring for them.

We have used Horwich for a number of seasons now and finding weekend 5k races is a difficult problem. Horwich stepped up their organisation this year and the event went very smoothly, I am therefore recommending that we return to Horwich for 2012.

I have officially retired from my position as Road Running Secretary and I have enjoyed every minute of it, it is quite a demanding role and I hope and trust that during my four year stint, I have helped to contribute to its success. The newly appointed Secretary, Walter Hill, is very experienced international athlete and is currently road race secretary at SCVAC, therefore I am sure that the Road Running section is in safe hands for the future and the BMAF will benefit from his appointment.


